Rome, Decemb. 31.

N Christman-Eve the Pope, according to Custom, bless'd a Cap and Sword, to be sent to some Prince or General that had signalized himser against the common Enemy of Christendom; which he intends to make, at this time, a Present of to the Doge Morosini. The Pope's Gallies are fitting out with great diligence at Crista Victora, which will be sent, with 1000 Land Soldiers, to the Assistance of the Venetians: And the Officers, that have received their Commissions.

Tooo Land Soldiers, to the Affirhance of the Venetians: And the Officers, that have received their Committions, have begun the Levy of 2000 Men within the Eccleitaffical State, which the Pope has granted to that Republick. The Cardinals of the French Faction are labouring to accommodate Matters between this Court and France, but they do not find the Pope inclined to yield any thing which his Predeceffor in offed upon. Don Marco October has taken Poffellion of the Command of Captain of the Pope's Guards: And it's believed the Cardinal Octobori will be declared Legat of Augment.

Venice, Jan. 6. Two great Convoys will part from heace before the end of this Month with Soldiers, Proviheace before the end of this Month with Soldiers, Provisions, Ammunition and Money, for the Learnet. And Endeavours are used to make a new Agreement about the Troops of Wirtemberg and Wolfemberel, that they may continue in the Service of this Republick. It is confirmed, that the Turks have put forme Succors into Napple at Milvisfix; and that the Captain-Bassa was prevaring a greater Relief for them at Seio; to prevent which, the Captain-General Cornaro had detached Signior Pilant with a Squadron of Ships and Gallies, to observe the Enemies Motions from thence. The last week was published here the Jubilee lately granted by the Pope. The Senate bave deputed Four Noble Venetians to go and meet the Doge, who is now very suddenly expected here; and upon his arrival at the Leao, the whole College will go in a Body to receive him, and conduct him to the Ducal Palace, and from thence to the Church of St. Mark; and Medals of Gold and Silver are preparing to be then distributed among the People.

Lemberg, Decemb. 17. The Court continues still at Zolkiem, where an Express arrived some days since with Letters from the Emperor, fignifying, That feeing the Turkish Envoys at Vienna had not, fince the return of their last Courier from Adrianople, made any new Proposals of Peace, his Imperial Majesty had refolved to fend them back, and therefore defired the King of Poland, and the Republick of Venice, would give the Enemy powerful Diversions on their side, that so they may be at last obliged, by the happy Progresses of the Confederates, to yield to such Conditions as may, for the sturre, secure Christendom against their Invasions. All things are at prefent very quiet on these Frontiers; but we have advice from Mollivia, that the Tartars are preparing a great Convoy for the Relief of Caminiec.

Winfam, Decemb. 23. The Court is expected the next week at Goura, about five Miles from this City, where the King will flay till the opening of the Dier. The Palatin of Pemerania is on his departure as Ambathador from this Crown to the Emperor. We have no fresh News of the Tartars; who, it's believed, are returned to the Crimes upon the Advice of the great Preparations that are making by the Moscovites. They write from Mylon, that the Caar John was resolved to march himself at the Head of his Forces: And that he was substituted and had also the his Forces: And that he was Luding Ambassadors to the Princes Confederated against the Turks, to exhort them to a vigorous Profecution of the War, and to defire they would not make a Peace without his Participation.

Vienna, Jan. 8. The last Letters from Bulgaria give this farther account of the Names and Situation of the Conquer'd Places on that fide, hitherto very iittle known, by reason of their having been so long under the Subjection of the Turks. Pristina is the chief City of the Province of Cassova, where the Forces, under the command of the Duke of Hosstein, have now their Head-quarters. Between Priflina and V/copia, the Imperialists are possess'd of the strong Castle of Kazanecke, and, a little more on the Left Hand, of the Castle of Orizare, and, on the Lert Hand, of the Came of Orizare, and, farther towards Sophia, of the Fort of Nove-Borde, or Monte-Nuovo, and Uranie; as for Use-pia, it being a place of no strength, and of too large an extent to be kept, our Troops abandoned it, after the total and set the Town Rehaving plundered, and fet Fire to the Town. Besides these Posts, which lie very far within the Turkish Dominions, the Imperial Forces are, on the fide of Albania, Masters of Prisseran, or Breseren, Petschy, Tetona, and some other places; and towards Bosnia, of Mitroviz, Bantzehko, Watschieterna, and all the other confiderable Posts, except the Cattle of Smetschy, which was still in the hands of the Turks; by which means they of Bosnia are cut off from all Communication with the Province of Albania, except by the way of Erfegovia. The Town of Velesch, where the Sieur Janourski performed the Gallant Action mentioned in our last, stands on the other fide of Uscopia, in the middle of a narrow Pass that leads towards Macedonia, about three days march from Sulonique: At this place the said Janowski not only defeated 3000 Turks with the small Party he had with him, but likewise took the Town, which he plundered and burnt, and afterwards advanced to Tickwefch, which lies in the way to Salonique, but understanding that 5000 Turks were on their march towards Velesch, he thought fit to retire with his Booty; but died some days after of his Wounds. These Advices say farther, that 10000 Tartars, who had passed the Danube at Nicepe-In, advanced towards Vscopia, burning and destroying all the Countrey through which they passed; and that upon the News of it, the Duke of Heistein had drawn together the Forces quartered about Pri-

fina, and was marching against them.
