THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, reporting the prohibition by an Ukase, dated 24th May-5th June, of the transport of foreign goods across the Trans-Caucasus region. By the same Ukase a duty of 2 roub. 20 cop. in gold per pood is imposed upon refined sugar imported at the Black Sea ports of the Trans-Caucasus region.
