Burnley Improvement Act, 1883.

OTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Town Council, held on the 5th day of March, 1884, the Corporation made the Bylaws hereunder set forth for regulating tram cars, tram car engines, and the conduct and duties of the proprietors, drivers, and conductors thereof.—Dated this 6th day of March, 1884.

Borough of Burnley .- Tramways.

By-laws made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Burnley, acting by the Council, as the Local Authority of the said borough, under the powers conferred upon them by "The Burnley Borough Improvement Act, 1883."

Interpretation.

1. The words herein-mentioned shall be interpreted as follows:—that is to say, "Borough" shall mean the borough of Burnley; "Council" shall mean the Council of the borough of Burnley, or the Committee appointed by the Council for the purposes of these By-laws; "Proprietor" shall include any company, body, or person who shall keep any tram car, or who shall be concerned, otherwise than as a driver or conductor, in employing or supplying any tram car service; "Tram Car" shall include a tram car engine and any public vehicle used on a tramway, whether moved by animal, steam, air, gas, electricity, or any other motive power; "Conductor" shall include every person who collects passenger fares, or who attends upon passengers in or upon a tram car; "Driver" shall include every driver of a tram car, and every driver and stoker of a tram car engine; "Inspector" shall mean the person appointed by the Council as inspector of tram cars; "Tramway" shall include every tramway for passenger traffic for the time being within the borough; every word importing the singular number only shall include the plural, and every word importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine.

Commencement of By-laws.

2. These By-laws shall come into force on the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Tram Cars, Drivers, and Conductors to be Licensed.

3. No tram car shall be used on any tramway, and no person shall act as the driver or conductor of any tram car, without having been first duly licensed by the Council.

Licences.

4. The licences granted in respect of tram cars, or to drivers and conductors, shall be for such period, not exceeding twelve months, as the Council may think fit, and at a charge of not exceeding the rate for each such licence of the amount for the time being charged for licences in respect of hackney carriages and the drivers thereof.

Licence Number to be displayed.

5. The number of the licence of every tram car shall be conspicuously painted on the inside and outside of such tram car; and every driver or conductor when on duty shall wear conspicuously displayed, a badge having thereon the number of his licence.

Tram Cars to be in good condition.

6. Every tram car and all fittings, furniture, and machinery belonging thereto, shall be kept in good repair, order, and reasonably clean condition; and every animal used on a tramway shall be free from infectious or contagious disease, and fit for work. And the inspector may remove from any tramway any animal which does not comply with these respective conditions.

Advertising on Tram Cars.

7. No board, framework, article, contrivance, or thing shall be placed upon or against the outside of any tram car for the purpose of displaying any advertisement, printed bill, notice, name, letters, or number; and no foot or side board of a greater depth than twelve inches shall be placed upon or against the side of the roof of any tram car, except in each and every case with the written consent of the Council.

Lamps.

8. Every tram car shall be sufficiently and properly lighted. A lamp displaying a red light shall be placed in front of every tram car, and a lamp displaying a green light shall be placed at

the back of every tram car, adequate to signalling the approach or position thereof. All lamps to be lighted immediately after sunset and during the prevalance of a fog, and at all times when necessary for safety of other vehicles or of foot

Sitting Accommodation.

9. Sitting accommodation to the extent of at least sixteen inches from side to side, and fifteen inches from front to back, shall be provided for every person in or upon every tram car; and the inside width of every tram car shall be not less than fifty-five inches, and the height above each seat not less than forty-five inches. Inside every tram car there shall be provided proper means of ventilation, without opening any of the side windows.

Number of Passengers.

10. A notice of the number of passengers each tram car is licensed to carry inside and outside shall be kept conspicuously displayed inside and outside thereof respectively. No tram car shall carry more than its licensed number of

Fares and By-laws to be displayed.

11. A table of fares and a copy of these Bylaws shall be permanently affixed in some conspicuous situation inside every tram car, to the satisfaction of the Council; and such table and copy shall be kept legible and undefaced.

Intending Passengers.

12. Every person shall be received as a passenger in or upon any tram car, provided there be room, who shall request or desire so to be, except a person who is suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, or who is intoxicated or disorderly, or whose dress or clothing would in the opinion of the conductor be likely to soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passenger, or the linings, seats, or cushions of the tram car, or whose presence would be otherwise offensive to the passengers therein.

Passengers to be seated.

13. No passenger shall stand between any seats or elsewhere on any tram car, nor travel on any platform, or steps leading to any platform or roof of any tram car, nor sit on the outside rail or fence on the roof of any tram car.

Entering or Leaving Tram Car.

14. No person shall enter or leave a tram car whilst in motion; and no person shall enter or leave a tram car, except by the conductor's platform.

Fire-arms or Offensive Articles.

15. No person shall enter or get upon or travel in or upon any tram car with loaded fire-arms, or with any article or thing which the conductor may deem dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Dogs or other Animals.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any tram car, except by permission of the conductor, but in no case against the wish of any passenger. Any dog or other animal found in or upon a tram car may be removed therefrom by the conductor.

Musical Instruments and Singing.

17. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any tram car, sing or shout, or play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Smoking and Nuisance.

18. No passenger or other person shall smoke inside any tram car, nor commit any nuisance in, upon, or against any tram car.

Misbehaviour.

19. No passenger or other person shall quarrel with, use offensive language to, or abuse or insult, any passenger; nor abuse, insult, annoy, or impede any inspector, conductor, driver, or stoker in the execution of his duty in connexion with any tram car or tramway.

Plying for Hire.

20. No person, except the conductor or driver, shall ply for hire on any tram car. No conductor or driver shall leave his tram car whilst plying for hire, without some responsible person being left in charge of it; and no person, other than the servants of the proprietor in charge of the tram car, shall tout or solicit passengers for him.

Conduct of Conductors and Drivers.

21. Every conductor and driver of any tram car whilst on duty shall be suitably dressed, clean, sober, orderly, respectful, and attentive, and shall at all times enfore the observance of all By-laws.

Passengers' Luggage.

22. All goods, luggage, and tools of passengers shall be placed on the conductor's platform, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor.

Left Luggage.

23. Notice of all luggage and other property left in or upon any tram car shall be forthwith given to the inspector.

Stands.

24. The following shall be the stands or places of departure for tram cars, that is to say :

St. James's-street - the east side of the obelisk;

the west side of the obelisk; Church-street—in front of St. Peter's church; Colne-road—the Byerden House crossing; at

the borough boundary; Padiham-road—Gannow Lane Top; near the

Tim Bobbin Inn ;

and such other stands or places in lieu of or in addition to the above as the Council shall from time to time determine. The exact position and length of each stand or place shall be indicated by a boundary or mere stone at each end thereof.

Time for remaining on Stands.

25. No tram car shall remain at any stand or place of departure longer than six minutes previously to the time advertised for its departure. Every tram car shall start from each stand or place of departure punctually at the time advertised for starting, unless prevented by accident, stress of weather, or other unavoidable cause.

Inspector and his duties.

26. Such person as the Council may appoint shall be the inspector of all tram cars, and shall see that these By-laws are duly observed; and every proprietor, driver, and conductor shall comply with the reasonable orders and directions of such inspector as to matters in relation to these By-laws or any Act of Parliament relating to tramways and tram cars; and no proprietor, driver, or conductor, or other person, shall hinder or obstruct him in the execution of his duties, or shall refuse to comply with such orders or directions; and no driver or conductor of a tram car shall, without reasonable excuse, neglect or refuse to stop such tram car when requested or desired by the inspector.

Regulations of Council.

27. The Council may, from time to time, make such regulations as they think fit for enforcing order and avoiding danger at the stands or places of departure, and of taking up or setting down passengers.

Copy of By-laws.

28. Every conductor on duty shall carry a printed copy of these By-laws, and shall on the request of any passenger produce the same for perusal.

Penalties.

29. Any proprietor, conductor, driver, passenger, or other person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these By-laws, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings, but the Justice or Court before whom any penalty may be sought to be recovered may order the whole or any part of such penalty to be paid, or may remit the whole penalty.
