THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

CHELMSFORD PLEASURE FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated 24th day of November, 1880, a representation has been duly made to me by the Local Board for the District of Chelmsford, in the county of Essex, on behalf of the owners, that Pleasure Fairs have been annually held in Chelmsford, on the 12th and 13th May and the 12th and 13th of November, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished:

2. On the 30th day of July, 1883, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fairs. *W. V. Harcourt.*
