(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 5th day of *December, 1883*.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Croft, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, —which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the parishes of Ashow, Kenilworth, Milverton, Leek-Wootton, and Stoneleigh, in the county of Warwick, —is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Kenilworth, in the county of Warwick, as lies on the east side of the public highway (late turnpike-road) leading from Coventry through Kenilworth to Leamington, and

so much of the parish of Stoneleigh, in the said county, as lies on the east of the public highway from Gibbet Hill to Worsley Bridge, and on the south of the public highway running from the last-mentioned road through Hill to or towards Baginton,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
