

**PART III.—Competitive.****1. Knowledge of Binding.**

(Candidates must have a thorough knowledge of good work, and the materials required to produce it; they should consequently be able to detect defective work or inferior materials.)

**2. Estimating.**

(They must be able readily to calculate the quantity of paper required for any number of books, in the different sizes of folio, quarto, octavo, &c., and to cast up an account with ease.)

The competition will be decided partly by the number of marks given for answers, written or oral, to questions on the above-mentioned subjects, and partly by such testimony as the Commissioners may obtain from persons of practical experience as to the relative fitness of the Candidates.

2. A fee will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination, according to the scale laid down, under the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1879, by notice in the London Gazette of 29th April, 1881.

3. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Competitive Examination is less than 25 or more than 36.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Extra Assistant Examiner of Binding in Her Majesty's Stationery Office will be held in London on Friday, the 15th February, 1884, under the above Regulations.

A Preliminary Examination will be held in London on Tuesday, the 12th February, 1884.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to the Preliminary Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 2nd February, an "application" in the handwriting of the Candidate on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
