WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Matthew, situate within the limits of the new parish, (some time particular district) of Saint Mary Preston, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthew situate as aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Preston which is described in the schedule hereunder

written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Matthew situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Matthew Preston.’

“And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Matthew situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Saint Matthew Preston, being:—

“All that part of the new parish (some time particular district) of Saint Mary Preston in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the south-west and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Preston from the new parish of Saint Luke Preston in the county and diocese aforesaid at the point where Ribbleton-lane is joined by Wilbraham-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Newhall-lane and extending thence southward diagonally across the last-named lane to its junction with Rutland-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with a proposed new street and extending thence southward diagonally

across such proposed street to its junction with Fishwick-lane and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point at the Pinfold where the said lane bends towards the south and is joined by the private footpath leading from Fishwick Bottoms and extending thence that is from the last-described point south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Preston from the district of Ribbleton in the county and diocese aforesaid (which boundary also forms part of the eastern boundary of the Parliamentary borough of Preston) strikes the stream which flows through Dark Wood to the River Ribble.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Chad situate at West Coseley in the district parish of Coseley in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said

district parish of Coseley, and of the parish of Sedgley in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such district parish and parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said district parish of Coseley, and of the said parish of Sedgley should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Chad situate at West Coseley as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Dalrymple Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said district parish of Coseley, and with the consent of the Right Honourable William Earl of Dudley patron of the vicarage of the parish of Sedgley aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent, that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said district parish of Coseley and of the said parish of Sedgley which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Chad situate at West Coseley aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Chad West Coseley.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Chad West Coseley, consisting of:—

"I. All that portion of the district parish of Coseley in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield which is bounded on part of the north-west and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Coseley from the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Sedgley in the county and diocese aforesaid at the point where Ivy House-road is joined by Coppice-road and by the footpath leading to Upper Etingshall and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said Ivy House-road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction at Fullard's End with Tunnel-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Castle-street and with Bayer-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts thereby crossing over the line of the London and North-Western Railway, to the junction of the said Bayer-street with Bridge-street and extending thence in a direction rather more southerly along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Male-lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts; thereby again crossing over the line

of railway aforesaid, to the centre of Walbrook Bridge which carries the said last-named lane over the Birmingham Canal and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said district parish of Coseley from the particular district of Saint Matthew Tipton in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the district parish of Coseley aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the part of the north-west and upon the north-east as aforesaid that is to say upon the east upon the south and upon the remaining part of the north-west as follows upon the east by the particular district of Saint Matthew Tipton aforesaid upon the south by the hereinafter-described portion of the parish of Sedgley in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining portion of the north-west by the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Sedgley aforesaid.

And also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Sedgley aforesaid which is bounded on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Sedgley from the parish of Sedgley aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries Brook-road over Turley's Brook, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Tipton-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the private road which leads to High Arcell Farm and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the public footpath leading to Eve-lane Upper Gornal and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Sedgley from the new parish of Saint Peter Upper Gornal in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Sedgley aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the west as aforesaid that is to say upon the south upon the east, and upon the north as follows, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Peter Upper Gornal aforesaid upon the east by the particular district of Saint Matthew Tipton aforesaid and upon the north partly by the hereinbefore described portion of the district parish of Coseley aforesaid and partly by the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Sedgley aforesaid."

"I. All that portion of the new parish (some-time district chapelry) of Christ Church Worthing in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester which is bounded on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Worthing from the hereinafter described portion of the parish of Broadwater in the county and diocese aforesaid at the point where Teville-road is joined by Victoria-road North and by Victoria-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Richmond-road and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Crescent-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Montague-street and with the street or road called or known as West-buildings and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street or road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Marine-parade and continuing thence still in precisely the same direction and in a straight line across the said parade to the southern boundary of the said new parish of Christ Church Worthing upon the seashore. And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester. *C. (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 24th day of April, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Somerby, in the county of Leicester, —which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of that part of Ivor Hall farm, Barnet Gate, in the county of Hertford, in the occupation of George Elliott, which is in Elstree parish, —which was declared by Order of Council dated the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Austrian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz.:

CIRCULAR of the Imperial and Royal Maritime Government to all Harbour and other Maritime Officers and Functionaries.

By a Decree of the Minister of Commerce of Austria, acting in concert with the Hungarian Minister of Commerce, the Maritime Government gives notice in a telegram, dated this day:—

"That all the precautionary measures, in consequence of the outbreak of cholera, still in force against persons arriving from the East, are hereby suppressed.

"The present law is applied to vessels arriving from the East and now subjected to examination in Austrian ports.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of Quarantine Regulations issued by the Government of the Cape of Good Hope, which are as follows:—

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.—No. 265, 1884.

His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased in terms of sub-section 4, section XXVI. of the "Public Health Act, 1883," to make the subjoined regulations concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection.

REGULATIONS framed under the provisions of Sub-Section 4, Section XXVI. of the "Public Health Act, 1883."

1. When a vessel has been placed in quarantine all letters, papers, and other mail matter before being landed shall be carefully and thoroughly fumigated with sulphur at the gangway in the presence of the Health Officer.

2. The master of any vessel in quarantine is required to isolate the sick as much as possible until they shall be removed to a lazaret.

3. He shall afford every facility to the Superintendent of the quarantine station for landing the passengers and the crew and the sick, and their baggage together with such provisions as may be required for use on shore.

4. After the sick have been landed and removed to the lazaret, the healthy portion of the crew and passengers may be landed and located on a portion of the quarantine ground apart from the lazaret, or they may remain on board the vessel; but in

the event of any fresh case of disease breaking out the patient shall at once be conveyed to the lazaret on shore, and if necessary the clothes and bedding belonging to such patient shall be destroyed.

5. The Superintendent shall not permit any communication whatever to take place between the patients or their attendants in the lazaret and the healthy portion of the passengers and crew.

6. He shall not permit any one to land at or to have any communication with the quarantine station, and he shall give notice that any letters which persons in quarantine may wish to send to their friends must be delivered to him for the purpose of being fumigated.

7. The medical officer in charge of the lazaret shall keep a diary, which must be written up daily, and a medical register containing a history of every case of disease with the treatment employed, and a daily entry of the diet and extras prescribed. He will be required to aid the Superintendent in maintaining order and discipline.

8. He shall cause the patients labouring under different descriptions of disease to be placed in separate wards as far as practicable.

9. The appointment of nurses and attendants will rest with him, and he will see that order and cleanliness are observed by the patients and attendants.

10. He will communicate with the Superintendent of the quarantine station once in each day, in the forenoon, when it will be expected that he will have his requisition prepared for any article he may require, as also his report on the state of the patients.

11. It will be his duty to see that the hospital linen and clothing are carefully washed, and that no dirty or soiled clothes, particularly those belonging to deceased persons, are allowed to remain longer than may be absolutely necessary before being cleansed or destroyed.

12. No bed-linen or articles of wearing apparel used by sick persons on board a vessel in quarantine shall under any circumstances be permitted to be taken on shore for the purpose of being washed, but must either be washed on board or destroyed by fire.

13. The bodies of persons dying either on board a vessel in quarantine or at the quarantine station on shore, shall be buried as soon as possible in coffins or shells filled with lime.

14. Before the embarkation of the persons entrusted to his charge the Superintendent shall cause the whole of the buildings and tents to be carefully cleansed and disinfected.

15. Any person found wilfully damaging any of the buildings, tents, or other Government property shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

16. Should more than one vessel be placed in quarantine at the same time the people of one vessel shall not be allowed to communicate with those of another, but they shall be restricted to the boundaries which shall have been allotted to each of them.

17. Worcester Tramways.—By-Laws and Regulations.

1. The By-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars using any tramway within the city of Worcester, and to the drivers and conductors of such cars, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1881, and the Worcester Tramways Order, 1881, to make By-laws and Regulations.

*Conductor.*

2. The expression "Conductor" shall include any office or servant having charge of a car.

*Rate of Speed.*

3. The driver of every car shall drive the same at a rate not less than 6 miles, and not more than 8 miles, in the hour upon the average.

*Distance between Cars, &c.*

4. The driver of every car shall drive the same so that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 100 yards along any portion of the line of tramway.

Every car shall be so driven that the horses, or first horse in the case of more than one, shall be kept at least 10 yards from the vehicle in front of it.

*Stopping of Cars.*

5. Every driver or conductor shall stop the car when any passenger is desirous of leaving the same, and when any person for whom there is room is desirous of travelling by the car, and when required by any police officer. No car shall stop within 20 yards of another car on a parallel line of tramways, or so as to obstruct any street crossing, and no driver or conductor shall by loitering or stopping, needlessly or otherwise, impede the traffic of the street in which any tramway is laid. If at any time a block occurs in the ordinary traffic in any street, any car in such street shall either stop running or move in such direction as may be necessary to relieve such block in the traffic. No car shall stand in or at the Cross for more than five minutes.

*Sunday Traffic.*

6. No car shall be driven or used on any part of any tramway on Sunday, except during the times following, that is to say:—

Before the hour of eleven o'clock A.M., and

Between the hours of five o'clock P.M. and half-past six o'clock P.M., and between the hours of eight o'clock P.M. and ten o'clock P.M.

*Copy of By-Laws.*

7. The conductor of each car shall carry with him a copy of these By-Laws, and shall on request of any passenger produce the same to and shall permit the same to be perused by such passenger, and a copy of the same for the use of the public shall be affixed and kept affixed in every car.

*Penalties.*

8. Any driver or conductor of a car, or other person who offends against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in case of the continuance of such

offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which such offence continues.
