**ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACTS,
1870, 1873.**

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of October, 1882.

MINUTE by the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education.

Their Lordships read, and approved, the following Order :—

THE Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873, and of every

other power enabling them in this behalf, do order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

PART I.

1. The Returning Officer for the election of the School Board for London, shall be Sir Thomas Chambers, Q.C., M.P., Recorder of the City of London, or his Deputy.

2. The School Board for London shall consist of fifty-three members, and the number of such members to be elected and the Deputy Returning Officer in each Division shall be the numbers and the persons respectively mentioned in the second and third columns of the Schedule annexed.

PART II.

Time of Election.

1. An election of Members of the School Board for London shall be held on Friday, the 24th of November, 1882.

Notice of Election.

2. On or before Wednesday, the 1st day of November, the Deputy Returning Officer of each Division shall, in each Parish, or if the Parish be divided into Wards, in each Parish-ward, or in the case of the City Division, in each City-ward of the Division, publish such notice of election as is hereinafter prescribed.

3. The notice shall specify the number of members to be elected for the Division with the

day appointed for the election, viz.: Friday, the 24th day of November, and shall also specify a place for the reception of the nomination papers hereinafter mentioned, and of such other notices or papers as the Deputy Returning Officer may specify.

The notice may be in the form annexed to this order.

Nomination and Withdrawal of Candidates.

4. After publication of the said notice of election, but not later than Tuesday, the 7th day of November, any person may be nominated as a candidate for any Division by a nomination paper stating the Division for which the candidate is nominated, and his Christian name, surname, place of abode,

and description. Such nomination paper shall be subscribed (in the case of the City Division) by two persons entitled to vote for Common Councilmen, and (in the case of any other Division) by two ratepayers of such Division, and shall be sent to or delivered at the place appointed as aforesaid. In either case the subscribers shall add their places of abode and descriptions, and the premises in the Division for which they are respectively rated.

The Deputy Returning Officer shall forthwith send notice of such nomination to each candidate.

5. No nomination paper shall be received after four o'clock in the afternoon of Tuesday, the 7th day of November, and no person shall be a candidate unless he has been nominated within the time, and in the manner aforesaid.

6. On or before Friday, the 10th day of November, the names, places of abode and descriptions of the several candidates nominated for each Division as aforesaid, shall be advertised by the several Deputy Returning Officers in one or more of the newspapers circulating in their respective Divisions.

7. On or before Tuesday, the 14th day of November, any candidate for a Division may be withdrawn by delivering to the Deputy Returning Officer of such Division, or at such place as he may appoint, a notice of such withdrawal signed by the candidate.

Such notice shall not be delivered or received later than four o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

Election.

8. If, after four o'clock of Tuesday, the 14th day of November, no more persons remain as candidates for a Division than there are members to be elected for such Division, the Deputy Returning Officer for the Division shall certify the same to the Returning Officer, and such persons shall be deemed to be elected on the day fixed for the election.

9. If after four o'clock of Tuesday, the 14th day of November, more persons remain as candidates for a Division than there are members to be elected, the Deputy Returning Officer for such Division shall forthwith cause to be published in each Parish, Parish-ward, or City-ward of the division, the names of such candidates, and give notice that a poll will be taken on Friday, the 24th day of November, between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and eight o'clock in the afternoon.

Polling Places.

10. The Deputy Returning Officer for each Division shall determine the number and situation of the polling-places for his Division, and shall publish the same in each Parish, Parish-ward, or City-ward of such Division not later than Monday, the 20th day of November.

The Deputy Returning Officer shall appoint one polling-place at least for each Ward, unless, in his opinion, it be clearly unnecessary to do so.

The Deputy Returning Officer of the Division within which any place mentioned in Schedule C to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, is situate, shall appoint a convenient polling-place for every such place, unless, in his opinion, it be clearly unnecessary to do so.

No public-house shall be used as a polling-place or for the purpose of an election.

11. The Deputy Returning Officer of each Division, or some person or persons appointed by him, in writing, for the purpose, shall preside at each polling-place within his Division, provided that only one person shall preside at the same time.

Persons entitled to Vote.

12. The persons entitled to vote for the members of the School Board to be elected for the City Division, shall be the same persons as would be entitled to vote in case of an election of Common Councilmen for the City.

13. The persons entitled to vote for the members of the School Board to be elected for the Divisions other than the City shall be the ratepayers, as defined by the Elementary Education Acts, 1870, 1873.

14. With respect to the places mentioned in Schedule C to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, any person assessed or liable to the last rate, or contribution in the nature of a rate, in respect of property situate in any such place as aforesaid under the said Act and the Acts amending the same, shall be entitled to vote in the election of members for the Division within which such place or any part thereof is situate.

Place of Voting.

15. Each voter shall give his vote in the Place, Parish, Parish-ward, or City-ward in which the property in respect of which he is entitled to vote is situate, and if it is situate in more than one Place, Parish, or Ward within the same Division, he shall vote in any one of the Places, Parishes, or Wards in which it is situate.

If there be any Ward or Place for which no separate polling-place is appointed, the voter shall give his vote at the polling-place appointed by the Deputy Returning Officer for the purpose.

16. The poll shall commence at 8 A.M., and close at 8 P.M.

17. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the poll shall be taken in like manner as a poll at a contested municipal election is directed by the Ballot Act, 1872, to be taken; and the provisions of that Act shall apply to the election in like manner as if they were contained in this Order, with the substitution of the term "School Board Election" for the term "Municipal Election": Provided that,—

a. Every voter for a Division shall be entitled to a number of votes equal to the number of the members of the School Board to be elected for such Division, and may give all such votes to one Candidate, or may distribute them among the Candidates as he thinks fit.

b. The voter may place against the name of any candidate for whom he votes the number of votes he gives to such candidate in lieu of a cross, and the form of directions for the guidance of the voter in voting, contained in the Ballot Act, 1872, shall be altered accordingly.

c. The provisions of sections three, four, eleven, and twenty-four of the Ballot Act, 1872, shall be deemed to be regulations contained in this Order, which involve a penalty within the meaning of section ninety of the Elementary Education Act, 1870.

18. The person presiding at the poll may, and if required by any two voters shall, put to any voter at the time of his applying for a Ballot Paper, but not afterwards, the following questions, or one of them, but no other:—

(a.) In the City.

(1.) Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. on the list of persons entitled to vote in the election of Common Councilmen for the City?

(2.) Have you already voted at the present Election?

(b.) Outside the City :

(1.) Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. in the Book containing the Rates made on the day of and rated therein for the property described as (Specify date and property in Rate Book).

(2.) Have you already voted at the present Election ?

And no person required to answer any of the said questions shall be permitted or qualified to vote until he has answered the same.

19. At the close of any poll the person presiding at the poll shall, if he is not the Deputy Returning Officer, as soon as possible transmit the Ballot Papers to the Deputy Returning Officer of the Division.

20. The Deputy Returning Officer shall proceed in the usual manner to ascertain the result of the poll and shall certify to the Returning Officer the number of votes given for each candidate.

Declaration of Result.

21. The Returning Officer shall ascertain the Candidates who have obtained the largest number of votes in each Division, and such Candidates shall be deemed to be elected on the day fixed for the election ; and in case of an equality of votes, the Returning Officer shall determine by lot the persons to be elected.

22. The Returning Officer shall publish notice of the result of the poll in the several divisions, and a list of the names of all the persons elected as members of the School Board, and shall forthwith transmit a copy of such notice and list to the Education Department. The Ballot Papers shall be kept by him for six months subject to the directions of the Education Department.

Expenses.

23. The expenses incident to the election shall be ascertained and determined by the Returning Officer, who shall apportion the amount to be borne by the different parts of the Metropolis mentioned or referred to in the first schedule to the Elementary Education Act, 1870, according to the rateable value of such parts as ascertained by the valuation lists in force at the time of such election under the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869, or, where there is no such valuation list, in the same proportion, and according to the same basis, in and according to which the then last contribution, order, or rate made by the Metropolitan Board of Works was assessed ; and the several rating authorities in the Metropolis, as described in the same schedule, shall pay out of the respective local rates mentioned therein (which rates, and any increase therein, may be levied for that purpose), the several amounts so apportioned to such person or persons as the Returning Officer shall by precept direct, and for obtaining payment of the amount specified in any such precept, the Returning Officer shall have the like powers as the School Board under section 37 of the first mentioned Act.

General.

24. Notices and other matters required by these regulations to be published shall be published in the manner provided by the 26th section of the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and in such other manner as is usually adopted in elections of vestrymen in the Metropolis.

25. Words used in this Order shall, so far as is consistent with the context, have the same meaning as the same words used in the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873,

ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD FOR LONDON.

NOTICE is hereby given, that—

1. An election of the Members of the School Board for London, will take place on Friday, the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. The number of persons to be elected as Members of the School Board by this Division, is

3. [In the case of City Division] Any two persons entitled to vote for Common Councilmen

[In the case of any other Division] Any two Ratepayers of the Division may

nominate any one person whatever of full age as a candidate for the Division, by a nomination paper containing the Christian name, Surname, place of abode, and description of the Candidate, and signed by the persons nominating, who shall add their places of abode, descriptions, and the premises in the Division for which they are respectively rated. The same person may not join more than once in nominating a candidate for the same Division.

The nomination papers must be delivered at the Office of the Deputy Returning Officer, not later than four o'clock of Tuesday, the 7th November.

4. Public notice will be given of the list of Candidates, on or before Friday, the 10th November.

5. Any Candidate may be withdrawn by the delivery at the said Office, not later than four o'clock of Tuesday, the 14th November, of a notice signed by the Candidate.

6. The voting will take place in each Parish, or if the Parish is divided into Wards, or in the case of the City, in each Ward ; and notice of the numbers and situation of the polling-places will be published on Monday, the 20th of November.

Each voter must vote in the Ward in which the property in respect of which he is entitled to vote is situate, and if it is situate in more than one Ward in the Ward which he selects.

7. The poll will be open from 8 A.M. until 8 P.M.

8. [In the City] Every person entitled to vote for Common Councilmen is entitled to vote in this election.

[In other Divisions] Every Ratepayer is entitled to vote in this election as provided by par. 1 (c.) of the second schedule to the Elementary Education Act, 1873.

9. The voting will be by ballot.

10. Each voter in this Division has votes, all of which he may give to one candidate, or he may distribute all or some of them among the candidates as he thinks fit.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—so much of the parishes of Alvaston, and Elvaston, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Meadow-lane End on the Derby and Shardlow-road, along that road through Alvaston village, turning to the left over fields along Elvaston Park side to Borrowwash-lane, along that lane by the left to the river Derwent, by the left along that river side through the meadows to Meadow-lane, and turning by the left along that lane to Meadow-lane End on the Derby and Shardlow-road aforesaid,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

An Area comprising so much of the parishes of Alvaston, Osmaston, Boulton, Chellaston, and Elvaston, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Pinfold at Cotton-lane End, along the Osmaston and Melbourne-road to Chellaston village, by the left up that village passing the Church and along Chellaston-lane to the Derby and Shardlow-road, crossing that road and along Elvaston and Borrowwash-lane to the river Derwent, by the left along the river side (over fields) to the boundary of the borough of Derby, by the left along that boundary crossing the Derby and Shardlow-road to the Pinfold at Cotton-lane End aforesaid.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the petty sessional division of Elford, except the portion of the parish of Edingale which lies on the northern side of the highway from Lullington through Edingale village to Croxall; the petty sessional divisions of Rugeley, and Burton-upon-Trent, except the portion of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent situate within the latter division; the township of Newborough; such portions of the townships of Marchington, and Draycott-in-the-Clay, as lie to the east of the turnpike-road from Yoxall to Sudbury; the place called Staffordshire Moor; the township of Fazeley with its liberties; the townships of Swinfen and Packington, Wall, Pipehill, and Burntwood (including Edial and Woodhouses); so much of the township of Weeford as lies to the north of

Black brook; the hamlets of Chesterfield and Shenstone, in the parish of Shenstone; the Chapelry of Hammerwich, the parishes of Hopwas Hays, Ogley Hay and Farewell, and so much of the parish of Cannock as lies on the eastern side of the highway from the boundary of the parish of Rugeley near Hednesford Pool through Hednesford and Heath Hays to Norton Common, all in the county of Stafford; and the whole of the borough of Lichfield,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area (namely),—the parishes of Alrewas, Alrewas Hay, Hopwas Hayes, Tamhorn, Freeford, Fulfen, Armitage, King's Bromley, Hamstall Ridware, Mavesyn Ridware, Pipe Ridware, Shenstone, and Yoxall, the townships of Streethay, Swinfen and Packington, Wall, Weeford, Barton-under-Needwood, Dunstall, Scropton, and Wichnor, the hamlets of Hopwas Cotton, and Comberford, in the township of Wiggendon, and so much of the townships of Tatenhill, Anslow, and Rolleston, as lies to the west of the highway from Dunstall through Tatenhill village to Anslow, and to the south of the highway from Anslow to Hanbury Wood End, all in the county of Stafford; and the whole of the borough of Lichfield,—shall be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place declared by Order of Council dated the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the parishes of Walton-upon-Trent, Catton, and Croxall, in the county of Derby,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Places described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Place above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Places (namely),—(1.) all the lands, buildings, and premises situate at Edingale, in the parish of Croxall, in the county of Derby, in the occupation of William Upton; (2.) all the lands, buildings, and premises situate in the parish of Walton-upon-Trent, in the county of Derby, in the occupation of Humphrey James; and (3.) all the lands, buildings, and premises situate in the parish of Walton-upon-Trent, in the county of Derby, in the occupation of Samuel Smith;—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Places infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

Cheshire.—So much of the townships of Haslington, and Crewe, in the county of Chester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, along the Sandbach-road commencing at Brereton's Smithy in Haslington village to Winterly Mill, thence along the highway to Samuel Sutton's Bridge House farm, thence along the highway past Oakhanger Hall and John Sutton's to Buttertons-lane, thence along Buttertons-lane by Barthomley-road to Crewe Park, and thence along the highway to Brereton's Smithy in Haslington village aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) So much of the parishes or townships of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall, Castle Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Coton-in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-Trent, Drakelow, Croxall, Bretby, Harts-horne, and Swadlincote, in the county of Derby and of the parish of Edingale, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway Bridge, turning along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Ashby-road, turning to the right along Ashby-road to Masons Arms Midway, turning to the right along Swadlincote-road to Reed's Mill, thence by the right along Newhall-road, turning to the left by Swadlincote Oldfield Colliery and Cartwright's Mill to Swadlincote Market Place, thence by the right along the turnpike-road by Hall and Boardman's Colliery, Catchems Inn, and lane by Kidds Rough and Beards Brewery to High Cross-Banks at Castle Gresley, thence to the right along Brookey-lane to a point opposite Burton's Old Chapel, turning to the left up the road through the village of Linton by the Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by the fence to the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along the boundary fence and Seal brook to its junction with the river Mease, along that river turning to the right along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to where it intersects the road near Westbrook farm, turning to the left by Edingale fields to Edingale village, through the village by Holly Bush and Black Horse Inns and Kinson's shop to Edingale Schools, then along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to and along the river Mease to its junction with the river Trent, and turning to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

(2.) The whole of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

(3.) So much of the parishes or townships of Newton Solney, Bretby, and Winshill, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Unicorn Inn Newton Solney up Newton-lane by Mr.

Spooner's farm to the top, thence to the right along Bretby-lane by wheelwright's shop to the point where it intersects the boundary line of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent near Moat Bank House, thence to the right along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent at Winhill to the river Trent, to the right along the river Trent to a point opposite Smedley House at Newton Solney, thence to the right in a straight line from that point to Smedley's-lane, and up that lane by the Plough Inn and blacksmith's shop to the Unicorn Inn aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parishes of Spondon, and Chaddesden, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Spondon Church along the Locks-road, along Brandy-lane, on the left by the foot-road over the fields to Chaddesden brook, by the left along that brook to the river Derwent, by the left along the river side, turning by the left into and along Lodge-lane, crossing the Midland Railway, and passing the Railway Station the Nottingham-road to Spondon Church aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the parishes of Little Eaton, and Breadsall, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Breadsall Canal Bridge adjoining the Derby and Ripley-highway, along that highway taking the turn to the left down Green-lane at the foot of the second Canal Bridge to the river Derwent, by the right along the side of that river to the garden fence of the Bull's Head Inn, turning by the right along the lane to Eaton Bank, turning to the left by Duffield Bank Lodges along Eaton Bank, by the right at Miss Watson's shop along the Steeple Hill Bridle Stall-lane and Whittaker-lane into the Derby-road, turning to the right along that road crossing Jack of Darley Bridge, turning by the left up Morley Moor-road to Three-lane Ends, taking the lane on the right passing Sheep Gaps farm on the left through Breadsall village, and thence to the Canal Bridge adjoining the Derby and Ripley-highway aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the counties of Warwick, Leicester, and Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from a point where the Railway from Tamworth to Atherstone crosses the boundary of the borough of Tamworth, thence along the boundary of the borough and by the river Tame to Fazeley Bridge, from Fazeley Bridge by the river Tame to Kingsbury Bridge, thence by the road to the Kingsbury Station, thence by the Mineral Railway to the Hall End Colliery, thence by the Colliery-road to the Watling Street, thence along the Watling Street to Church-street in Atherstone, thence along the high-road leading from Atherstone through Twycross and Snarstone to where that road intersects the boundary line (Snarstone brook) of the counties of Derby and Leicester near Peppers House, thence to the right along the boundary of those counties to a point opposite Gallows Gate, across Ashley-road and along Willesley-lane to Willesley Pinfold, thence to the left along that road to the First Four-lane Ends at Donisthorpe, thence to the right along the turnpike-road to the Moira Railway Station on the Leicester and Burton branch of the Midland Railway, thence along the Railway from the Moira Railway Station to the boundary of the counties of Leicester and Derby, thence along the boundary of those counties to a point where the county of Stafford joins, thence along the boundary of the counties of Stafford and Warwick and the

boundary of the borough of Tamworth to the starting point.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Willington, Findern, Burnaston, Etwall, Egginton, Normanton, and Littleover, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Canal Wharf in Willington along the Canal to Arleston farm Canal Bridge, thence by the occupation-road on the left taking in Stenson fields to Sinfin-lane, past Moor End to Normanton Barracks, through Normanton village by the left, along Littleover-lane, through Littleover village to the Burton turnpike-road, turning on the left along that road and taking the turn on the right along Burnaston-lane through Burnaston village, by the left (opposite Mr. Gilbert Camp's farm) along Etwall-lane, turning on the left into the occupation-lane along Hill Top into Sandy-lane passing Brown's farm, turning to the left (at the back of Etwall Lodge) along Willington-lane, thence by the right along Blakeley brook into Egginton-lane, by the left along that lane to Park Hill Four-lane Ends, turning to the left along Willington-lane (crossing the turnpike-road) to the Canal Bridge, and then along the Canal to the Wharf in Willington aforesaid.

(8.) So much of the parishes of Mickleover, Littleover, Burnaston, Radbourne, and Bearwardcote, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Chain-lane Toll Gate, along the Etwall-road, to the right along Poke-lane into and along Mickleover-lane to Radbourne Three-lane Ends, by the left along Radbourne-lane to Tyrrel Hays Four-lane Ends, by the left along Hague-lane to Cheese Factory, thence by the left along Etwall-road taking the turn on the right and along Burnaston-lane, through that village to Three-lane Ends, taking the lane on the left to Little Derby, by the left along the Derby turnpike-road to Chain-lane End, and by the left along that lane to Chain-lane Toll Gate aforesaid.

(9.) So much of the parish of Packington, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Oakey Hovel by the side of the Ashly-road and thence by that road to Fortiss-lane as far as Packington House on the north, Packington House and across Garner land to Garner Barn and the bridle-road leading to Stow House on the east, the bridle-road to Stow House and Stone House and along the road to Arlix House on the south, and Arlix farm house and across to Cherry Orchard then across Oakey Old Turf to the Hovel aforesaid on the west.

(10.) At Shirley Common, in the petty sessional division of Ashbourne, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Ashbourne and Derby-road from Shirley Bridge to Shirley-lane End, thence following the Shirley-road past the Vicarage to the Pinfold, then turning to the right and following the road to Shirley Park farm, leaving the farm-house to the right, and thence along the road to Osmaston Fish Ponds, then turning to the right and following the brook to Shirley Bridge aforesaid.

(11.) So much of the parishes of Sweptstone, and Measham, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Tibern Cottage and Green-lane to Normanton on the north, the bridle-road to Sweptstone on the east, the turnpike-road and Measham Hall Lodge on the south, and the

bridle-road to Tibern Cottage aforesaid on the west.

(12.) So much of the parish of Sweptstone, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Measham Hall and the bridle-road leading to Normanton on the north, thence to the right along the bridle-road to Sweptstone and thence to the Crown Inn on the east, thence to the right along the turnpike road as far as the cross-roads leading to Measham on the south, and thence to the right as far as Gallows-lane and along the footpath from Gallows-lane to the bridle-road from Measham Hall aforesaid on the west.

(13.) At Offcote and Underwood, in the parish of Ashbourne, in the petty sessional division of Ashbourne, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Offers-lane and Dovehouse Green, turning to the right along Union-street and Church Banks, turning to the right past the Workhouse and following the footway past Ashley Mill House, thence on the footway through Buckholm to the brook, turning to the right and following the brook to the Bridge crossing for Haywood, and turning to the right thence along the footway to the Channel in Offers-lane aforesaid.

(14.) So much of the parishes of Alvaston, Osmaston, Boulton, Chellaston, and Elvaston, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Pinfold at Cotton-lane End, along the Osmaston and Melbourne-road to Chellaston village, by the left up that village passing the Church and along Chellaston-lane to the Derby and Shardlow-road, crossing that road and along Elvaston and Borrowwash-lane to the river Derwent, by the left along the river side (over fields) to the boundary of the borough of Derby, by the left along that boundary crossing the Derby and Shardlow-road to the Pinfold at Cotton-lane End aforesaid.

(15.) So much of the parishes of Ockbrook, Borrowwash, Hopwell, Stanton-by-Dale, Dale Abbey, Spondon, and Draycott, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Borrowwash Mill along the river Derwent bank-side to Draycott Ferry Boat, across that river, through Draycott village along Chapman's-lane over the Midland Railway and Canal to the Nottingham-road, turning by the right along that road taking the turn to the left through Butter Milk Gate along the Hopwell bridle-road to the Boyah Grange farm, thence by the foot-road passing Burnwood farm into Moor-lane, turning to the left along that lane into head of Spondon village, by the left down Stoney-lane, across the Nottingham-road, taking a straight line over the Canal and the Midland Railway to the river Derwent, and turning to the left along the river side to Borrowwash Mill aforesaid.

Hertfordshire.—So much of the parish of Hemel Hempstead, in the county of Hertford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say,

the road leading to Warners End commencing at the Hand Post at the junction of the roads from Potton End to Fields End farm and Boxmoor, thence to the right towards Green End as far as Northridge, thence down the lane to the left into Gravel Pit-lane and thence into Grassybottom-lane, thence to the left to the commencement of Gadesbridge-lane, with the whole of the lands in the occupation of Walter Ginger and Sir Astley P. (4.) So much of the township of Thornley with Wheatley, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain brook dividing Whitefold and Bradley farms on the north-east and north, a certain hedge fence adjoining that brook on Sharples farm and extending to Old Fell-road on the north-west and south, and Old Fell-road on the south-east and to the said brook on the north-east.

(5.) So much of the parish of Samlesbury, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, an occupation-road commencing in Spring-lane near Blue Slate farm and running through Whitesides ending at Sorbrose Green, then a certain hedge-fence running nearly in a straight line to Hoolster Hill on the north, a certain hedge-fence from Hoolster Hill to near Copstord Cottage, and thence to Samlesbury Bridge on the east and south-east, the river Darwen on the south and south-west, and a certain wire fence from the river Darwen to Spring-lane and opposite Blue Slate farm aforesaid on the west.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Slawston, in the county of Leicester.

So much of the parish of Humberstone, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the north, the turnpike-road from Leicester to Uppingham on the south, the road from the said turnpike-road to Humberstone on the east, and the road from the said turnpike-road past the borough Asylum to the said road from Belgrave to Humberstone on the west.

(4.) So much of the parish of Twycross, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Gopsall

Wood to Gopsall House on the north, the brook across the new road to Gardner's Barn on the east, across the turnpike-road to Haywood Hovel to the Atherstone turnpike-road on the south, and Orton-lane across the Appleby turnpike-road to Gopsall Wood aforesaid on the west.

(5.) So much of the counties of Warwick, Leicester, and Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from a point where the Railway from Tamworth to Atherstone crosses the boundary of the borough of Tamworth, thence along the boundary of the borough and by the river Tame to Fazeley Bridge, from Fazeley Bridge by the river Tame to Kingsbury Bridge, thence by the road to the Kingsbury Station, thence by the Mineral Railway to the Hall End Colliery, thence by the Colliery-road to the Watling Street, thence along the Watling Street to Church-street in Atherstone, thence along the high-road leading from Atherstone through Twycross and Snarstone to where that road intersects the boundary line (Snarstone brook) of the counties of Derby and Leicester near Peppers House, thence to the right along the boundary of those counties to a point opposite Gallows Gate, across Ashley-road and along Willesley-lane to Willesley Pinfold, thence to the left along that road to the First Four-lane Ends at Donisthorpe, thence to the right along the turnpike-road to the Moira Railway Station on the Leicester and Burton branch of the Midland Railway, thence along the Railway from the Moira Railway Station to the boundary of the counties of Leicester and Derby, thence along the boundary of those counties to a point where the county of Stafford joins, thence along the boundary of the counties of Stafford and Warwick and the boundary of the borough of Tamworth to the starting point.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Eaton, Eastwell, and Stathern, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from the Readed House near Belvoir to Knipton on the north, the road leading from Eaton to Waltham on the east, the road leading from Eastwell to Stathern on the south, and the road leading from Belvoir Top Wood to Eastwell on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Packington, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Oakey Hovel by the side of the Ashly-road and thence by that road to Fortiss-lane as far as Packington House on the north, Packington House and across Garner land to Garner Barn and the bridle-road leading to Stow House on the east, the bridle-road to Stow House and Stone House and along the road to Arlix House on the south, and Arlix farm house and across to Cherry Orchard then across Oakey Old Turf to the Hovel aforesaid on the west.

(8.) So much of the parishes of Redmile, Barkestone, Bottesford, and Granby, in the counties of Leicester, and Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Granby to Elton on the north, the road from Elton to Bottesford on the east, the accommodation-road from Bottesford to Barkestone on the south, and the road from Barkestone to Granby on the west.

(9.) So much of the parishes of Sweptone, and Measham, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Tibern Cottage and Green-lane to Normanton on the north, the bridle-road to Sweptone on the east, the turnpike-road and Measham Hall Lodge on the

south, and the bridle-road to Tibern Cottage aforesaid on the west.

(10.) So much of the parish of Sweptone, in the counties of Derby, and Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Measham Hall and the bridle-road leading to Normanton on the north, thence to the right along the bridle-road to Sweptone and thence to the Crown Inn on the east, thence to the right along the turnpike-road as far as the cross-roads leading to Measham on the south, and thence to the right as far as Gallows-lane and along the footpath from Gallows-lane to the bridle-road from Measham Hall aforesaid on the west.

Nottinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Wilford, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Trent from the borough boundary near Wilford Bridge on the north, along the river Trent to the Clifton boundary brook on the west, along the boundary fence to Ruddington-road on the south, along the Ruddington-road to Wilford blacksmith's shop, and along Wilford-lane to The Gravel House on the east, and along the river Trent by the borough boundary to Wilford Bridge aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Ruddington, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Ruddington to Wilford on the west, the highway leading to Edwalton Bar on the east, the boundary fence of Bradmore and Ruddington on the north, and the foot-way leading from Ruddington to Bradmore on the south.

(3.) So much of the parish of Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the borough of Nottingham from the Iron Gates on the Trent side to Colwick Gate House on the west, from Colwick Gate House by Colwick-road to the Garden House on the north, from the Garden House by the Garden House-lane to the river Trent on the east, and by the river Trent to the Iron Gates aforesaid on the south.

(4.) So much of the parish of Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a straight line from Colwick Park farm to the borough boundary stone on Carlton Hill on the west, from the said boundary stone to the Nag's Head Carlton on the north, from the Nag's Head by Slaneys fence to Savils Gate in the parish of Colwick on the east, and from Savils Gate by a straight line to Colwick Park farm aforesaid on the south.

(5.) So much of the parishes of Willoughby, and Widmerpool, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Widmerpool to Wysall on the north, the highway from Wysall to Willoughby on the west, the highway from Willoughby to Broughton on the south, and the boundary fence of Willoughby and Widmerpool in a straight line to Broughton highway and Widmerpool highway on the east.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the main-street of Carlton from Carlton Mill to the post-office on the north, the foot-road to Colwick from the post-office to Savils Gate on the east, a straight line to Colwick Park farm from Savils Gate on the south, and the foot-

road from Colwick Park farm to Carlton Mill on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Edingley, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Southwell to Edingley, the river Greet from Southwell to Kirklington, the Dyke from Kirklington to near Kirklington station known as the Mill Dyke and across to Hallam's House near Gold Hill, and thence down to the boundary of Mrs. Bilbie's farm to the river Greet.

(8.) So much of the parishes of Redmile, Barkestone, Bottesford, and Granby, in the counties of Leicester, and Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Granby to Elton on the north, the road from Elton to Bottesford on the east, the accommodation-road from Bottesford to Barkestone on the south, and the road from Barkestone to Granby on the west.

(9.) So much of the parish of Weston, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great North-road on the north, Egman-ton-road leading from the Great North-road to Egman-ton on or towards the west, the road leading from Egman-ton to Moorhouse on or towards the south, and a bridle-road leading from Moorhouse to the Great North-road on or towards the east.

(10.) So much of the parish of Holme-Pierrepoint, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, along the Canal from Cotgrave Place to Bassingfield, thence along the south side of Holme Grange-lane to Holme Grange, thence along Holme-road to Pepper Houses, and thence along the west side of Cotgrave-road to Cotgrave Place aforesaid.

(11.) So much of the parish of Granby, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the east side of the London and North-Western Railway from Barnston-station to Red Barn Bridge, thence along the north side of Mr. Wilkinson's field to Sears's Lodge, thence along the Granby-road as far as Whipling Bridge and on the east side of Mr. Butt's Long field to the south-east corner of Mr. Butt's field known as Stepperys, thence along the south fence to Barnston-road, and along the north side of that road to Barnston-station aforesaid.

(12.) So much of the parish of Sherwood, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain grass field in the occupation of Richard Armitage on the north, a certain house and garden in the occupation of Mr. Rudd on the east, a certain house and garden at present unoccupied on the south, and a certain house lately in the occupation of Arthur Wells deceased on the west.

(13.) So much of the parish of Sneinton, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain cottage-gardens on the north, certain land in the occupation of Messrs. Birkin and Scoofield on the east, certain household property on the south, and certain land belonging to Earl Manvers on the west.

(14.) So much of the parish of South Muskham, in the county of Nottingham, and adjoining parishes, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bathley-lane leading from the Great North-road near the Lord Nelson Inn to Bathley on or towards the north, Hop-Yard-

lane leading from Bathley to Caunton-road near Debdale Hill on or towards the west, and Caunton-road leading from Debdale Hill to the Great North-road on or towards the south.

(15.) So much of the parish of Holme-Pierrepoint, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Adbolton to Gamston, thence along the road to Bassingfield and along the footpath to Shepherd Houses, thence along the road to Holme Low-road, and thence along the south side of Holme Low-road to Adbolton aforesaid.

(16.) So much of the parishes of Clifton, and Barton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Clifton to the Thrumpton highway on the east, the highway leading from Barton Lodge to the river Trent on the west, the river Trent from Barton Boat to Clifton Church on the north, and the highway leading from Clifton Green to Barton Lodge on the south.

(17.) At Holme-Pierrepoint, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Holme Grange, thence along Holme Grange-lane to Bassingfield, thence along the road through Bassingfield and along the footpath to Thornton's Holt, thence along a footpath above Thornton's Holt by Gee's Hovel and along to the end of Holme Low-road in Ratcliffe-on-Trent, and thence along the south side of Holme Low-road to Holme Grange aforesaid.

(18.) So much of the parishes of Wysall, and Costock, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Wysall, along the Willoughby-road to the boundary Bridge on the east, along the Wysall boundary brook to Thorpe Bridge and from thence along a certain bridle-road to Rempston-road on the south, along Rempston-road to Farrow's farm, from thence along the boundary fence of Oldershaw's farm to Costock-road, and thence along Carver's boundary fence to Highfield farm on the west, along the Wysall boundary fence to Harrison's farm, thence along a certain occupation-lane to Bunny-road, and along the vicarage field fence to Keyworth-road, and along that road to Baldock's farm on the north, and from Baldock's farm along Walker's boundary fence to the Willoughby-road aforesaid.

(19.) So much of the parishes of Ratcliffe-on-Trent, Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stoke Dyke from Colwick Good's Yard to the Great Northern Railway near Ratcliffe Bridge on the east, the Great Northern Railway to Colwick-station on the south-west, and the Great Northern Railway Gedling line to Stoke Dyke in Colwick Good's Yard aforesaid on the north-east.

(20.) So much of the parishes of Ratcliffe-on-Trent, Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stoke Dyke and boundary fence from Colwick Good's Yard to the river Trent on the east, from the end of Stoke boundary fence by the river Trent to the south corner of George Neale's field on the south, from thence by a straight line across to Colwick Passenger Station on the west, and from thence by the Great Northern Gedling line to the Stoke Dyke on the north.

Staffordshire.—(1.) So much of the parishes or townships of Stapenhill, Stanton and Newhall,

Castle Gresley, Cauldwell, Linton, Lullington, Coton-in-the-Elms, Rosliston, Catton, Walton-upon-Trent, Drakelow, Croxall, Bretby, Harts-horne, and Swadlincote, in the county of Derby, and of the parish of Edingale, in the county of Stafford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Drakelow Viaducts along the Burton and Leicester branch of the Midland Railway to Stapenhill Railway Bridge, turning along the boundary of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent to Ashby-road, turning to the right along Ashby-road to Masons Arms Midway, turning to the right along Swadlincote-road to Reed's Mill, thence by the right along Newhall-road, turning to the left by Swadlincote Oldfield Colliery and Cartwright's Mill to Swadlincote Market Place, thence by the right along the turnpike-road by Hall and Boardman's Colliery, Catchems Inn, and lane by Kidds Rough and Beards Brewery to High Cross Banks at Castle Gresley, thence to the right along Brookey-lane to a point opposite Burton's Old Chapel, turning to the left up the road through the village of Linton by the Red Lion Inn to Tilley's Beer House and by the fence to the boundary of the counties of Derby and Leicester, thence to the right along the boundary fence and Seal brook to its junction with the river Mease, along that river turning to the right along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to where it intersects the road near Westbrook farm, turning to the left by Edingale fields to Edingale village, through the village by Holly Bush and Black Horse Inns and Kinson's shop to Edingale Schools, then along the boundary of the counties of Derby and Stafford to and along the river Mease to its junction with the river Trent, and turning to the right along the river Trent to Drakelow Viaducts aforesaid.

(2.) The whole of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

(3.)
