TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command, The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

East Point, low and rocky, with a reef on its northern side, is almost steep-to on its eastern side; the water deepening suddenly from 5 to 16 fathoms at about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the shore.

A bank with 12 fathoms least water lies E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from East Point.

CAUTION.—The above reported rock would be farther off shore than any hitherto known danger, the necessity therefore of preserving a safe distance from East Point in passing is apparent. This should be specially observed at night or in hazy weather, when the high land of Jebel Zukur, it has been remarked, has a peculiar distant appearance, and the point being low, with white sand behind resembling water, is not seen until a vessel is dangerously close to it.
