(SWINE-FEVER.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 1st day of September, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Northwich, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Acton Bridge over the river Weaver by road to the junction with the Runcorn and Northwich high-road, thence by the said highroad and the road leading through Cogshall and Comberbach to Warrington high-road at Great Budworth, thence by the said high-road through Lostock-Gralam to the Cheshire Lines Railway, thence by the said Railway to Northwich Railway Station, thence by the Northwich and Middlewich Railway to Billinge Green Railway Bridge, thence by the road through Davenham village to the river Weaver at Hartford Bridge, thence by the river Weaver to the London and North-Western Railway Viaduct, thence by the said Railway Line to Acton Station, and thence by the road leading from Acton Station through Acton village by Old Green Hall to Acton Bridge aforesaid, which was declared by Order of Council dated the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at St. Thomas, to the effect that the quarantine measures adopted against arrivals from Europe have been extended to arrivals from North Africa, and that ships arriving from English and French Windward Islands, having direct or indirect communication by steamers with Europe, are to undergo quarantine till three days have passed since last communication with shore. A quarantine of fourteen days, to be reckoned from the date of departure, has also been established against vessels arriving from or having touched at the Island of St. Lucia.

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH NO. 15.

THE quarantine ordered by Ordinance No. 14, of the 20th instant, shall likewise be applied to vessels arriving at the Islands of Sicily and Sardinia, from the French ports in the Mediterranean, Algeria, and the Regency of Tunis.

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH No. 16. In consequence of cholera having broken out in the city of Spezia the Minister of the Interior decrees as follows :-

ART. 1. Vessels leaving Spezia from the 22nd August shall be subjected in other ports of the Italian Continent to a preventive observation of ten days if the journey has been made without sickness, and to a rigorous observation of twenty days if on the voyage they have had cases of cholera, or even simply suspicious cases.

ART. 2. Similarly, if the vessels go to Sardinia or Sicily, they shall be subjected to the quarantine as ordered by Ordinances Nos, 10 and 14 of June 20 and August 20 last.

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH No. 17. The Minister of the Interior:

With reference to the Law of March 20, 1865, cap. C. on Public Health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871:

Decrees:

The quarantine regulations ordered by Ordinances Nos. 10, 14, 15, and 16 of the 30th of June, and the 20th, 22nd, and 23rd instant, for those vessels going to the Islands of Sicily and Sardinia, will be applied on and after to-day's date to vessels going to the Island of Elba from the Italian continental shores, and also to vessels arriving from French Mediterranean ports, from Algeria, and the Regency of Tunis, which may be going to Elba.

The quarantine station assigned for ships destined for Elba, where they may undergo quarantine, except in the cases in which they are obliged or able to complete it in a lazzaretto or in harbours of the first class, is that of Porto Santo Stefano.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces of the kingdom are charged with the execution of this Ordinance. (For the Minister)

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Monte Video, dated 26th July last, containing the following information:—

1. Vessels proceeding from Toulon and Marseilles and arriving here after being less than forty days at sea, will be absolutely excluded from the ports of this territory as long as cholera shall continue to show itself at the above-named harbours.

This rule will apply to vessels coming from any and every harbour where cholcra has declared itself.

- 2. Vessels having passed more than forty days at sea without any serious illness on board, and which shall be in a satisfactory hygienic condition as to cleanliness, nature of cargo, &c., will have to undergo rigorous inspection, and will not be admitted to free communication till after the passengers and crew shall have been personally passed in review.
- 3. Vessels proceeding from other ports of the Mediterranean, as well as those from the Atlantic ports of France and Spain, will have to undergo a detention of forty-eight hours, and to fulfil the conditions specified in the forcer Article.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburgh, announcing that the Minister of the Interior has issued an order to the effect that all persons arriving in Russia from France and Italy must be provided with certificates from Russian Consular Officers that they have not been at any of the infected localities within three weeks of their departure for Russia. All kinds of old rags, body linen, and bed linen, as also clothes in use, are not to be admitted unless they have been disinfected abroad. The above order comes into force from the 15-27th August, 1884.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Buenos Ayres inclosing a resolution adopted by

the National Health Department, of which the

following is a translation:—

1st. Vessels arriving fron Toulon and Marseilles and having occupied a period less than forty days in their passage shall not be admitted in the ports of the Republic, pending the prevalence of the

disease in question at those places.

This regulation shall be enforced as regards vessels proceeding from every port which shall be

invaded by the cholera morbus.

2nd. Vesssels employing more than forty days on their passage without any novelty arising on board of them, and whose sanitary condition in general (cleanliness, description of cargo, &c.) may be satisfactory, shall be amenable to strict inspection, and shall only be admitted to free pratique after a minute inspection of their passengers and crews.

3rd. Should it result from the ship's papers, or from the health visit, that positive or suspicious cases of cholera have occurred during the passage, they shall be subjected to strict quarantine for fifteen days, to be reckoned from the period of the disappearance of the abnormal conditions and

of the disinfection of the vessel.

4th. Vessels arriving from other points of the Mediterranean, as well as those from the Atlantic sea board of France or Spain, shall be subjected to quarantine observation for forty-eight hours, should they be under the conditions set forth in Article II.

5th. The regulations embraced in Article III shall be applied to vessels arriving from the Mediterranean, in the event of positive or of suspicious cases having occurred during their passage, or subsequent to their arrival in port.

6th. The quarantine for passengers shall be performed on board of the vessels themselves, and that for merchandize in launches, in the usual

way.

7th. All regulations emanating from this Department, and which are embraced in Ordinances of prior date, remain in force, provided that they are not in opposition to the present one.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. 41 Viet., c. 16, s. 53.

OVERTIME—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.

Order of Secretary of State, Extending Special

Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M. and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

(1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and

(2.) Any such young person or woman shall temporar not be so employed on the whole for more ditional:

than 5 days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months:

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section:

And whereas Part Two of the same Act, Section 63, provides as follows:

Where it appears to a Secretary of State that the adoption of any special means or provision for the cleanliness or ventilation of a factory or workshop is required for the protection of the health of any child, young person, or woman employed, in pursuance of an exception under this part of this Act, either for a longer period than is otherwise allowed by this Act, or at night, he may by order made under this part of this Act direct that the adoption of such means or provision shall be a condition of such employment:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the parts of the non-textile factories of the classes mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorised by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby, provided that it be subject to the condition herein-after appearing.

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly: Provided that it shall be a condition of the employment of any young person or woman under this extended exception that there shall be a cubic space of at least four hundred feet for every young person and woman so employed.

This Order shall come into effect on 2nd September, 1884, and shall continue in force until revoked.

And whereas this special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section:

And whereas the said Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, section 65, contains a provision (2) that any order extending an exception may be temporary or permanent, conditional or unconditional:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that the non-textile factories of the classes mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, by reason of the customs and exigencies of the trades carried on therein, require the extension thereto of this exception: Provided that the period of employment on Saturdays shall end as follows:

If not less than one hour is allowed for meals shall end at one o'clock in the afternoon as regards employment in any manufacturing process, and at half-past one o'clock in the afternoon as regards employment for any purpose whatever; and if less than one hour is allowed for meals shall end at half an hour after noon as regards employment in any manufacturing process, and at one o'clock in the afternoon as regards employment for any purpose whatever.

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend the said exception to factories and workshops of such classes.

This Order shall come into effect on 2nd September, 1884, and shall continue in force until revoked.
