And that it was generally reported, that the Chain of Tartary was returned to the Crimee to provide for the Defence of his Country against the Most covites, who make great preparations to invade it this Summer. It is confirmed, that the Czar of Moscowy is sending Ambassadors to the Princes Confederated against the Turks, to acquaint them with his Resolutions to protecute the War with his whole Force, and to defire they will not treat of a Peace, without giving him timely communication thereof, that he may likewife fend Ambassadors to the place of Conference.

Vienna, Jan. 19. On Monday last it was by the Emperors command fignified to the Turkith Envoys here, That feeing they were not impowered to make any new Propolals of Peace, there would, to foon as the Danube was open, be Boats provided to carry them to Belgrade, in order to their return to Turkey. We have yet no particular account of the Action which is faid to have lately happened between the Imperial Forces commanded by the Duke of Holftein and the Turks and Tirtars, who were advanced towards Pristina. An Ambassador is coming hither from Poland, with Instructions, (as we are told) to concert Matters with the Imperial Court in relation to the War, as well as to finish the Treaty of Marriage between the Prince of Poland, and the Princels of Neubourg. The States of Austria now affembled here, have under Confideration the Proposition that was made to them in the Emperors Name at their first Meeting, and particularly that part of it which concerns a Supply for the War. We have an account from Insprucke, that the damage occasioned there by the Earthquake is very confiderable; and that the People continue still under a great consternation by reason of the repeated Shocks they have felt lately.

Francfort, Jan. 29. The Imperial Huffarst that are quartered near the Rhine, have for watchful an Fye upon the French, that none of their Parties have appeared of fate.
