Cares; who after a fharp encounter had poffe wed themfelves of three of the Venetian Gallief's but that 3.3 others belonging also to the Venetians, coming timely i ut their refcue, not onely recovered thole three, but made themfelves also Mafters of five of the Turkifh Gallies, and funk two others, with a great flughter of the Turk. They bring not any other particu a sof this Engagement, but that amongft the flain Turks were Mazzamana, Malapano, Dacan Bei, and Cafin Beis, perfors of great Eminency, that above 500 Turks were taken prioners, and above 1000 Chriftian Slav.s geftored to liberty, and that the Gallies which were taken were fent into Candia.

Yesterday a Barque arriving in 20 dayes from Alexendria, informs us that several ships were depa ted thence for Candia.

A Barque from Corfica, tells us that the St. Sebafian a great Ragulean fhip, with 400 Butts of Oil from Puglia, intended for Oftend was unfortunately driven upon the Rocks at Corfica and loft, with leven of her men.

The Samplon, Levant Merchant, and Prudence, for Standeroon, and the Lastum for Puglia, may depart this Evening, and the next Week the Mary and Martha for Smirna.

Hague, April 14. The Lunenburgers are not yet much advanced on their way to the Rendezvous of our Army inrended at Hardenburg, the Bilbop of Munfter having refule them pullage, by reason of his League with the Princes his Neighbors, and t's faid has fecured the passages leading into his Country- placing confiderable Guards upon them.

The Field-Marshall *Wurts* arrived the 21. inflant at *Swoll*, where he had a conference with the States Commiffioners; the Forces are by the Rivers of *Rhine* and *Iffell* haftening to their Rendezvous at *Hardenburg*, where its believed they may meet on Saturday next, and in a day or two be ready to march.

The Sieur De Peluits, Envoye from his Electoral Highnels of Brandenburgh, to his Molt Chriftian Marcfly, is returned hither from Paris, intending for Berlin, there to give an account to the Duke his Mafter of his Negotiation in that Court.

From Amflerdam we'sre informed of the fafe arrivall at the Téxell of our Fleet from Cadiq. with their Convoy, commanded by Viceadmirall Sweers, the whole Fleet con. fifting of 4. Men of War, and 20 Merchant thips, whereof two laden with Salt milcarryed about the Cape St Vincent, the Tackle and Purniture of one of them happuly faved, but the other wholly loft, with her Men, and its other Marine s which were fent by the Viceadmiral to their affiftarge.

Paris, April 25. On Friday-last arrived here a Courier from Bruffels with an account that the Marquis de Castel Rodrigo had received new powers from the Queen Regent of Spain, by vertue w'ereof he was ready to fign the peace between both Crowns. His Majesty has also fent his Orde s to Monster Colbert at Aix la Chapelle for the figning of it there, so that the full conclusion of that weighty affaic will attend only for the Ratification by the Queen Regent, which 'tis hoped may be obteined before the end of May next enlueing.

In the mean time His Maje? y orders his forces to keep diligently upon their Quarters, and has commanded all his Officers to repair to the Frontiers, to be pre ent in their Commands and Employments upon pain of impriforment.

His Majesty is now gone to Verfailles, where he may continue till Saturday, having before his dep rture given Ortiers for the razing and demolishing of all the Fortifications and places of Atrength in the Franche Comte.

From Lille we are informed of the artival there of Monfieur de Louvoy the 17 inflant to take a view of that Garrifonwho intended in few days to pais thence to visit the other places and Forts-lately conquer'd by His Majefties Army.

The Count de Coning [mark with his Regiment being in his ile tume expected upon the Frontiers to shift His Majefly in his wars, Two Commifficients from the Council of war are ordered to attend him, and to guide him in the way demed for his March.

The Plague being broken out at Soi Jour, great care is taken by the Parliament to prevent the farther (pressing thereof, and the chief Prefidents fon ordered to be prefent in those parts, and to fee to g of watch fet in all places, that no perions be permitted to pars without a Certificate of health 3 and that the fick may not want the conveniencies of Chirurgions to take care of them, they have ordered that all young Chirurgions who shall repair thither to take care of the fick, shall at the end of the Contagion be made free of their Profession.

Bruges, April 26. We daily expect news of the arrival of Don Juan upon our Coafts. Yefterday Sir Mark d'Ognatis went from hence to Oflend by the directions of Marquis Salazar, to put all things in readinels for his reception, the Marquis himfelf with divers of the Nobility and States of Flanders continuing here, till they shall have ce tain intellist gence of h s landing.

From Aix is Chapelle we are informed that Monfieur Colbert made his publick Entry there the 23 inftant with extroordinary State, feveral other of the Pleniporentiaties may in few days, do the like, in the mean while frequent vifits pais between them, all of them conceiving great h pes of an happy and fpeedy illue of the Tr aty; especial y fince Monfieur Colbert has received Orders from the Ki σ his Matter for the figning it according to the preparatory pro ect agre 1 upon Paris.

Plymouth, April 15. A fmall Veffel of Topfam fitely arriving from the Streights inf 1ms us that the 5th inflam about 40 leagues off the Cape Fir issues, the met with the Squad on of Monsheur de Heasfort, which was cruining there, carrying out English colours; but upon her nearer approach changing them; by whom the Messer of this Vessel was called aboard, and in little time is finisfed.

Portfaouth, April 16. We are ftill haftning out our fin s to fea, the Mountague, Tyger, Monh and Briffol are neer ready, and may this week go out to Spit head, the reft are fitting up with all poffible diligence to follow them.
