1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Executive-Committee of the Local Authority for the county of Fife, dated the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the whole farmstead on and lands of the Home farm of Lathallan,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
