The Count O.10 William Coning mark has near upon compleated his Regiment of Horle, having for the encouragement thereof advanced 50 or 60 Rixdollers to every able perfon that offered his fervice.

Our Polish Letters tell us that the King having retired himself into a Convent, to pals there his Easter in devotion, the Nobility have likewise left Warsaw, having first defined His May-fly that another General Diet might be suddenly called, to settle the Affairs of the Kingdome; declaring that they shall otherwise be forced to meet in Armes. 'I is confidently said that His Matelfty is resolved to refign his scrown, and retire himself front Publick Affairs; and that the Nobility defire to enter upon a free Election of a Successfor, to which there are like to be many Pretenders.

Théy farther tell us that the Co.lacks beyond the Dniper are revolted from the Mulcovites, and joyning with a party of the Tartars have made an Inclusion into Raffia; where they committed great crutelties, deltroying forme numbers of the people, and carrying of a great Boory, and that they had emploied forme (ommificients to the Grand Seignior, in the Namé of themfelves and their (onfederates, to de mand Succors a sainft Poland and Mulcouy; defiring to Rive under his Protection, and that in compliance with them, the Sultan has promified to fend a confiderable Arthy towards Camienick Podolski, the better to encourage the Collacks in their defigns, and to increase his own Dominion's by fome new Conquest on that fide.

Hague, April 20. Yelterday arrived an Express from Paris with in account of the Articles agreed upon between England, France, and the è States, toge her with a su pension of Arns till the end of May, by which time Spain is to Sigh and Ratifie the Treaty at Aix 14 sh pelle.

The States Deputies which are to be employ'd as a Council to the Army which is to Rendezvous at Hardenburg, are yesterday set forwards; the other intended for the Army at Bergen-03-Zoom may also suddenly depart, with whom 'ds faid is to go His Highne's the Prince of Orange and Field-Matshal Wurz, though others are rather perforaded the Prince intends for Hardenburg to take a view of the Lu enburg forces which are expected to Joyn there with our forces, and may take some other way then that through the Bishop of Munflers Countrey.

From Lutzersburg Letters of the 1 th inftant, tell us that the Bifhop fill labours to obftruct the paffage of thole 4600 Lunenburgers defigned hither, pretending that by a 'Treaty between himfelf and the Electoral Princes of Triers, Mayence, Cologne, Bavaria, Brandenberg, with the Princes of Heffen and Caffel, he Rands obliged not to permit the free paffage of any forces thorow his Territory.

Bruffels, April 21. On Sunday last arrived here a Courier Extraordinasy from spain, amongst oth.r things, confirming the news of Don Juan's thatch into Galicia in order to his embarcation for the Netherlands. The same day the Horseguards went out to attend upon a party of 12 or 1500 Spanish Foot sent to reinforce the Garison of Hainault.

On Wedneiday arrived an Expreis from Paris, bringing with him the alfurance that His Molt Christian Majesty had upon the addresses of the Ministers of the Mediators, gtanted a suspension of all Acts of Hokility till the end of Mays in the mean time t è Negotiation for peace may be carried of without interruption.

From Aix 14 Chapelle we are told that Monifeut Colbert has fince his artival there, entertain'd the Bifhop of Stratsbourg with more then ufual Magnificence, and intends in few days to make his publick Entry; Endythat the Baron de Aergeyck is likewife preparing his Train to appear with armuch iplen for as his Character requires ; both of these Ministers make their visus flucesflively to the Popes Nuncio, but avoid all occations of meeting publiquely, the better to prevent diforders. ⁴ Tis faid also that by a lite Courier from the Court of Spain, Don Estevan de Gamarra ao Ambailedor in Holland, has received Orders to repair to Arx la Chapelle to affift at the Treaty.

This day Letters are dispatche to all the principal Officers of our Army to inform them of the Cessation of Arms lately agreed upon, requiring their care for its due observation.

Paris, April 21. His Majefly having refolved upon the Fortification of Aloft, the Duke de Roanney is by His Order departed hence, to take care of that Affair, and to, draw out of the Neighbouring Garrilons a Body of 8000 men, to be a guard to thole that are to be employed in the Works; befodes which he is likewife inclined to fortifie also the little Towns of Mineve and Gerardmont, and one other Post called Liquerque.

The Fortifications which were all undermined at Dole in Franche comte, are by a fresh Order to be blownup, one Bastion onely being referved upon the Petition of the Jefuites, whole Church is stuared upon the neck of it.

From Rochelle we have advice that Monfieut de Beaufort ha ing faile i as far as Corinna without any adventure, is fince crui ing about the Cspe Finiflerre with his Squadron confifting of 12 great Men of War, 6 Advice filps, and as many Fire-flips, intending to pals farther in expeflation of joyning with a Squairon of 20 fails, which fome time fince went to Sea from the lon i but upon His Malefties lare Grant of a Cefftuon till the end of May, Orders are fent to al the Pits of France, to give speedy notice thereof to the Fleet, to the end no farther Hoftilities paffe during the faid Truce.

Yesterday in the Evening we had news from Lifbure that the Prince Regent Don Pedro was married to the Queen, of which expect a faither confirmation.

Even now arrived a Courier from Bruffels, informing us that the Ma.quis de Caftel Rodrigo has accepted of His Majerties project for peace, and the Ministers of the Mcdiators are halt ming to St. Germains to give an account thereof to His Majerty.

Bruges, A ril 22. The 20th inftant arrived here the Marquils de Salazer with the Equipage and Gnards whiele are to attend Don Juan upon his arrival, and are accordingly gone forwards to Oflend, there to expect his coming. The Marquil's with fome other Perfons of Quality, continue here in expectation of the News of his artival, which by a Bark newly put into Oflend, we are advifed will be in fhore time? the Spanish Fleet being faid to be already put to lea.

Two Men of War of Offend are lately put in thete, bringing in with them leven French Merchant fhips, all of them of confiderable value, taken out of a great Fleet on Thursday last near their own Coafts.

The French have not lately made any attempt in thele parts, and the Cellation lately agreed upon at Paris till the end of MAY, gives us hope's that by the endeavours of the Mediators, a happy end may be put to the Wars.
