THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs an Ordinance of Maritime Health issued by the Italian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz.:—

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH, No. 11. THE Minister of the Interior, in view of the law of March 20, 1865, chap. c. on Maritime Health and the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871, having official information of the existence of cholera at Mecca, decrees:—

ART. 1. All ships arriving from a port of the Hedjaz, or any port on the Arabian coast of the Red Sea, which have not undergone regular quarantine in uninfected intermediate ports, will be subjected to a quarantine of three days observation if they arrive with clean bills of health for the voyage, and to a rigorous quarantine of ten days in the lazaretto if they have had cases of cholera on board, or have any at the time of arrival.

ART. 2. Ships from Egypt with clean bills of health for the voyage and in good sanitary condition, will be subjected to three days of observation. This period will be reduced to twenty-four hours for such ships as have a medical official on board.

The Prefects of the maritime provinces are charged with the execution of the above Decree.
