Thirlby Butcher Greenhill, thence to the right along the highway to the brook, thence to the right along the brook as far as Holly Hay Wood, and to the right by the Wood side across the road to the Monastery aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
