THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

Berkshire.—At Sunninghill, in the county of Berks, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the east the road leading from the north point of Ascot Race Course to Dr. Brown's Corner, thence across the highroad to the South-Western Railway Arch on Sunninghill Bog, thence westward along the South-Western Railway to the Arch by Ascot (West) Station, and thence north-east along the Bagshot-road to the north point of Ascot Race Course aforesaid.

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Wing, in the county of Buckingham, as is bounded on the northward by the main-road from Aylesbury to Leighton Buzzard as far as Wing Mill, thence bounded on the eastward or north-eastward by the brook from Wing Mill to the crossing by the said brook of the road from the village of Wing to Mentmore Cross-roads, thence bounded on the eastward by the said road from the village of Wing as far as the said Cross-roads, thence bounded on the southward by the road leading to Wingrave as far as the boundary between the parish of Wing and the parish of Wingrave, and thence bounded on the westward by the parish of Wingrave as far as the said main-road.

(2.) So much of the parish of Langley Marish, in the county of Buckingham, as lies between the Great Western Railway and the main-road called the Bath-road (except the hamlet or chapelry of Colnbrook).

Cambridgeshire.—(1.) At Oakington, in the county of Cambridge, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Longstanton and Cambridge-road on or towards the south, the road leading from the Longstanton and Cambridge-road to the Church and Railway Station on or towards the west and north, and the road leading from Westwick through Oakington to the Longstanton and Cambridge-road on or towards the east.

(2.) At Cottenham, in the county of Cambridge, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the main-street of Cottenham from Rooks-lane to Church Drive on the west, Church Drive on the north, Long Drive in Fen on the east, and Landbeach-road, Back-lane, and Rooks-lane on the south.

Liberty of the Isle of Ely.—(1.) So much of the parish of Newton, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Green-lane from Tyd St. Giles-road to Newton Church on the north, Old Bank from Newton Church to Fetton End-road on the east, Fetton End-road on the south, and Mill-lane and Tyd St. Giles-road on the west.

(2.) So much of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point at the end of the Benwick Plantation at or near the south-east boundary of the parish known as Shaws Dike, along such Dike to the Cock Public-house, thence along the south side of Glassmoor Bank, being the southern Bank of

Whittlesey Dike in a north-westwardly direction to Ironsides Mill, thence in a south-westwardly direction along the Mill drain to Searles Drove, thence in a north-westwardly direction along such last-mentioned Drove to the Benwick-road, thence in a southwardly direction along such last-mentioned road to Smith's Corner, thence in a south-eastwardly direction to the first-mentioned point, including the farms of D. Morton and Messrs. T. K. Speechly, T. Searle, B. Savage, and T. Grant; the said Benwick-road and Glassmoor Bank not being included in the Area.

(3.) Such part of the parish of Thorney, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, as lies within the following limits, that is to say, Thorney Causeway and Wards Causeway otherwise Wisbech-road on the north from the westernmost boundary of the parish known as Catswater to a point at or near the north end of Great Knarr Fen Drove, Thorney Dike-road on the south from Catswater aforesaid to a point at or near the south end of Great Knarr Fen Drove aforesaid, Catswater aforesaid on the west, and Great Knarr Fen Drove aforesaid on the east; the roads and Drove aforesaid not being included in the Area.

Cheshire.—(1.) At Woodford, in the parish of Prestbury, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Lane Ends at Ivy Cottage by Robert Nield's farm, by the fence along Marifield, Booth's Moss, Walker's Moss, by Barn field to James Booth's farm, across the Woodford-road by Woodford School, along by a new fence to the foot-road, and thence along the foot-road and Moor-lane to Ivy Cottage at Lane Ends aforesaid.

(2.) In the counties of Lancaster and Chester comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, in the township of Tintwhistle, in the county of Chester, commencing at a point at the junction of the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road and Henshull-lane, by Henshull-lane to the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road; in the township of Mossley, in the county of Lancaster, along the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road to Dark-lane, along Dark-lane back to the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road, and thence along the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road to the starting point.

(3.) At Kingsley, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Kingsley Church, thence by Wood-lane to the footpath leading to Kingsley, by the fence to Water Pits, and by the stream to the stile, thence by the fence leading to the junction of the Hall on the Hey-lane and Ball-lane to Crewwood Common, road to Mill-lane, Mill-lane to Beech-lane junction with the Frodsham-road, and the Frodsham-road to Newton Five-lane Ends to Kingsley Church aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) At Tideswell, in the county of Derby, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Richard-lane and Back-lane, thence by Craven House up Slagg Hillocks taking the Old Town Head, following the road to Cross Daggers Inn, thence by the right up Cliff Hill passing Cliff Inn taking the highway as far as Barratt-lane into Litton Dale, following the highway to Tideswell and Millers Dale main-road, and taking the said main-road to Tideswell Gas Works and to Richard-lane aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Dale Abbey, in the county of Derby, as lies within the

following boundaries, that is to say, starting from a point on the Ilkeston and Derby-road (the Sandpits), by the right to the Flourish Inn, by the right along the footpath to Stanley brook, thence along the brook course to Baldock Mill, by the right up Cat and Fiddle-lane to the Ilkeston and Derby-road, and by the right along the Ilkeston and Derby-road to the Sandpits aforesaid.

(3.) So much of the parishes and townships of Willsthorpe, Sandiacre, Risley, Draycott and Church Wilne, Breaston, Sawley, and Long Eaton, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the river Trent Bridge at Sawley along that river passing Trent Lock to the junction of the river Erewash, along the Erewash to Sandiacre Bridge, by the left through Sandiacre village, along the Nottingham and Derby-road through Risley passing Hopwell Park Lodge, by the left along Gipsy-lane, along the Draycott-road, over the Canal Bridge, by the right down the occupation-lane at Nooning Ford, by the left along the river Derwent passing Wilne Mill to Derwent mouth, and thence along the river Trent to Trent Bridge at Sawley aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parish of Alfreton, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, starting from the Chemical Works on the Canal side at Pye Bridge, by the right along the Canal side to Ironville, thence along the Codnor Park-road to Maltby's Corner (Riddings), by the left along Greenhill-lane to Wolverson's Corner, thence by the right along Greenhill-lane to Lea Brook's Corner, thence to the National Schools (Somercotes), thence by the left down Birchwood-lane, and turning to the right along the footpath leading to the Chemical Works aforesaid.

Durham.—(1.) At Kyo, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Catchgate to Kyo on the north, the boundary fence of Kyo Laws farm on the east, the North-Eastern Railway on the south, and the turnpike-road leading from Annfield Plain to Catchgate on the west.

(2.) At Stranton, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Oxford-road Belle Vue on the south, York-road on the west, Whitby-street on the east, and Church-street and Cambridge-road on the north.

(3.) In the township of Collierley, in the parish of Lanchester, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary fence of Pontop Hall, Collierley, and Lintz farms on the north, the turnpike-road leading from Mountsett to Hare Law on the east, the Fondlysett highway to Pontop Pyke-lane Ends on the south, and from Pontop Pyke-lane Ends in a straight line to Pontop Pyke Hall on the west.

(4.) At Dalton-le-Dale, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Murton Colliery village on the south, Water Gate Plantation near the Sunderland and Hartlepool branch of the North-Eastern Railway on the west, the old parish-road leading from Murton Junction to the Sunderland and Stockton highway on the north, and the Stockton and Sunderland highway on the east.

(5.) At Medomsley, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway known as Cut Throat-

lane leading to Allendale Cottages on the north, the cart-road leading from South Field to Cut Throat-lane Ends on the east, the bridle-road leading from Bradley-lane Ends to South Field on the south, and West-lane leading from Allendale Cottages to Bradley-lane Ends on the west.

(6.) At Brandon, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the foot-road leading from Brandon village to Langley Hall on the north-west, the highway leading from Langley Hall to Langley Moor on the north, the highway leading from Langley Moor to Brandon-lane Ends on the south-east, and the highway leading from Brandon-lane Ends to Brandon village on the south-west.

(7.) So much of the borough of Darlington, in the county of Durham, as is bounded on the north by the Cross Back-street leading from Back-street behind Hargreave-terrace to Park-place, on the east by the said Back-street behind Hargreave-terrace, on the south by the south side of Swan-street, and on the west by the west side of Park-place.

(8.) So much of the borough of Darlington, in the county of Durham, as is bounded on the north by the stream known as Cocker-beck, on the south by Gladstone-street, on the east by certain land belonging to Edwin Lucas Pease, in the occupation of Messrs. Ward and Fairly, and on the west by Greenbank-road.

(9.) At Harton, in the county of Durham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the borough of South Shields on the north, the boundaries of Whitburn and Cleadon townships on the south, the seabeach on the east, and by and including the township-road leading from Tyne Dock to East Boldon to a point at the south side of an occupation-road leading to Biddick Hall on the west.

Essex.—(1.) At Latchingdon, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Blackwater on the north, Butterfields and Mundon Hall farms on the west, Clark's Lower farm on the east, and the road leading from Latchingdon to Steeple dividing Lawling Hall farm from Lawling Smith's farm, in the occupation of George Attenborough, on the south.

(2.) At Great Bentley, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Tendring Hundred Railway on the south, Great Bentley Green and main-road on the north, nine acres of land on Bordells farm, in the occupation of Philip B. Vincent, on the east, and eleven acres of land and buildings, in the occupation of James Alward, and Goadling-lane on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Mashbury, in the county of Essex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Friday's farm on the Waltham-road by Gatehouse as far as Mashbury Hall, thence to the cottage by Mashbury Independent Chapel, thence to Bereman's farm, and thence to Friday's farm on the Waltham-road aforesaid.

(4.) The whole of the farm known as the Home farm, situate near Wyvenhoe Park, in the parish of Greenstead, in the borough of Colchester, in the county of Essex, and all such part of the said Wyvenhoe Park as lies within the boundary of the said borough, the said boundary being shewn and the said part of the said Park being divided off from the remainder

thereof by a fence, dyke, watercourse, and pond; and which farm and Park are respectively in the occupation of H. J. Gurdon-Rebow.

(4.) At Preston, in the county of Hertford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, King's Hill on the north, Old St. Albans highway on the east, Kiln Wood on the south, and Dead Woman's-lane on the west.

Huntingdonshire.—(1.) At Yaxley, in the county of Huntingdon, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Norman Cross to Yaxley and Yaxley village-street as far as Dobbs-lane on the south, thence east by Dobbs-lane and Robert Loweth's property as far as Robert Warwick's farm premises, north Poors Allotment field to Harry Burnham's arable land on the north-west, and west occupation-road

leading from William Whitehead's farm to the road from Norman Cross to Yaxley aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Great Gransden, in the county of Huntingdon, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Great Gransden to Caxton on the north, the boundary dividing the counties of Huntingdon and Cambridge on the east, the drift-way from Longstowe to the Windmill at Great Gransden on the south, and thence a certain hedge to the road leading from Great Gransden to Caxton aforesaid on the west.

(2.) At Bromley, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Hayes-road from the Bromley-road to Hayes parish Church, thence by a straight line to the Church on Bromley Common opposite the bottom of Oakley-road, and thence to the Hayes-road aforesaid.

(3.) At Watlingbury, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Cannon Heath-road to Watlingbury Church, thence to the King's Head Inn and Malling-road to the North Pole Inn, Barnwells Lodge, and Mereworth-road to Cannon Heath.

(4.) At Frindsbury, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain arable land in the occupation of Messrs. George and Richard Brooker on the north, the highway leading from Strood to Cobham on the south, certain Hop Gardens in the occupation of William Dunford on the east, and certain arable land in the occupation of Messieurs G. and R. Brooker on the west.

(5.) At East Farleigh, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Stiles farm to East Farleigh Church, the road from East Farleigh Church to East Farleigh Bridge, the river Medway from East Farleigh Bridge to Bydews, and the road from Bydews to Stiles farm aforesaid.

(6.) At Sevenoaks, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, a straight line from the farm buildings of Ashgrove to Shenden on the north, the Sevenoaks and Tunbridge-road on the east, Morley's-lane as far as the Weald Church on the south-east, thence a straight line to Dale farm on the south, and thence a straight line to the farm buildings of Ashgrove aforesaid on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Thanington,

near Canterbury, in the county of Kent, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Wincheap Forge, Wincheap-street, to the Canterbury Water Works on the north, the footpath from the Canterbury Water Works to New House-road on the west, the New House-road to Stupington Corner on the south, and thence Hollow-lane to Wincheap Forge, Wincheap-street, aforesaid on the east.

(8.) At Boxley, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Ashford-road from Maidstone borough boundary to Huntsmans-lane, the new line of Railway from Huntsmans-lane to Maidstone borough boundary, and Maidstone borough boundary from the new line of Railway to the Ashford-road aforesaid.

(9.) At Thurnham, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Millgate to Bearsted as far as Watery-lane, Watery-lane to the new Railway, the new Railway to the stream by Criswell, and the stream to Millgate.

(10.) At Herne, near Herne Bay, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Mickleburgh Hill House along the King's road to the Railway-road on the north, thence along the Railway-road to Edington Bridge, Edington-lane, on the west, thence along Edington-lane and Pigeon-lane to Pigeon Corner on the south, and thence along the occupation-road to Mickleburgh Hill House aforesaid on the east.

(11.) At Wrotham, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway from Ightham Court Bridge to St. Clere Bridge, the footpath from St. Clere Bridge to Lower St. Clere, the Coach-road from Lower St. Clere to the North Lodge St. Clere Park, and the Pilgrim-road at North Lodge St. Clere Park to Hixdown.

Lancashire.—(1.) So much of the township of Todmorden and Walsden, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Ramsden-road on the west, Moorland and Deanroyd Mill on the south, Deanroyd-lane, to Deanroyd farm on the south-east, Moorland on the east, and Skew Bridge (Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway) and Cricket Ground Walsden on the north.

(2.) At Chorlton-cum-Hardy, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Lovers Walk on the north, Manchester-road on the south, Wilbraham-road on the east, and Upper Chorlton-road on the west.

(3.) At Stretford, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Pool-lane on the east, Chapel-lane on the west, Burton-road on the north, and Chester-road on the south.

(4.) At Cliviger, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Calder on the south commencing at its source, thence along the river side to the foot of the Scout Rocks, thence in a westerly direction along the side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to Honey Holme-lane, along Honey Holme-lane to the Todmorden and Burnley highway at Bull's Head, thence to the north by the Higher Bank wall fence, and to the east by the Higher Helliplatt wall fence to the river Calder, and thence to the south along its side to its source.

(5.) In the counties of Lancaster and Chester comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, in the township of Tintwhistle, in the county of Chester, commencing at a point at the junction of the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road and Henshall-lane, by Henshall-lane to the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road; in the township of Mossley, in the county of Lancaster, along the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road to Dark-lane, along Dark-lane back to the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road, and thence along the Stalybridge and Huddersfield-road to the starting point.

(6.) At Pennington, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bedford brook from Mill-lane to Orchard-lane on the north, Orchard-lane, Bolton-road, Kirkhall-lane, and the London and North-Western Railway on the west, Pennington brook to Pennington Mill bridge, the occupation-road through Green Fold farm to Dick Mather Bridge, and the Canal to Boardman-street End on the south, and Boardman-street, Chapel-street, and Mill-lane on the east.

(7.) So much of the township of Blatchinworth and Calderbrook, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Barn Meadows, Handle Hall, and Newgate on the north, Higher Clough, Heights farm, and Shore on the west, Shore Gardens to Featherstall on the south, and Todmorden-road and Gale on the east.

(8.) At Quarlton, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the brook running between Mr. Walker's Factory and Tottington on the north, the brook running between Edgeworth and the Red Lion Public-house Quarlton on the east, the public highway from the Red Lion Public-house Quarlton to Quarlton Vale on the south, and the brook running from Quarlton Vale to Mr. Walker's Factory on the west.

(9.) At Mossley, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Egmont-street on the north-east, Manchester-road on the south, Stanhope-street on the north, the river Tame on the east, and Scout-road on the west.

(10.) So much of the townships of Blatchinworth and Calderbrook, and Butterworth, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Light Howlers-road and Pyke House on the east, Featherstall, Whitelees-road, and Caldermoor on the south-west, Newbarn in Butterworth on the south, and Gale on the north.

(11.) At Euxton, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Wigan and Preston highway from Pack Saddle Bridge to Chapel brook on the east, Culbeck brook through Euxton Hall Park to Culbeck-lane and then Culbeck-lane and the highway to Flag-lane on the south, and the boundaries of the township of Euxton on the north and west.

(12.) At Aspull, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from the Finger Post to Moorgate on the north, from Moorgate along the Railway to Marsh farm on the east, from Marsh farm to Higher Gullett on the south, and along Higher Gullett to the Finger Post aforesaid on the west.

(13.) At Little Hulton, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the public highway between

Cleggs-lane End and Kennion Arms on the south, the road leading from Kennion Arms to Old-lane on the west, Old-lane on the north, and Cleggs-lane on the east.

Leicestershire.—(1.) So much of the parishes of Eaton, Eastwell, and Stathern, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from the Readed House near Belvoir to Knipton on the north, the road leading from Eaton to Waltham on the east, the road leading from Eastwell to Stathern on the south, and the road leading from Belvoir Top Wood to Eastwell on the west.

(2.) So much of the parishes of Redmile, Barkestone, Bottesford, and Granby, in the counties of Leicester, and Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Granby to Elton on the north, the road from Elton to Bottesford on the east, the accommodation-road from Bottesford to Barkestone on the south, and the road from Barkestone to Granby on the west.

(3.) At Hoby, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the fence forming the boundary between Ragdale and Hoby on the north, the road leading from Ragdale to Hoby and on to Rotherby on the east, the river Wharf on the south, and the road from Brooksby to Hoby and Mr. Main's farm on the west.

(4.) So much of the parishes of Blaston, and Medbourne, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Blaston-road on the north, the road leading from Blaston to Medbourne as far as Ivy Gate on the east, Gilson's Close on the south, and Hallaton-road as far as Gilson's Close on the west.

(5.) So much of the parish of Loughborough, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain land in the occupation of Mr. Upton and Mr. Sarjeant on the north, the road leading from Nanpanton to Woodhouse and certain land in the occupation of W. B. Paget, Esq. on the south, certain land in the occupation of Mr. Wafnaby and E. H. Warner, Esq., and a certain Wood known as the Outwoods in the occupation of Mr. Sutton on the east, and certain land in the occupation of Messrs. Smalley and Hanson, and Mr. Hopkins, and Mr. Peberdy on the west.

(6.) So much of the parish of Harby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Harby to Stathern on the north, the road leading from Stathern to Eastwell on the east, the road leading from Eastwell to Goatby turn on the south, and the road leading from Goatby turn to Harby on the west.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Loughborough, Thorpacre, and Knight-Thorpe, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain land in the occupation of Mr. Palmer and Mr. Reynolds and the lane leading from Thorpacre to the Derby turnpike-road on the north, certain land in the occupation of Mr. Joseph Reynolds, Dr. Eddowes, Mr. Matthews, and Mr. E. L. Barker on the south, certain allotment gardens in the occupation of Mr. Z. Onions senior and others and certain land in the occupation of Mr. Z. Onions junior, Mr. W. Blood, and Mr. Withers, and a portion of the line of the Charnwood Forest Railway Company on the

(11.) At Glenn Parva, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain fields in the occupation of Mr. Wilders in the parish of Aylestone on the north, the villages of Glenn Parva and Blaby on the south, the Barracks of Glenn on the east, and the Lutterworth turnpike-road on the west.

(12.) At Long Clawson, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the upper part of the Waltham-road and the bride-road to Ab-Kettleby on the south, the Melton and Hickling lanes and the street in the village of Long Clawson on the west, the bridle-road between Hose and Hickling on the north, and the parish of Hose on the east.

Lincolnshire (Holland).—(1.) Leaden Hall farmstead on the north and west, thence the said Silt-lane and Gravel-road passing Mr. Cole Tinsley's Old Thatched farmhouse and Mr. Patchet's farm buildings to Mr. Joseph Ward's Lap Water farmhouse aforesaid on the south and east; the said Silt-lane and Gravel-road not being included in the Area.

(3.) So much of the parish of Gedney, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Spalding and Sutton Bridge Railway from Stone-Gate Crossing to Long-lane Crossing on the north, thence Long-lane and Delph-Bank to Fleet drain on the west, thence Fleet drain to Gedney Broad-Gate on the south, and thence Gedney Broad-Gate and Stone-Gate to Stone-Gate Crossing aforesaid on the east and north-east; exclusive of all boundary-roads but inclusive of all intersecting-roads.

So much of the parish of Brant Broughton, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Broughton Mill-lane on the south, thence the Top-road leading from Beckingham to Carlton-le-Moorland on the west, thence the dividing hedge of the parishes of Brant Broughton and Carlton-le-Moorland on the north, and thence the bridle-road leading from Carlton-le-

Moorland to Broughton to Broughton Mill-lane aforesaid on the east.

(5.) So much of the parishes of Heckington, and Great Hale, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the Sleaford and Boston highway from Burton-lane End to Heckington Cemetery, thence on the east a direct line across certain fields in the occupation of Charles Little, Mrs. Mason, and Edward Rowe to the said Edward Rowe's farmhouse in Great Hale, thence to the Old Vicarage House in Great Hale aforesaid on the south, thence the road running in a southerly direction to Woods Orchard, thence to the south-west corner of the said Edward Rowe's grass field known as Weavers field, and thence on the west a direct line across several fields of Charles Sharpe to the said Burton-lane End.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Heckington, and Great Hale, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the south from Henry Thompson's farm buildings Great Hale Fen by the Beckson Bridge drain to Beckson Bridge, thence on the west by the highway leading from Little Hale to Heckington to the Great Northern Railway Station Heckington, thence on the north by the Great Northern Railway to opposite George Wood's Cottage Great Hale Fen, thence on the east by a direct line across certain fields in the occupation of F. G. Mastin and Henry Thompson to Henry Thompson's farm buildings aforesaid.

At Humberstone, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Louth and Tetney-road on the north and west, the road leading to Mr. Marshall's farm on the south, and a certain large grass field in the occupation of Mr. Andrew on the east.

(2.) At Laceby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain fields in the occupation of Mr. Kirk on the north, the Welbeck drain on the south, Laceby Beck on the east, and Irby Moat on the west.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Hemswell, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

(4.) At Gayton-le-Wold, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Lincoln turnpike-road on the north, the boundary fence between the farms in the respective occupations of R. Martin and Jabez Rigall on the south, the Heath-road on the east, and the road leading from the Lincoln turnpike-road to Gayton on the west.

(5.) At Santon, Appleby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway running from Appleby to Frodingham on the north, a water-course on the side of Scunthorpe Common on the west, and a certain plantation on the south and east.

(6.) At Wainfleet All Saints, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary Bridge between Wainfleet All Saints and Wainfleet St. Marys highway leading to Boston on the south, the highway to Wainfleet Bank on the west, the highway leading to Firsby on the north, and the highway leading from Wainfleet to Skyness on the east.

(7.) In the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,

comprising the whole of the land in the parish of Saxelby on the south side of the Fosdyke, and the land in the same parish on the north side of the Fosdyke bounded on the west by the road from Saxelby to Ingleby as far as Mill-lane, on the north by Mill-lane leading from Ingleby-lane to the river Till in part and the boundary line of the parish of Broxholme in other part, on the east by the parish of South Carlton, and on the south by the boundary fence on the north side of Mr. Barker's farm in the parish of Burton.

Middlesex.—(1.) At Harrow-on-the-Hill, in the county of Middlesex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Mr. Brown's boundary wall Kenton-lane farm by the thorn hedge passing the Rifle Canteen across the fields (bounded by thorn hedges) to the London and North-Western Railway at Harrow Railway Bridge, thence the London and North-Western Railway to the Bridge in Kenton-lane, thence Kenton-lane to four-cross-way, the stream to Gooseacre-lane, past Kenton School to the lane adjoining Kenton Lodge, thence the footpath towards Edgware to the stile and the hedge to the top of Woodman's Hill, and thence the hedge to Kenton-lane-farm.

(4.) So much of the parish of Harrow, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Towards Harrow, the boundary wall of Kenton-lane farm in the occupation of Mr. Brown and the hedgerow running at the back of the Rifle Canteen and its continuation to the London and North-Western Railway Bridge at Harrow Station, thence the London and North-Western Railway to the Bridge in Kenton-lane, and thence Kenton-lane to the four-cross-way: Towards Kingsbury, the hedge running from opposite the boundary wall of Kenton-lane farm to the centre of Woodman's Hill and the hedge running thence (at right angles) as far as the Kenton and Edgware footpath, thence the Kenton and Edgware footpath to Kenton-lane, thence Gooseacre-lane to the stream at the back of Kenton Grange, and thence the said stream to the four-cross-way in Kenton-lane.

(5.) So much of the parish of Hillingdon, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on or towards the north-west Long-lane leading from the Uxbridge and London main-road to Ickenham and thence the road to Ruislip as far as the West End-road leading to Yeading and Greenford, on or towards the north-east and south-east the West End-road leading to Yeading and Greenford to the Uxbridge and London main-road, and thence on or towards the south-west the Uxbridge and London main-road to Long-lane aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Twickenham,

and Teddington, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Thames Valley line of the London and South-Western Railway from the point where the Hampton-road crosses it near Fulwell Station to its junction with the Kingston line of the London and South-Western Railway on the north, the Kingston line of Railway from its junction with the Thames Valley line to the point where the road from Teddington to New Hampton crosses the line on the east, the road leading from Teddington to New Hampton from the point where it crosses the Kingston line to its junction with the road leading from New Hampton to Twickenham on the south, and the road from New Hampton to Twickenham from its junction with the road leading from Teddington to the point where it crosses the Thames Valley line on the west.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Isleworth, and Twickenham, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Staines-road on the north, the Hanworth-road on the south, Cromwell-lane on the east, and the eastern boundary hedge of Hounslow Heath on the west.

(8.) So much of the parishes of Finchley, Hornsey, and Friern Barnet, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Summers-lane and the road leading from that lane into Colney Hatch at the point where it joins Colney Hatch-lane on the north, an imaginary line drawn from the High-road Finchley by Melrose Cottage along the southern boundary of the Islington and St. Pancras Cemeteries, then along the northern boundary of Coldfall Wood, and then from the north-east corner of that Wood along the hedge into Tatterdown-lane at a point just north of Coppett farm on the south, Tatterdown-lane from the point just above Coppett farm to the junction of that lane with Colney Hatch-lane, and then Colney Hatch-lane to the point where it joins the road leading to Summers-lane on the east, and the High-road Finchley from Summers-lane to Melrose Cottage on the west.

(9.) So much of the parish of Teddington, in the county of Middlesex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, High-street Teddington from the Railway Bridge to the point where it joins the Kingston-road near St. Mary's Church on the north, the Kingston-road from High-street Teddington to Bushey Park-road on the east or north-east, Bushey Park-road from the point where it joins the Kingston-road to the Kingston line of the London and South-Western Railway on the south or south-east, and the Kingston line of Railway on the west or south-west.

Norfolk.—An Area comprising so much of the parish of Stoke Holy Cross, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Shottesham-road (by fields) on the east, Stoke Park and the boundary fence separating Mr. Whittaker's and Mr. Pitt's farms on the west, Stoke-lane on the north, and the road running through Mr. Seago's occupation and Stoke Park on the south.

Nottinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the parishes of Redmile, Barkestone, Bottesford, and Granby, in the counties of Leicester, and Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Granby to Elton on the north, the road from Elton to Bottesford on the east, the accommodation-road from Bottesford to Barkestone on the south, and the road from Barkestone to Granby on the west.

(2.) So much of the parish of Sherwood, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain grass field in the occupation of Richard Armitage on the north, a certain house and garden in the occupation of Mr. Rudd on the east, a certain house and garden at present unoccupied on the south, and a certain house lately in the occupation of Arthur Wells deceased on the west.

(3.) So much of the parish of Sneinton, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain cottage-gardens on the north, certain land in the occupation of Messrs. Birkin and Scofield on the east, certain household property on the south, and certain land belonging to Earl Manvers on the west.

(4.) So much of the parishes of Mansfield, and Mansfield Woodhouse, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a line from the Bridge near Bath Mill in Mansfield along the footpath to Old Mill-lane, across such lane, along Stinton-lane to Rushpool farm, thence along the road to Midworth's Plantation, from there to Clipstone-road at Walker's Plantation, across Newlands-road to Norman's Wood, thence along Eakring-road to Sandy-lane, and along Sandy-lane to the Bridge near Bath Mill in Mansfield aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the parish of Sibthorpe, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on or towards the south by Longhedge-lane leading from White Cross to the Four-lane Ends near Hawksworth, on or towards the east by Sibthorpe-road leading from Hawksworth to Sibthorpe and the Back Dyke as far as the Hunting Bridge, on or towards the north by an imaginary line from the Hunting Bridge to Deadwong-lane Bridge and a straight line from the latter Bridge to White Cross, and on or towards the west by Longhedge-lane.

(6.) So much of the parish of Mansfield, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Mansfield and Southwell line of Railway from the Nottingham-road to the Southwell-road, the Southwell-road from the Railway Bridge to Lyndhurst-lane, Lyndhurst-lane through Mansfield Wood to the Old Turnpike-road, the Old Turnpike-road from Lyndhurst-lane to the

Nottingham-road, and the Nottingham-road from the Old Turnpike to the Railway Bridge.

(7.) At Orston, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Alverton boundary to Bottesford Crossing on the Great Northern Railway on the east, Bottesford-lane to Gillotts farm on the south, Lordship-lane, Spa-lane, and Mill-lane to Flawborough boundary in Long Edge-lane, and Flawborough boundary fence to Alverton-road on the west, and Alverton-road to Alverton boundary aforesaid on the north.

(8.) At Winthorpe, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the fence known as the Winthorpe boundary fence on the east, the fence known as the Winthorpe and Newark boundary fence leading to Winthorpe Bridge on the south, the road known as Gainsborough-road leading from Winthorpe Bridge to Winthorpe School on the west, and the road known as Coddington-road leading from Winthorpe School to the Winthorpe boundary fence aforesaid on the north.

(9.) At Worksop, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the boundary fence of the farm in the occupation of Henry Simpson adjoining certain lands in the occupation of John Flockton and George Sudbury, on the south the boundary fence of the farm in the occupation of the said Henry Simpson adjoining certain lands in the occupation of John Edeson, on the east the boundary fence of the farm in the occupation of the said Henry Simpson adjoining certain lands in the occupation of George Sudbury and the Worksop Cricket Club, and the fence of the highway leading from Worksop to Newark known as Low Town Sparkin Hill.

(10.) So much of the parish of Edwalton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary fence of Edwalton and Tollerton on the east, the highway leading from Plumtree and along Lings-lane to the Loughborough highway on the south, the boundary fence of Wilford on the west, and on the north the boundary fence of West Bridgeford, the highway from Lings Bar to Ludlow Hill included.

(11.) At Holme-Pi-repont, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from a point at James's-lane on the Nottingham-road, along the north side of the Nottingham-road to Holme-road End in the parish of Radcliffe, thence along the east side of Holme-road, Island-lane, and the Great Northern Railway to the river Trent, thence along the south side of the Trent to a field known as Wombell's Hoggam, thence along the west fence of the Hoggam and Bottom Trent field fence to

Mr. Seymour's on the Holme-road, and along Holme-road and James's-lane (east) to the point on the Nottingham-road aforesaid.

(12.) So much of the parishes of Barton, and Clifton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Clifton Church to Thrumpton-lane End on the east, the Thrumpton highway to Barton-lane End on the south, the highway from Barton Lodge to Barton Boat on the west, and the river Trent to Clifton Church on the north.

Rutland.—(1.) So much of the parish of Barrow, in the county of Rutland, as lies on the west side of the highway leading from Cottesmore to Market Overton.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Stoke Dry, in the county of Rutland, except one field deep on the west or right hand side of the highway leading from Uppingham to Rockingham.

Shropshire.—So much of the parishes of Clive, and Grinshill, in the county of Salop, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the foot-road from the Clive to Yorton, then the boundary fence of Sansaw Lawn to the top of Merry-lane, along the highway to Grinshill, and along the bottom of Grinshill Hill to the Clive aforesaid.

Staffordshire.—(1.) The township of Fazeley, in the county of Stafford, except the liberties of Dunstall and Bangley.

(2.) So much of the parishes of Wombourne, Enville, and Bobbington, in the county of Stafford, as lies between the main-road from Dudley to Bridgnorth and the highway from Green's Forge direct to Halfpenny Green.

(3.) So much of the parish of Wombourne, and of the township of Lower Penn, in the county of Stafford, as is bounded by the highway from The Bratch to the Woodhouse, the main-road from Wombourne to Wolverhampton, the highway from Upper Penn through the village of Lower Penn to Dimingsdale, and the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal.

(4.) So much of the parish of Codsall, in the county of Stafford, as lies on the western side of the highway direct from the northern corner of Wrottesley Park to the cross-roads at Gunston.

Suffolk.—(1.) At Badingham, in the county of Suffolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain roads leading from Cransford Church eastward to Colston Hall, northward to the White House, and westward to Mrs. Stanford's crossways on the Framlingham-road, and thence by the road leading to Cransford Church aforesaid.

(2.) At Tannington, in the county of Suffolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Bedfield Dog-lane to Tannington Lodge on the east, thence northward to Tannington Horse Shoes Inn and the Wash-road and Tannington Church, thence westward by Bedfield-lane to Stearn's Buildings, thence by the foot-path direct to Bedfield Dog-lane aforesaid on the south.

(3.) At Ashfield-with-Thorpe, in the county of Suffolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the lane in the parish of Ashfield known as Waddle Goose-lane leading from Ashfield village to Debenham on the west, a certain lane and occupation-road leading from Waddle Goose-lane to Kenton Lodge on the north, the road from Kenton Lodge in the parish of Mouk Soham to Clow's Corner on the north and east, and thence the road leading

direct to Ashfield village aforesaid on the east and south.

(4.) At Marlesford, in the county of Suffolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Little Glemham Lodge, Little Glemham, to Marlesford Common on the north, the road leading from Marlesford Common to Marlesford village and Railway Station, passing Marlesford Hall and Park, on the west and south, and the Ipswich and Yarmouth turnpike-road from Marlesford village to Little Glemham Lodge aforesaid on the south and east.

(5.) At Groton, in the county of Suffolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Lindsey to Kersey on the north, the road from Kersey to Hadleigh hamlet on the east, the road from Hadleigh hamlet to Groton on the south, and the road from Groton to Lindsey on the west.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Benacre, and Wrentham, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road leading from Wrentham to Kessingland on the north, the high-road from Wrentham to the sea shore on the west, and the high-road running from Kessingland-road south-west to the sea shore.

(7.) So much of the parish of Mettingham, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road from Bungay to Beccles on the north, the high-road from Cross-Ways Bungay-road to Mettingham Castle on the west, Beach-lane from Bungay-road to Ilketshall St. Johns on the east, and the high-road from Mettingham Castle to Ilketshall St. Johns on the south.

(8.) So much of the parish of Spexhall, in the county of Suffolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road from Spexhall to Rumburgh on the west, the high-road from Rumburgh to Saint Lawrence on the north, the high-road from Spexhall Church to the old turnpike-road from Halesworth to Bungay on the south, and certain arable and pasture land running up to the turnpike-road from Halesworth to Saint Lawrence and Bungay on the east.

Surrey.—(1.) So much of the petty sessional division of Croydon, in the county of Surrey, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London-road commencing at Norbury Station as far as New-road leading to Mitcham Common on the east, New-road leading to Mitcham Common on the south, Mitcham Common on the west, and an imaginary line across certain fields in various occupations from the northern corner of Mitcham Common to Norbury Station aforesaid on the north.

(2.) At Croydon, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mr. King's premises on the north, Mr. Watney's premises on the south, Bramley Hill-road on the east, and Mr. Rowland's fields and Violet-lane on the west.

(3.) At Windlesham, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Ascot and Woking branch of the London and South-Western Railway on the west, the Guildford-road on the north and east, and the Common boundary from Hammonds Plantation to the Ascot and Woking branch of the London and South-Western Railway on the south.

(4.) So much of the parishes of Horley, and Charlwood, in the county of Surrey, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say,

the highway from Reigate to Crawley on the west, the road leading from Hookwood Common to Meath Green Cross-roads via Lee-street on the south, thence in an easterly direction by Lonesome-lane to Lonesome Bridge and thence in a northerly direction by the footpath to Sidlow on the Reigate and Crawley-road.

(5.) At Dorking, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bradley-lane leading from Bradley farm to the river Mole on the north, the river Mole to Castle Mill on the east, the Reigate-road from Castle Mill to Cotmandene on the south, and an imaginary line across the Lordships and certain other fields in various occupations from Cotmandene to Bradley farm on the west.

(6.) At Horley, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Kennersley Lodge on the Reigate and Crawley-road, thence the public footpath to Woolvers farm on the Reigate and Charlwood-road, thence the Reigate and Charlwood-road by Horse Hill to Hookwood Common cross-roads, and thence the Reigate and Crawley-road to Kennersley Lodge aforesaid.

(7.) At Betchworth, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Reigate to Dorking on the east, an occupation-road belonging to the Brockham Brick and Tile Company from the Reigate and Dorking-road to the South-Eastern Railway on the south, the South-Eastern Railway to Buckland Crossing on the west, and from Buckland Crossing to Buckland Church on the Reigate and Dorking-road on the north.

Sussex.—(1.) At Trotton, in the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Iping Crossways to Fitzball and Bridgeland, thence along a footpath to a cottage near in the occupation of Owen Stephens, gamekeeper, into a lane leading towards Goldring's farm, down the said lane to a footpath leading into the public-road near Dumpford farm, thence along the said road into Dumpford-lane, along the said lane into a lane leading to Terwick Mill, thence across the river Rother by a bridge and public footpath and lane into the Midhurst and Petersfield dis-turnpiked-road near the foot of Crocker Hill, thence along the said road into Gatehouse-lane, and along the said lane into a lane leading to Hammer Pond, along the said lane to a point near Hammer Pond, thence along a public footpath over the head of Hammer Pond into Iping-lane, and thence along the said lane past Iping Church and Iping Paper Mills to Iping Crossways aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parishes of Maresfield, Buxted, and Uckfield, in the county of Sussex, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain stream in Views Wood which runs through Buxted Park to Bevingford farm, thence by an occupation-road to Rill Gate through Hendall Wood, thence a certain stream to Maresfield Mill, thence to Blackdown farm-buildings, thence by a certain footpath through Blackdown Wood to Claremont-road to Ringles Cross, and thence the boundary fence of Views Wood to the stream first-mentioned.

(3.) At Polegate, in the county of Sussex, comprising all the lands and roadways lying within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the east side of the high-road leading from the Old Toll Gate in Polegate to Tutt's Green in the parish of Willington, thence by the

north side of the East Wish-lane to the Westham-road at Pollyarch, thence by the north side of the Westham-road to Shepham-lane in the parish of Westham, thence by the west side of the said Shepham-lane to the boundary of Otham farm in the said parish of Westham, and thence by the boundary of the said farm to Otham-lane in the said parish, thence by the south side of Otham-lane to the cottages at Sayerland farm in the parish of Hailsham, thence to the Hailsham and Polegate-road at Cophall in the parish of Hailsham, thence by the east side of the Hailsham and Polegate-road to Swine's Hill, and all the lands lying on the west side of the highway leading from Swine's Hill to the boundary post of the parishes of Hailsham and Folkington on the Lewes and Eastbourne-road.

Warwickshire.—(1.) At Churchover, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Churchover to the Watling Street-road on the west, the Watling Street-road on the north, the Rugby and Lutterworth-road on the east, and the road leading out of the Rugby and Lutterworth-road to the vilage of Churchover on the south.

(2.) At Whitley, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western Railway from Coventry Cemetery to the river Sowe on the north, the river Sowe from the London and North-Western Railway to its junction with the river Sherbourne on the east, and the river Sherbourne from the last-mentioned spot to the boundary fence of Whitley Common, and thence by the boundary fence of Whitley Common to the starting point at the London and North-Western Railway on the south.

(3.) At Fletchamstead, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Tile Hill-lane on the north, certain land of James Harris on the east, Tenshilling and Park Woods and certain land in the occupation of William Campbell and Robert Cartwright on the south, and Tile Hill-road and Railway Station on the west.

(4.) So much of the parish of Curdworth, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Tamworth and Birmingham turnpike-road on the north, the lane known as Farthing-lane leading into the vilage of Curdworth on the east, the foot-road leading from Curdworth to Water Orton on the south, and a straight line from the said foot-road to Curdworth Parish New School on the west; so much of the Tamworth and Birmingham turnpike-road as forms the boundary of the Area being included in the Area.

(5.) At Grendon, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Watling Street-road from the corner of Upper Whittington-lane to the corner of Lower Whittington-lane, Lower Whittington-lane to the Merevale Crossing on the London and North-Western Railway, the London and North-Western Railway to the Baddesley Crossing, and thence Upper Whittington-lane to the Watling Street-road.

(6.) So much of the parishes of Middleton, Kingsbury, Lea Marston, and Moxhall, in the county of Warwick, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north from Hunt Green by the Park-lane, the boundary of Middleton Park, to the Bottom (Canal) Lock, and thence by Broomy Crofts farm to the river Tame, on the east by the river Tame

to Lea Marston, on the south by Dark-lane to the Birmingham-road, and thence by the Lichfield-road to Red Cap farm, and on the west by Hell End-lane to Hunt Green.

(7.) At Sutton Coldfield, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Barley Mow Inn by the road leading past Mere Pool Church to Shepherds Pool on the north, Whitehouse-lane to Whitehouse Bar on the east, Tamworth-lane to the Birmingham-road on the south, and the Birmingham and Lichfield turnpike-road to the Barley Mow Inn aforesaid on the west.

(8.) At Brandon, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Brandon to Bretford from Side-Hill Spinny to Bretford village, thence the road leading from Bretford to Wolston to where it is crossed by the London and North-Western Railway, thence the London and North-Western Railway to where it adjoins the river Avon, and thence the river Avon to Side-Hill Spinny aforesaid.

(9.) At Allesley, near Coventry, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Coventry and Birmingham-road from the corner of Mellicent Wood to Peckford-lane, thence by Peckford-lane to the wheelwright's shop at Eastern Green, thence by the occupation-lane leading to Shirley Wood, and thence by Shirley Wood and Mellicent Wood to the corner of Mellicent Wood aforesaid.

Worcestershire.—(1.) At Northfield, in the county of Worcester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Bristol-road from the blacksmith's shop Cock-lane to Tessel-lane on the east, thence up Tessel-lane to Cock-lane on the south, thence across Cock-lane up Frog Mill-lane to Frog Mill in the parish of Frankley on the west, thence from Frog Mill in a direct line to (and including) Gin-House farm in the parish of Northfield on the north, and thence from Gin-House farm in a direct line by the back of the Bell Inn Northfield to the blacksmith's shop end of Cock-lane.

(2.) So much of the parish of Northfield, in the county of Worcester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Midland Railway on the east from the end of South-road, Bristol-road, to Tessel-lane, from the Midland Railway to (and including) Bumbery farm, thence Old Middleton Hall-road to Belmont House, Bristol-road, and thence by Ivy Cottage, Upper Shendley fields, to Gin House farm.

Yorkshire (East Riding).—(1.) At Wharram-le-Street, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing on the Wharram and Fimber highway opposite Bella-lane to Towthorpe Plantation on the west, a quickwood fence the boundary of George Harrison's land on the south, a quickwood fence the boundary of the township of Duggleby on the east, and a quickwood fence the boundary of George Harrison's land on the north to the highway opposite Bella-lane aforesaid.

(2.) At Eastington, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Hull and Selby-road from Newport Bridge to Wallington Mill on the south, Mill-lane from Wallington Mill to Henry Brabbs's farmstead on the west, Sandholme-lane from Henry

Brabbs's farmstead to Sandholme Landing on the north, and the Market Weighton Canal from Sandholme Landing to Newport Bridge on the east.

(3.) At Great Driffield, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, North-street on the north, Bridge-street and Church-lane on the south, Eastgate North on the east, and part of Church-lane and Westgate on the west.

(4.) At Sherburn, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Sherburn Church to the High Mill by the East Beck stream on the east, a quickwood fence known as Greets fence on the south, the White Gate-road and a quickwood fence the boundary of Richard Duggleby's land on the west, and the East Beck stream to Sherburn Church aforesaid on the north.

(5.) So much of the parish of Escrick, in the East Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Holby Carr Wood in Lord Wenlock's Park and by a private-road leading through the Park on the west, the boundary fence of the Park to the Escrick and Skipwith highroad and thence the bridle-road known as Dog Kennel-lane leading to Cottingwith as far as Pallion drain on the north, the boundary of Pallion drain on the east, and the boundary of Pallion drain to Skipwith Bridge on the Skipwith and Escrick highroad and thence the Pallion drain to Holby Carr Wood aforesaid on the south.

(6.) At Elloughton, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Elloughton-street on the west, the Elloughton and Welton low-road to the quickwood fence between Mr. Blyth's and Mr. George Wilson's land on the south, the quickwood fence between Mr. Blyth's and Mr. George Wilson's land to the highroad leading from Elloughton to Welton on the east, and the Elloughton and Welton highroad on the north.

(7.) At Sancton, in the East Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain quickwood fence on the north dividing Arras from Hesselskew and extending from Arras Scroggs to Arras Fox Cover, a certain quickwood fence on the west extending from Arras Fox Cover to Hesselskew Whin Cover dividing lands of Joseph Stephenson and Joseph Galloway of Sancton from Hesselskew, a certain quickwood fence on the south extending from Hesselskew Whin Cover up to a point where the fence divides the land of Newbald Lodge and Hesselskew, and a certain quickwood fence on the east belonging to John Lee of Gardam extending from the point where the fence divides the land of Newbald Lodge and Hesselskew to Arras Scroggs.

(8.) So much of the parish of Stillingfleet, in the East Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at John Simpson's farmstead on the Stillingfleet and Cawood highway to a certain quickwood fence through lands in the occupation of George Daniel and John Dods-worth to Winney-lane on the west, Winney-lane from George Daniel's and John Dods-worth's land on the south from a certain quickwood fence from Winney-lane through lands in the occupation of William Acoble,

and across the Stillingfleet and Escrick highway to the boundary of Stillingfleet Gravel Pit to Stillingfleet Beck on the east, and Stillingfleet Beck from the Gravel Pit on the north across the Green to a certain quickwood fence to John Simpson's farmstead aforesaid.

Yorkshire (North Riding).—(1.) So much of the townships of Kingthorpe, and Farmanby, in the North Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Thornton and Lockton-road commencing at Brewsters Gate Horkendale Slack to the Little Plantation on the west, Little Plantation to the Warren Wall on the north, the Warren Wall on the east, and a quickwood fence from the Warren Wall on the south side of the seed field known as The Eleven Acres in the occupation of Simpson Allinson, and by Brewsters fence to Horkendale Slack.

(2.) At Asenby, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Swale from Robinson's Fog Ings to Gills Garth at Asenby village on the east, the Asenby and Dishforth highway from Gills Garth to Dishforth-poor-field in the occupation of Mary Shipley on the north, a quickwood fence from Dishforth-poor-field to Harom Grange and Fleatham Beck to Fleatham Wood on the west, the Dishforth and Cundall highway from Fleatham Wood to the Asenby and Cundall-road, a private-road to Leckby Palace, and a quickwood fence to the river Swale at the Fog Ings on the south.

THE following Regulations are directed by the Secretary of State for War to be observed in relation to the mode of storing, safe-keeping, and receiving and delivering gunpowder to and from the vessels to be moored at the places appointed under the provisions of an Act of the 14 and 15 Queen Victoria, chapter 67, sec. 6, entitled "An Act to Repeal so much of an Act of 12th year of King George the 3rd, relating to the making and carriage of gunpowder, as exempts therefrom certain gunpowder magazines and stores near Liverpool, and to make certain temporary provisions with regard to the said magazines and stores."

Any person failing to observe these regulations will be guilty of a misdemeanour, and punished accordingly.

1. The vessels are to be fitted with Sir William Snow Harris's lightning conductors, or with any other equally efficient form of conductor.

2. A red flag is at all times to be displayed at the mast-head of every floating magazine.

3. Each magazine is to be amply provided with tanned hides, and with wooden blocks, and brass sheaves where necessary, and all workmen are to be supplied with caps, frocks, and trowsers of canvas, and shoes or slippers of leather, which are to be used in the magazine work only. The ordinary boot or shoe is only to be worn on the upper deck; and on no account are the magazine shoes and the ordinary boots and shoes to be used on the same deck or floor, or to be placed on the same deck, floor, or shelf. This applies generally to the powder vessels as well as to the magazines. A

force-pump is also to be provided for the purpose of throwing water in all directions.

4. An examining room is to be provided for each magazine, which is to be situated on the deck, with strengthened flooring below it; and it is to be used for no other purpose than for shifting powder, and heading-up or unheading the barrels. Magazine shoes are to be worn in this room.

5. The owners of each magazine are to appoint a storekeeper, in whose charge the magazine is to be placed, and who is to be bound, together with two competent sureties, to such owners in the sum of £1,000 for the proper execution of his duty, to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State, and he is to be responsible for any assistant storekeeper or storekeepers he (the storekeeper) may appoint. He is also to appoint all workmen and boatmen required for this service, who are to be examined before they begin their work, and strict surveillance is to be exercised over them during the performance of their duty to see that they are perfectly sober and well conducted.

6. No lights (except the signal one, and a second for the watch, which is to have water under it, and a temporary light in an approved hand-lantern, to be brought from the shore for the purpose of lighting the signal and light for the watch, and then to be extinguished), also no fires or smoking, are to be allowed, and under no pretence whatsoever is any lucifer match to be permitted on board; and to guard against the infringement of this order, the clothes with pockets in them are to be taken off in the changing-room, or examined before beginning the work.

7. The storekeeper or other person in charge is not to allow more than one powder vessel on each side of the magazine at the same time, and he is to provide good and suitable boats, duly licensed, for conveying the powder to and from the magazine.

8. No barrel containing gunpowder is to be received or placed in these magazines unless it be free from grit and well coopered. No defective barrel is to be taken into the magazine; and no barrel is to be received having any other hoops than those of wood or copper, or having any other metal in or about it.

9. Great care is to be taken in sweeping up the loose gunpowder, and, on the appearance of an approaching thunder storm or of lightning, all the ports and doors are to be closed.

10. All powder vessels bringing gunpowder are, before entering the Mersey, to hoist a red flag, which is to be kept up until the whole of the powder is discharged, and before approaching the magazines, all fires are to be completely extinguished, and they are not to be relighted until the vessel is moved a quarter of a mile off; and the respective owners of each magazine are to be responsible for their respective vessels bringing powder from their works being provided with the red flag, and for its being hoisted at all times when their vessels have powder on board on the Mersey. All vessels coming to receive powder from the magazines are to extinguish their fires and lights before they arrive within a distance of a quarter of a mile from the magazines, and are to keep them extinguished while within that distance.

11. The owners of each magazine, storekeeper, and assistant-storekeepers are to be responsible for the due examination of the vessels before they are warped alongside, either by themselves or by a competent person of the powder establishment.

12. No boats but those belonging to the storekeeper, excepting boats of ships bringing powder, part of ship's stores to be deposited, or the boat conveying the inspecting officer, are to be allowed

to go alongside the powder vessel, nor is any boat to be allowed to communicate with any vessel or vessels which are receiving or discharging powder alongside the powder vessel.

13. On the approach of a steamer, the officer in charge of the working party in the vessel or vessels alongside the magazines will, if he deem it necessary, direct the hatches of the vessels to be covered with a material provided for the purpose, the hatches to remain covered until the same officer shall direct the removal of the coverings. The order to cover the hatches will depend on the proximity of the steamer, and the direction and force of the wind, but under any conditions they should be covered, should the steamer approach within 100 yards.

14. The same precautions as above will be observed in regard to the magazines by closing the ports.

15. A bright light is to be placed in each of the magazines every night, in such a position as is customary for signal lights, and two men are to be placed in each magazine for further security as a watch.

16. No powder is to be received or issued at the magazines, unless the storekeeper or assistant-storekeepers be present.

17. All persons, of whatsoever degree of rank, employed in the receipt, issue, or custody of powder at the magazines, are to point out to all concerned any proceeding which may have a tendency to cause danger.

18. The inspecting officer, appointed by the Secretary of State, is empowered to enforce these regulations, and is at all times to have access to the magazines.

19. The storekeeper or assistant storekeepers are to report to the inspecting officer any deviation from these rules and regulations which may occur, as well as any other circumstances affecting the security, especially as regards the due efficiency of the mooring chains and tackle.

20. An account of the receipts and issues is to be kept, either on board the magazines, respectively by the storekeepers or assistant storekeepers, or at the storekeeper's office in Liverpool, in a day journal, which journal is to be open to the examination of the inspecting officer at any time, and such officer is empowered to make such extracts as he may think proper.

21. Any vessel used as a magazine for gunpowder must be moored so as to swing inside that portion of the site set apart by the Admiralty in 1851 which is marked by red dotted lines in the Chart Appendix H. of the Report of the Admiralty Committee in August, 1881.

22. The maximum quantity of gunpowder to be stored in any one vessel used as a magazine shall not exceed at any one time 200,000 lbs., and all the gunpowder so stored shall be below the level of the surrounding water.

23. The distance between each vessel used for the storage of gunpowder shall be such as will afford a reasonable security against communicated explosion, which, in the case of vessels containing 200,000 lbs. of gunpowder, should not be less than 200 yards.

Printed copies of these regulations are to be placed in such places in the powder vessels as the inspecting officer may direct, and are to be renewed so often as it may be necessary to insure their being always perfectly legible.
