THE Board of Trade have received through Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree issued by the President General of Guatemala, requiring that all goods imported into that country shall in future be accompanied by an invoice attested, in triplicate, by the Guatemalan Consul, or some other duly authorized person at the port of shipment.

This Decree, which is dated June 20th, 1883, is to come into operation three months after date.

ORDER of the Local Government Board. Cholera Regulations (Egyptian Rags): Port of London.

To the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London;—

To all Officers of Customs;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the said Port Sanitary Authority;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may contain.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 12th day of July, 1883, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of the disease;

And whereas Cholera is now prevalent in Egypt, and it is expedient that further rules and regulations should be made with reference to ships having on board bales of rags exported from Egypt and consigned to this country;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 52 of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and Section 130 of the Public
