And whereas, in accordance with the Danube Works Loan Act (31 and 32 Vict., cap. 126), the said loan was guaranteed by Her Majesty, jointly with their Majesties the Emperor of Austria, the Emperor of the French, the King of Italy, the King of Prussia in the name of the North German Confederation, and the Emperor of the Ottomans,

Notice is hereby given, that the said loan has been entirely paid off, and that a receipt in full discharge of all claims in respect of the said loan has been signed by Messrs. Bischoffsheim and Goldschmidt, and has been deposited in the archives of the European Commission of the Danube.
