Vienna, February 16. The Letters from N. Ja of the 29th of the last Month, tell us. That they work day and night on the Fortifications of that place, which are already confiderably advanced. That great Supplies of Polytions and Ammunition had been fone thinner from Bolygade. That General Petersuic had sufficiently provided for the Security of the neighbouring Gardons; and had

fent an Officer to Widin, to receive the 1500 Horses which the Prince and States of Valachia are to furnish, according to their late Agreement with Prince Louis of Badin, for remounting the Imperial Cavalry. That they were not Turks, but Hungarians and Arnotes, that fell upon the Garison of Kazanecke, and cut most of them in pieces. And that a German Officer, who had made his Escape, reported, That the Prince of Hanouer, Colonel Straffer, and Giveral other Officers that were thought to have been and several other Officers that were thought to have been and several other Officers that were thought to have been killed, were Prisoners, and in the hands of the Turks. Fresh Advices from the Frontiers of Valachia say, That General Henster had quitted Bagarest, the Capital City of that Province, and was retired with the Imperial Troops (whose Quarters on that side lay too open to the Tartars) towards the Frontiers of Transstvania, where he had ordered them to Encamp.
