

this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Gedling which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul Carlton in the Willows.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint Paul Carlton in the Willows so recommended to be constituted as aforesaid and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be fully and freely exercised by the said Henry Howard Molyneux Earl of Carnarvon and his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul Carlton in the Willows being:—

"All that part of the parish of Gedling in the county of Nottingham and in the diocese of Lincoln which is bounded on the north-east on the east and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gedling from the parish of Arnold in the county and diocese aforesaid at the point where Mapperley Plains-road is joined by West Dale Lane-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one mile and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Gedling-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Station-road and continuing thence still generally southward, along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the point near Carlton Railway Station where the same road passes over the line of the Midland Railway and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Gedling from the parish of Colwick in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described part of the parish of Gedling aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the north-east, east, and south-east as aforesaid that is say upon the south, upon the west, and upon the north-west, as follows, upon the south, by the parish of Colwick aforesaid upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Matthias Snenton in the county and diocese aforesaid and partly by

the new parish of Saint Ann Nottingham in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese aforesaid and upon the north-west by the parish of Arnold aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the parish of Gedling out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the ninth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate within the limits of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Fulham Fields in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Fulham Fields; and of the parish of All Saints, Fulham, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such consolidated chapelry and of such parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew Fulham Fields, and of the said parish of All Saints, Fulham, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry
