And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Mary, as aforesaid) of the said parish of Dartington, or of belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Mary (now being, by virtue of these presents, the parish church of the said parish of Dartington), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Arthur Champernowne and the said Richard Champernowne have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this twenty-ninth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Tonge, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to his successors Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of forty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
