THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Swine-Fever (Infected Circles) Order of 1884 (in this Order referred to as the Circles Order), do direct and order, and it is hereby directed and ordered, as follows:

1. The Circles Order shall, from the dates mentioned in Article 2 of this Order, apply and extend to and be in force in the Districts mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall continue to apply and extend to and be in force in those Districts until the Privy Council by further Special Order direct and order.

2.—(1.) The provisions of Article 5 (*Power to Local Authority to make Regulations*) of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such Districts from the date of this Order.

(2.) Except as aforesaid, the provisions of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such Districts from and immediately after the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of the Cyprus Gazette of the 15th August, 1884, containing the following notices:—

Quarantine.—Cholera in Italy.

UNDER the powers vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," and in consequence of the outbreak of cholera in Italy, His Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that—

1. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus, except Larnaca, from any part of Italy, without having performed quarantine at an intermediate port, shall be repelled.

2. All arrivals at Larnaca from any part of Italy shall undergo a quarantine of eleven clear days.

3. Passengers' baggage and merchandize must be landed in quarantine to undergo the disinfection considered necessary. Rags are to be repelled; non-susceptible merchandize shall not be liable to quarantine.

4. Mails will be landed in quarantine, disinfected, and delivered to the postal authorities with the greatest possible despatch. Mails from other countries arriving through Italy in the proper quarantine cases shall be landed in quarantine, emptied into clean bags, and handed at once to the postal authorities.

Quarantine.—Cholera in France.

WITH reference to Notification No. 5, in Gazette No. 138 of the 2nd instant, the Government of Malta has expressed its willingness to accept, in respect of passengers from Cyprus, a certificate from the Commissioner at the port from whence they come, there being no British Consuls in Cyprus.

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH, No. 18.

THE Minister of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20th, 1865, cap. C., on Public Health, decrees:

In the interest of public safety, the coral fishery on the banks in the near neighbourhood of Sicily is closed for this year.

Within five days from to-day's date the boats employed in coral fishing must leave the bank and return to their own homes.

The Prefects of Trapani and Girgenti are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

**1884.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH,
No. 19.**

THE Minister of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20, cap. C, on Public Health, and the Ministerial Instructions of December 26,

1871, and to the Ordinances Nos. 10, 14, 15, and 16 of the 30th of June, and the 20th, 22nd, and 23rd of August last, decrees:

The measures of quarantine prescribed by the above-mentioned Ordinances will be applied on and after to-day's date to ship's arriving from France, Algeria, the Regency of Tunis, the coast of the district of Levante (Spezia), and the rest of the Italian coast, bound for any of the Italian islands.

The Prefects of the Kingdom are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

**1884.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH,
No. 20.**

IN consequence of the appearance of cholera at Naples—

The Minister of the Interior decrees as follows:—

ART. 1. Vessels from this day forward quitting the ports and roadsteads of the coasts of the Gulf of Naples between the lazaretto of Nisida and the Port of Portici, including this latter, shall be admitted at all other places along continental Italy, after a quarantine of observation for ten days, if they have had a passage without sickness, or a rigorous quarantine for twenty-one days if there has been a case or suspected case of cholera on board.

ART. 2. Vessels coming from the above place to all the Italian Islands shall be subjected to the preventive treatment ordered by Ordinances Nos. 10, 14, 15, 16, and 17, of June 30, and August 20, 22, 23, and 26 last.

ART. 3. The rigorous quarantine mentioned above shall either be passed in the preventive stations of Gaeta and St. Stefano, or at the lazarets of Nisida and Varignano, which for this purpose have been isolated both on the sea and on the land side.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, inclosing the following translation of an Ordinance which has been issued by the Italian Government respecting quarantine on arrivals from Spanish Mediterranean Ports:—

**1884.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH,
No. 21.**

Official information having been received of the appearance of cholera at Alicante and other places in Spain:

The Minister of the Interior decrees.

ART. 1. Vessels having quitted the ports and roadsteads of the Mediterranean coasts of Spain on and after the 1st of September shall, on their arrival at the Italian dominions, be subjected to the preventive treatment ordered in Ordinance No. 20 of the 2nd instant, according as they are destined for the peninsula or for the islands.

ART. 2. Until new order, the importation into the kingdom, of rags, tatters, old unwashed clothes, used bedding, fringes, lint, bones, hoofs, animal remains, and manures is prohibited.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at San José, Costa Rica, dated 6th August last, stating that full quarantine regulations are in force in Costa Rican ports as affecting arrivals from European ports, and that among the measures which it is deemed should be adopted in order to prevent the spread of Asiatic cholera now prevailing in France, Government opines that until such plague disappear, all vessels arriving from European ports should present a bill of health viséd by the Costa Rican Consul at the port of departure.

The said Consul being called upon to notify all masters of vessels that they are called upon to hoist, on arrival at any Costa Rican port, a white or yellow flag, according as they may or may not have a clean bill of health.
