

Csifte, March 10. On Saturday last arrived here Major-General Scraivenmore from Ireland. There has not happened any Action since that at Cusack. Twelve of the Irish Officers, and many Soldiers that were taken there, are brought Prisoners to Cappelkerry. Four hundred Dragoons landed on Tuesday last at Belfast from Watcher-wood. And on Friday last and yesterday there sailed from Hightown about 80 Vessels with 3000 British Foot; and the rest that are now here, are preparing to march to Hightown, where Ships and Provisions are ready for them.

Portsmouth, March 11. On Friday last came to Spithead Their Majesties Ship the *Suffolk* from the Eastward. And this day sailed out of this Harbor the *York* and *Devonshire*.
