Coveney and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Manea' of which the said church or chapel in the said chapelry shall be the parish

"That the proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice of Coveney and the incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That two churchwardens shall be annually chosen in the customary manner and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed in and

for such separate parish and benefice.

"That all the glebe lands tithe rent-charges or other payments for or in lieu of tithes and all other endowments whatsoever belonging to or arising within or in respect of the said chapelry of Manea shall henceforth belong and be attached to the said proposed separate benefice of Manea for ever and be held received and enjoyed by the incumbent thereof for the time being.

"That the existing mortgages to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall be apportioned

as follows that is to say:

Mortgage No. 2 dated 21 October 1872 for

securing £250 and interest and

Mortgage No. 4 dated 5 July 1876 for securing

£720 and interest

shall be assigned to and remain charged exclusively upon the benefice of Coveney in exoneration of the proposed new benefice of Manea.

"That Mortgage No. 1 dated 1 October 1863 for securing £1200 and interest and Mortgage No. 3 dated 31 December 1873, for securing £750 and interest shall be assigned to and be charged exclusively upon the separate benefice of Manea in exoneration of the benefice of Coveney.

"That the incumbent of the benefice of Coveney shall be liable to pay the whole tenths to

the See of Elv.

" That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said proposed separate parish and benefice of Manea and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate parish or benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

"That the patronage or right of nomination to the said proposed separate benefice of Manea shall be vested in the said Honourable Magdalen Wel-

lesley her heirs and assigns for ever.

"That the parishioners of the said proposed separate parish shall not be entitled to church accommodation in any other church than the church of the said proposed separate parish nor shall the parishioners of Coveney be entitled to any accommodation in the churches or chapels of the said separated benefice.

And whereas the said Bishop of Ely hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 28th day of June 1883, which report is in the words and figures following:-

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend James Russell Lord Bishop of Ely has represented unto us (amongst

other things)

"That to the benefice (being a rectory) and parish church of Coveney in the county of Cambridge and diocese of Ely belongs an ancient parochial chapelry known by the name of Manea the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is in Manea a new church on the site of an ancient church or chapel distant from the parish church of Coveney about six miles.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry of Manea may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Coveney and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and of the incumbent of the said benefice and with the consent in writing of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to certain mortgages being apportioned as in the said scheme is proposed has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Your Majesty's
