THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative in Egypt:—

"Cairo, 25th June, 1884.—Quarantine Board has decided to admit to free pratique in Egypt regularly commissioned mail steamers and ships of war, not transporting troops, leaving Bombay and Calcutta on and after 25th June; decided also to apply regulation quarantine to all arrivals from the Mediterranean ports of France."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid:—

"June 26th, 1884.—Madrid Board of Health much alarmed at reported outbreak of cholera at Toulon; all vessels from France and Gibraltar declared subject to quarantine irrespective of dates of departure; the Board is considering precautions taken in England with regard to vessels from infected ports, with a view to imposing quarantine on vessels from British ports if they consider those precautions insufficient."
