Hamburg, Decemb. 20. The Princes of Lunenbits have given out Committions for the stifing of level new Regiments; and have ordered Magazines to be provided in the places, which they are pollelled of, in the Dutchy of Saxe-Lawemburg. In the mean time the Minifters of the Allies are endeavouring to find out an Expedient for the accomodating this Affair.

Cologne, Decemb, 23. On the 17th Inftant a French Party of about 2000 Horfe, of the Garilons of Thier, Echternach, and Luxemburg, came into the Country of Juliers, and burnt ten Villages between Kerpen, Zulpich, and Munfter-Effelt ; after which they settired, but left divers of their Company behind them, who were killed or taken Pritoners by the Country People, and the Troops of Neutoning fentiout from the Rown of Juliers. On the 20th the Enemy being reinforced by another Party from Mentrends, and making together about 2500, entred into the Bobherry of Exflett, where they burnt fix or feren Villager; But understanding that General Space had drawn together a Body of the Forces of Brandenburg and Neubourg, and that he was on his march towards Duren; (where he arrived the 21th) they retired in great halte towards Montroya! General Spaen returned thereupon to the Head Quarter at Mun; And feveral thousand Men of the Confederate Froops are ordered to Quarter in the Eyffelt for the fecurity of that Country.

Hughe, Decemb, 27. Declaration, containing in substance, That whereas great quantity of Gold and Silver hath been by private Perfons converted into all forts of unneceffary Utenfile and Furniture to the great prejudice of the Commerce of this Kingdom, which very much fuffers through the want of Currant Money, the King, to remedy the lame, Commands, That the Ordonnances of the years 1672, and 1687, fhall be executed with all rigor; and forbids all Goldfmiths, and others working on Gold or Silver, to make and expole to fale any work of Gold, exceeding the weight of an Onnce; as also to make or fell any Balufters, Frames of Chairs, Cabinets, Tables, and other the like Works of Silver, on pain of Confilcation of the fame, and forfeiting 6000 Livres for the firlt fault, and of Corporal Punilhment for the fecond. All Persons are likewife required to bring all fuch prohibited Works of Silver which they have in their Houses to the Mint before the last day of January, to be converted into Money; where they that be paid after the rate of 29 Lives to Sols for every Marc (which is the weight of B Ounces) of phin Plate, and 29 Livres for railed Plate having the Mark of Par**n**
