S God Almighty by His Providence, hath preserved Your Royal Majesty in Your glorious Undertaking of Rescuing our Religion, Laws, Liberties, and Properties, which were on the brink of destruction, and seated Your Sacred Majesty on the Royal so we in particular manner cannot but with all advanced advantages. Give us Leave therefore, Dread Sovereign, humbly to represent to Tour Sacred Majesty, that the Alien Duty both inward and outward, was long since erected to secure the Trade of this Nation to the English Merchants, (whose Interest and Aim it is to Advance the same) as the Act of Navigation was to encourage and increase our English

terest and Aim it is to Advance the same) as the Ast of Navigation was to encourage and increase our English Shipping, which we humbly conceive must needs be lost if not equally maintained, And by that means Your Majesty will not only preserve both those great Concerns to the Nation, but also revive an ancient Revenue belonging to the Crown, and enable sus and all Your English Merchants in this Viewdown to Trade whom any all terms with slim. this Kingdom to Trade upon equal terms with Aliens, and raile again our Factories into their former Repusation, which otherwise we cannot do.

That the great God of Heaven, by whom Kings Reign and Princes Decree Jukice, may always Conduct Your Majesty in this World, and afterwards receive. You into His Everlatting Mamions in the World to come, is and shall be the Cordial and Constant Devout Prayers

Venice, Decemb. 3. Genoua; Decemb. 6. Milan, Decemb. 4. The Troops of this State are going into their Winter-Quarters; And part of the Cavelry is returned to Pavia; whither the Cannon has been likewise brought from the Army, which was encamped at Casalmaggiore. But several Regia ments of Foot are to remain there till the Fortifications of Guaftalla are quite demolished. We have an account from Rome, that the Pope had made Dom Antonio Octoboni General of the Church, and Dom Marco Governor of the Castle of St. Angelo, and General of his Galleys:

Warfam, Novemb. 23. The Court continues still at Zoikiem. The Letters from Moscom of the 23d of the last month, confirm all the particulars of the Conspiracy against the youngest Czar; That Prince Galiezen, by whom it was chiefly carried on, was Banished into Siberia; and that the Eldest of the Czars, Prince Peter, had refigned the whole Authority to his Brother, Prince John, with a resolution to retire to a private Life.

Vienna, Decemb. 15. On Monday last General Count Guida of Staremberg arrived herefrom Bulgaria; He says, the Imperial Troops were gone into their Winter-Quarters; and that Prince Louis of Baden intended to follow him in and that Prince Louis of Basen intended to follow him in few days. Authorgh, Decemb. 15. This day the Electors met for the first time at the Town-House, the absence of those of Brandenburg and Saxony being supplied by their Plenipotentiaries, who had some days before according to the usual form communicated their Powers to the Elector of the Mensz, Director of the Electoral Colledge. The Empeator has given the Count de Veserani the Government of Nissa, with the Command of the Imperial Forces that were lately under the Orders of the Count de Piccelonnini, who died the 10th of the last month at Prissanin Albania; And General Heusser is appointed to Command in Valachia and Transstruania during the absence of Prince Louis of Baden. We are told, that the Emperor intends to reof Baden. We are told, that the Emperor intends to return with the whole Court to Vienna towards the end of the pext Month. Signior Cantelmi is shortly expected here in the Quality of Funcio Extraordinary from the Pope.

Cologne, Decemb, 23. On the 17th Inflant a French Party of about 2000 Horse, of the Garisons of Thier, Echternach, and Luxemburg, came into the Country of Juliers, and burnt ten Villages between Kerpen, Zulpich, and Munster-Effelt; after which they setired, but left divers of their Company behind them, who were killed or taken Prifoners by the Country People, and the Troops of Newbourg feat out from the Kown of Juliers. On the 20th the Enemy being reinforced by another Party from Mentrejal, and making together about 2500, entred into the Bobbary of Enffele, where they burnt fix or feven Villages; But understanding that General Spaenhad drawn together a Body of the Forces of Brandenburg and Neubourg, and that he was on his march towards Duren, (where he arrived the 21th) they retired in great hatte towards Montroya! General Spaen returned thereupon to the Head Quarter at Nun; And several thousand Men of the Consederate Proops are ordered to Quarter in the Exffelt for the fecurity of that Country.

Hughe, Decemb, 27. Paris, Decemb. 24. This week was published here, a Declaration, containing in substance, That wheelas great quantity of Gold and Silver hath been by private Persons converted into all sorts of unnecesfary Utenfile and Furniture to the great prejudice of the Commerce of this Kingdom, which very much fuffers through the want of Currant Money, the King, to remedy the same, Commands, That the Ordonnances of the years 1672, and 1687, shall be executed with all rigor; and forbids all Goldfmiths, and others working on Gold or Silver, to make and expole to fale any work of Gold, exceeding the weight of an Onnce; as also to make or fell any Balufters, Frames of Chairs, Cabinets, Tables, and other the like Works of Silver, on pain of Confication of the fame, and forfeiting 6000 Livres for the first fault, and of Corporal Punishment for the fecond. Persons are likewise required to bring all such prohibited Works of Silver which they have in their Houses to the Mint before the last day of January, to be converted into Money; where they thall be paid after the rate of 29 Lives to Sols for every Marc (which is the weight of B. Ounces) of phim Plate, and 29 Livres for raised Plate having the Mark of
