(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 10th day of October, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—in the petty sessional division of Hyde, in the county of Chester, commencing at the Bridge at Mossley Bottom, along the river bank to Dark-lane, along Dark-lane to the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road, along this road to Henshall-lane Corner, thence along the boundary of Stalybridge borough to the river Tame, and along the river bank to Mossley Bottom Bridge aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising so much of the parishes of Radipole, Fleet, Buckland Ripers, Chickereil, Portisham, Langton Herring, Broadway, Upway, Bincombe, Preston and Sutton Pointz, Melcombe Regis, Weymouth, and Wyke Regis, and other adjacent parishes in the county of Dorset, and in the borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis in the said county, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the coast at Fleet aforesaid continuing in a direct line to the highway at East Fleet, and from thence the road direct to Chickereil by the Well passing near Morn Villa and Rose Cottage in a direct route to Portisham, then the road branching out of the last-mentioned road on the right before the turning to Roddon, and continuing to Kellaways farm, Shilvinghampton, then taking the right hand turning to and through Coryates, thence the road passing by Friar Waddon farm direct to Upway and into the main-road from Weymouth to Dorchester by the Royal Oak Inn, from thence along the said main-road to a point where the road to Bincombe branches off, from thence the direct road to Bincombe village, then the Altar path from Bincombe to Toadmoor farm Cottages into, and along the direct-road to Sutton Pointz, and continuing from the last-mentioned road until the junction with the main-road from Warmwell Cross to Weymouth at or near the Ship Inn at Preston, and from the Ship Inn aforesaid in a direct line to the sea, the coast from this point to the point at East Fleet aforesaid completing the boundary of the Area.

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincoln-
