By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Eton, in the county of Buckingham, as is situate to the westward and north-westward of the Windsor Branch Railway; and also so much of the parish of Burnham and hamlet of Boveney as is situate within one hundred yards of the boundary of the parish of Eton aforesaid, —which was declared by Order of Council dated the sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas so far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

Liberty of the Isle of Ely.—The parish of Stan-ground, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

Cumberland.—In the counties of Westmorland and Cumberland, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the bridge over the river Eamont and the east side of the road to the Crown Hotel at Eamont Bridge, from there to a point opposite Southwaite Green Mill, following the south side of the road leading from Eamont to Yanwath to a field called Sutton Field adjoining the said road and now in the occupation of Mr. John Hodgson, thence along the outside north-west boundary of the lands occupied by the said John Hodgson and Lord Brougham and Vaux, thence in a direct line to Hughs Crag Bridge, thence along the north side of the London and North-Western Railway and of the Eden Valley Railway to the Bridge over the Railway at Weatheriggs Tillery, from the said Bridge on the north-west corner of the Plantation of Lord Hothfield called Leicet Wood, thence along the wall of the field of Mr. Richard Richardson to Whin-fell Great Wood, thence following the stone wall dividing the farms of Mr. Richard Richardson and Mr. Thomas Mitchell to a point where Mr. Hutchinson's farm comes in, thence by a fence which divides the farms of Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Hutchinson to the main-road called the Temple Sowerby-road, crossing the main-road and on by the fence dividing the said

farms to the river Eamont, thence along the river Eamont, thence crossing the Eamont opposite the east side of the Plantation of Lord Lonsdale called Dasons Scar, thence by the stone wall dividing Frenchfield and Sceugh farms to the Edenhall-road, thence by the south side of the said road to the village of Carleton, thence following the south side of the road leading from Carleton to Eamont Bridge.

Essex.—(1.) The whole of Claybury Park, in the parish of Chigwell, in the county of Essex.

(2.) At Chigwell Row, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane down the same to the footpath leading to Hainault-road, thence along Hainault-road to the boundary of Chigwell parish, thence along the said boundary to J. Savill's house, and from thence to the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane aforesaid, including therein the main-road leading from the said Vicarage-lane to the Barking Side-road.

(3.) At Loughton, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Loughton Signal Box on the Great Eastern Railway, thence along the said Railway to the boundary of the parish of Chigwell, thence by the boundary of the parishes of Chigwell and Loughton to the Epping New-road, thence along the said road to a lane known as Mud-lane, thence along the said lane to the Upper Park-road, thence along the said road to and along the Lower Park-road and Meadow-road to the Signal Box aforesaid.

(4.) At Thoydon Mount, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Gravel Pit-lane, along Bitchett Wood to Mr. Merriday's house on the east, thence along the road towards Thoydon-Garmon to Horns Green-lane on the south, thence along the said Horns Green-lane to Gaynes Park corner on the west, and thence along Gravel Pit-lane by Nobbs cottages to the Bitchett Wood aforesaid.

(5.) At Waltham Holy Cross, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the end of Wood Green-road, along the same to the Potteries, then taking the footpath by the side of the Potteries to the White House in Honey-lane, then in a straight line across the fields to the Keeper's Lodge, thence to the parish cottages and the boundary of Epping Forest following the said boundary to Wood Green-road aforesaid.

(6.) At North Weald Bassett, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Mr. Pegram's Beer-house at Weald Gullett, taking the fence on the left hand side of the high-road leading from Epping to Ongar to the Blacksmith's shop at Tylers Green Cross, thence along and including the road to the Rectory-lane near the Church, and from thence along the Church-path through Mr. Law's fields to Mr. Pegram's Beer-house aforesaid.

(7.) At Epping Upland, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Boldings brook on the Epping Green-road on the west, thence along

the Garden fence on the right of the Epping Green-road to the fence adjoining Mr. Cripps, thence along the top of Ellis field to Great Hanplead field on the north, thence to the right by Gibbons spring to Boldings brook on the east, and from thence along the brook to the Epping Green-road aforesaid.

(8.) In the parish of Nazeing, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the side of the navigable river Lea, thence on the right hand side of the occupation-road there, along the same over the private-road leading to Broxbourne Gate, thence continuing the said occupation-road along the right hand side to the point where a cart-way joins, thence along the right hand side of the said cart-way to the said river Lea, thence along the side of the said river to the commencing point aforesaid.

(9.) In the parish of Loughton, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the Lamp Post at Church Hill, along Church-lane to the fields, thence in a straight line across the same to Chigwell-lane, along the west side of the same to Mr. Maitland's gate, through the old-road to the old Church, thence down the lane by Mr. Bottle's farm in a line to England-lane, along the same to the high-road and the east side of the same to Church Hill aforesaid.

(10.) At Waltham Holy Cross, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Brett's Corner on the Nazeing-road, north side of Holy Field-lane to the third field, thence in a line over the fields to the road leading from Broxbourne to the Coach and Horses Public-house, along the same crossing the Nazeing-road and over the fields to the top of Gullely Hill Green, along the same and the Green-lane to the Keeper's House, and past the same through Mr. Colvin's field to Brett's Corner aforesaid.

(11.) The whole of the parish of Bradwell-near-the-Sea, in the county of Essex.

Hampshire.—So much of the parishes of Winnall, Easton, Chilcombe, St. Peter Cheesehill, and St. John, within the petty sessional division of Winchester, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the river Itchen from the point of the county boundary opposite Winnall Church, running in a northerly direction to the boundary of the parishes of Winnall and Easton, thence in an easterly direction across certain arable fields and the road leading from Winnall to Easton, and the road called Long Walk into the road leading from the village of Easton into the London and Winchester-road at a point eight hundred yards or thereabouts to the north of the farm buildings at Lark-whistle farm, thence in a southerly direction by the said road on the east into and across the aforesaid London and Winchester-road, thence in a southerly direction across the Valley into the Petersfield-road, thence in a westerly direction along the northern side of the said road to the line of the city boundary near Chilcombe Lodge, thence in a northerly direction across the road called East Hill near the Lime Works and following the same boundary line crossing the aforesaid London and Winchester-road, and terminating at the aforesaid point in the river Itchen opposite to Winnall Church.

Hertfordshire.—The whole of that part of Ivor Hall farm, Barnet Gate, in the county of Hertford, in the occupation of George Elliott, which is in Elstree parish.

Leicestershire.—(1.) The whole of the parish of Somerby, in the county of Leicester.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Prestwold, in the county of Leicester.

Lincolnshire (Lindsey).—(1.) The whole of the parish of Newton-on-Trent, in the petty sessional division of Lincoln, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Stickford, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

(3.) So much of the parish of Croxby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the parishes of Rothwell, and Cuxwold, on the south-west the road leading from Rothwell to Croxby, on the south-east the road leading from Thoresway to Beelsby, and on the north-east the road leading from Thorganby to Swallow; the said roads not being included in the Area.

(4.) So much of the parish of West Halton, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road leading from West Halton to Alkborough, on the east the road leading from West Halton to Winterton, on the south the road leading from West Halton to Coleby, and on the west the parish of Alkborough; none of the said roads except the said road leading from West Halton to Winterton being included in the Area.

(5.) In the parish of West Torrington, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, bounded on the north by lands occupied by Messrs. Brown, Adams, and Gurnell, on the south by lands occupied by Mr. W. Allis (including his farmstead) and the road leading from West Torrington to Wragby, on the east by lands occupied by Messrs. Sharpley, Epton, Rowson, Gurnell, and Gregson, and on the west by lands occupied by Mr. Bennard; including such parts of all the roads as intercept the before-named lands, or any of them.

Shropshire.—(1.) At Cheney Longville, in the county of Salop, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the fence of the north side of the footpath leading from the Church at Wistanstow, crossing the Shrewsbury and Ludlow main-road near Strefford Cottage into Strefford, the south side of the highway from Strefford through Dinchope to Greenway Cross, the north side of the main-road from Greenway Cross to Chinsford Bridge, along the east side of the stream to Newington footbridge, cross the stream thence along the south side of the lane to the corner by the Railway Cottages, cross the main-road to the Blacksmith's Shop, along the south fence to the level crossing of the Railway, across the Railway to the Cottage and by the west fence of the Railway to Aston-on-Clun-road, along the north side of this road to Aston-on-Clun, the east side of the highway, thence through Hopesay to Edgton and to Horderley Railway-station, and to the junction of the road at Horderley Hollow, and along the south fence of the road through Woolstone to Wistanstow Church.

(2.) All that portion of the county of Salop comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the eastern side of the Newport and

Wolverhampton-road from the county boundary at the crossing of the Watling Street, through Tong to the Bridge under the Great Western Railway at Donington, and along the northern side of the Great Western Railway to the county boundary near Beamish Wood.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Madagascar, transmitting a Decree relative to quarantine issued by the French Commander-in-Chief at Tamatave, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

TAMATAVE.—DECREE.

The Sanitary Council having heard the Commander-in-Chief of Tamatave and the State of Siege : decrees—

ART. 1. Until further orders, vessels and goods from Fenoarivo will be subjected to a quarantine of observation for ten days.

ART. 2. Every vessel coming from sea without a bill of health, wherever she may come from, will be subjected to a quarantine of the like duration.

ART. 3. Vessels in quarantine shall be anchored to the north of Point Tanio, at an anchorage that will be pointed out to them—their small boats shall be hoisted up.

ART. 4. Consignees who may have provisions or medicines to furnish to their vessels during the period in question, must have them put on board the "Creuse."

ART. 5. Vessels in quarantine shall by night always have a light at the head of the mizen-mast. In case of urgent need of assistance they shall by day put their flag awaft (en berne), and during the night place a light at the head of each mast.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Privy Council Office a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Callao upon the subject of quarantine at that port, from which the following is an extract :—

"It has been ordered that no person shall be allowed to go on board merchant vessels entering before such vessels have been visited by the medical officer duly appointed for that purpose; that no merchant vessel, no matter where she may come from or what flag she may be under, shall be exempt from such hygienic visit; that no merchant vessel coming from a suspected port shall come to an anchor in the bay until she shall have been boarded and examined by the above-mentioned port doctor; that all merchant vessels from foreign countries are required to produce a bill of health viséd at the ports or places where they may have touched during transit, by the Consuls of the Peruvian Republic, or where such

do not exist, by those of a friendly nation; that vessels arriving unprovided with such bills of health are subject to the quarantine regulations of the port which include the infliction of a heavy penalty."
