"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes

of Divine worship.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the limits of the said parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, and to his successors a grant of two hundred pounds per annum.

"And whereas the said grant will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas certain well-disposed persons have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of three thousand pounds sterling to be applied in and towards the provision of a church for the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and the said sum has been so contributed and paid upon the condition and understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the patronage of the said district when constituted and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly-mentioned Act then of the said new parish should be assigned to and be vested in the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John now Bishop of the said diocese of London and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereto or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become shall without any assurance in the law other than

Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Bishop of the said diocese of London and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Andrew Stoke New-

ington being :-

"All those two contiguous portions of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London and of the new parish sometime district chapelry of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill in the county and diocese aforesaid which said portions of such first-named parish and of such parish are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the streets or roads called or known respectively as Stamford Hill Cazenove-road and High-street Stoke Newington all join at which point the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill from the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington aforesaid joins the boundary dividing the last-named parish from the parish of West Hackney in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-described boundary for a distance of one chain or thereabouts thereby following the middle of High-street Stoke Newington aforesaid to a point at the eastern entrance to the Abney Park Cemetery opposite to the eastern end of the wall which forms the north-eastern boundary of the said cemetery and extending thence first westward to the said wall and then alternately northwestward and northward along the same wall for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall forming the northern boundary of the same cemetery and extending thence westward along the last-described wall for a distance of fifteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the wall forming the western boundary of the same cemetery and extending thence southward along the last-described wall for a distance of ten and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the point where the said wall abuts or nearly abuts upon the eastern side of Bouverieroad and extending thence westward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the lastnamed road and extending thence northward along the middle of the same road for a distance of seven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grayling-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lordship-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fortyeight and one-half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Seven Sisters'-road and with the road called or known as Woodberry-grove and continuing thence still north-westward across the said Seven Sisters'-road and along the middle of the road called or known as Woodberry-grove aforesaid for a distance of five chains or therethis scheme and any duly gazetted Order of I abouts to the point where the same road bends
