

of the new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range aforesaid, which church was not consecrated under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be severed and disannexed from such new parish and shall be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Edmund situate within the limits of the same new parish as aforesaid and shall become and be a district for spiritual purposes and shall be named 'The District of Saint Edmund Whalley Range.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Edmund, Whalley Range, being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Margaret, Whalley Range within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Bride Stretford within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester from the new parish of Saint Margaret, Whalley Range aforesaid at the point where the road called or known as Moss-lane West is joined by Heywood-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the said street for a distance of five hundred and eighty-three yards or thereabouts to its junction with Greame-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seventy-two yards or thereabouts to its junction with Alexandra-road and with Yarburgh-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two hundred and thirty-nine yards or thereabouts to a point near its junction with Upper Hulton-street and opposite to the middle of the northern end of a certain passage which leads between the houses numbered respectively 48 Yarburgh-street and 50 Yarburgh-street and extending thence that is from Yarburgh-street aforesaid south-eastward for a distance of forty-four yards or thereabouts to and along the middle of the said passage to its junction with the passage which runs in rear of the houses situate on the south-eastern side of Yarburgh-street aforesaid the said point of junction being opposite to the northern end of the wall forming the eastern boundary of the grounds attached to Range House, and extending thence southward to and along the said wall for a distance of eighty-seven yards or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Range-road opposite to the middle of the northern end of Albert-road and continuing thence that is from the said wall still southward across

the said Range-road and along the middle of the said Albert-road for a distance of half-a-mile or thereabouts to the southern end of such road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range from the new parish of the Holy Innocents Fallowfield also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the west as aforesaid that is to say upon the south, upon the east, and upon the north as follows upon the south and upon the east by the new parish of the Holy Innocents Fallowfield aforesaid and upon the north partly by the new parish of Christ Church Moss Side partly by the new parish of Saint Clement Greenheys partly by the new parish of Saint Mary Hulme, and partly by the new parish of Saint Bride, Stretford aforesaid, all within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas situate in the parish of Hove in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.
