

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Cardiganshire, holden at Aberystwith.

In the Matter of the Reverend David Parker Morgan, of the Vicarage, Aberdovey, in the county of Merioneth, Clerk in Holy Orders, a Bankrupt.
