Saint Faith situate in the parish of Saint Anne | road called or known as Saint John's Hill and Wandsworth in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the new parish of Saint John Battersea in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the said new parish of Saint John Battersea should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Faith situate in the said parish of Saint Anne, Wandsworth as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester with the consent of Elizabeth Du Buisson of Heathfield, Wandsworth Common in the said county of Surrey Spinster the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and with the consent of the Reverend John Erskine Clarke, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Battersea and as such vicar or incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint John Battersea aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the said new parish of Saint John Battersea which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Faith situate in the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Faith Wandsworth."

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

" The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Faith Wandsworth, consisting of :-

" I. All that portion of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester, wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth from the parish of All Saints Wandsworth in the county and diocese aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries Highstreet Wandsworth over the River Wandle and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said High-street for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as East Hill and continuing thence still eastward along the middle of the lastnamed road for a distance of thirty-seven and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary at or near to the junction of the same road with the

Saint Anne s-road which boundary divides the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth from the new parish of Saint John Battersea in the county and diocese aforesaid.

" All which said hereinbefore described portion of the said parish of Saint Anne, Wandsworth is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the south as aforesaid that is to say, upon the east, upon the north and upon the west as follows, upon the east and north by the said new parish of Saint John Battersea and upon the west by the parish of All Saints Wandsworth aforesaid, that is to say by the River Wandle

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint John Battersea which is bounded on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Battersea from the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth aforesaid at a point on the northern side of the Windsor Line of the London and South-Western Railway at the middle of the north western end of the railway arch which is situate at a distance of two chains and eighty links or thereabouts to the south-west of the southeastern end of John-street, and extending thence that is from the said railway arch north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where the road which passes in front of the houses called or known as Mozart-terrace, joins New Eltringhamstreet, and continuing thence still north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with York-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Jews'-row, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts to its north-western end on the bank of the River Thames, and continuing thence still in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the boundary in the middle of the last-named river, which boundary divides the said county of Surrey and the diocese of Rochester aforesaid from the county of Middlesex and from the diocese of London.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of Saint John Battersea aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the north-east as aforesaid that is to say upon the north, upon the west and upon the south as follows upon the north by the said boundary in the middle' of the River Thames upon the west by the River Wandle that is to say partly by the new parish of Saint Stephen Wandsworth in the said county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester aforesaid and partly by the parish of All Saints Wandsworth aforesaid and upon the south by the Windsor Line of the London and South Western Railway aforesaid, that is to say by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said' representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the
