**E**ARL GRANVILLE, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received the following Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Shanghai, relative to a Notification issued by the French Consul-General at Shanghai, declaring that no action will be taken by France at Shanghai or Woosung.

**MY LORD,** *Shanghai, August 29, 1884.*

I HAVE the honour to forward to your Lordship copy of a Despatch which I have addressed to Her Majesty's Minister at Peking relative to announcements made by French and Chinese officials at this port that Shanghai and Woosung are intended to be outside the range of hostilities during the existing conflict between France and China.

Consul-General Hughes to Sir H. Parkes.

**SIR,** *Shanghai, August 27, 1884.*

I HAVE the honour to inclose translation of a Notification published in Chinese by the French Consul-General, announcing that no action will be taken by France at Shanghai or Woosung, but that these places shall be protected and left unmolested.

I beg also to inclose copy of a letter addressed by the French Consul-General to the German Consul-General, who is the Senior Consul at this port. This letter was circulated yesterday evening for the information of the Consular Body. It confirms the statements in the Notification, pointing out, however, that the advantage of freedom from the range of hostilities would cease in the event of neutrality being violated by the act of China at Shanghai or Woosung, or of the safety of French subjects being endangered. The French Consul-General therefore expresses his approval of a proposal made by the Taotai to join with the Consular Body in issuing a Proclamation, informing the people that they need not apprehend any hostile attack in this neighbourhood.

The proposal of a joint Proclamation was, however, not carried into effect, owing, I believe, to some objection made by the German Consul-General.

To-day Mr. Chên, late magistrate of the Mixed Court, called on behalf of the Taotai and handed to me a copy of a Proclamation just issued, which he

begged me to have translated and published at once. The principal object of the Taotai was, Mr. Chên said, to set the minds of the people at ease, and allay the fears said to be entertained of acts of pillage by native marauders. No doubt, also, the Taotai is anxious that trade be not interrupted, so that he may be able to collect the revenue as usual. The document will most interest our merchants as a formal Declaration, based on the assurances of the French Authorities, that Shanghai and Woosung are, to all intents and purposes, to be regarded as neutral ground during the continuance of the existing conflict between France and China. In accordance, therefore, with the wishes of the Taotai, and in the interest of trade at this port, I issued the Notification, a copy of which I inclose, and have arranged for its publication in to-morrow's issue of the North China Daily News.

I propose sending copy of this letter and of its inclosures by the outgoing mail to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

Inclosure 2.

Proclamation by M. Lemaire, Consul-General for France, &c.

(Translation from the Chinese.)

SHANGHAE has long been a port open to the commerce of all nations, and Chinese and foreigners have lived here in peace and comfort for many years.

I have heard that on account of the state of affairs between France and China the people living in the city and its suburbs and in the foreign settlements have been much disturbed in their minds of late, and have been leaving the place in crowds. Their reason for doing this is, that on account of false reports which are circulated, or on the strength of statements in the Chinese newspapers, they have come to consider Shanghai a dangerous place. Now, these reports rest upon no foundation whatever, and the stories in the newspapers of peace, of war, constantly changing and growing more vivid, and frightening those who hear them; these all arise from the desire of the publishers to extend the sale of their papers, regardless of the fright they may cause. Although a difficulty has arisen between France and China, peaceful relations will certainly be resumed.

In reply to an inquiry made by the proprietor

of the North China Daily News, whether, in the event of hostilities between France and China, there was any cause for anxiety in the neighbourhood of Shanghai and Woosung, I, the Consul-General, stated explicitly that there was no cause for anxiety, as no action would be taken by France at Shanghai or Woosung. It having thus been agreed that these places should be protected and left unmolested, boats which are in the habit of plying between Shanghai and Woosung can continue to do so, as before, without feeling any anxiety.

Lest the above facts should be unknown to Chinese and foreigners, I now issue this Proclamation for the information of the inhabitants of the city, suburbs, and settlements, bidding them continue to live in peace and comfort as at other times, and not cause themselves trouble by listening to false reports and newspaper stories.

M. ET CHER DOYEN,

*Shanghai, le 26 Août, 1884.*

ME référant à l'entretien que j'ai eu ce matin avec vous au sujet de la Proclamation que le Taotai de Shanghai se propose de faire paraître d'accord avec le Corps Consulaire, je suis heureux de pouvoir vous confirmer, après en avoir référé à M. Patenôtre, les renseignements que j'ai déjà eu l'honneur de vous donner de vive voix. Ainsi que j'ai eu récemment l'occasion d'informer le public par la voix de la presse, le Gouvernement Français, désireux de sauvegarder autant qu'il lui sera possible les intérêts du commerce international qui sont ici si largement représentés, est résolu de s'abstenir de tout ce qui pourrait porter atteinte à la tranquillité du port et de la ville de Shanghai.

Quelles que soient les mesures que la France puisse être amenée à prendre sur d'autres points du territoire Chinois pour arriver à la solution des difficultés existantes, Shanghai et Woosung resteront donc en dehors du conflit. Il va sans dire qu'il n'en serait pas de même si la neutralité était violée à Shanghai ou à Woosung du fait de la Chine, et si la sécurité de nos nationaux se trouvait mise en péril. Il dépend donc des autorités locales d'assurer le maintien de la paix et de dissiper les inquiétudes de la population, et dans ces conditions je ne puis que m'associer à la proposition faite par le Taotai.

NOTIFICATION.

HER Britannic Majesty's Consul-General publishes herewith, for the information of British subjects, the accompanying translation of a Proclamation issued this day by the Taotai, announcing that arrangements have been made for maintaining neutrality at Shanghai and Woosung during the existing conflict between France and China.

Shanghai, August 27, 1884.

PROCLAMATION.

SHANGHAI is a town where people congregate from all quarters, and contains large numbers of homeless vagrants. At the end of last July the failure to arrange the difficulty between China and France caused a general feeling of anxiety, it being feared that the dangerous classes might avail themselves of the opportunity to commit

excesses. I therefore addressed the German Consul-General as Senior Consul, and requested him to call a meeting of Consuls for the purpose of arranging a general plan of defence, and employing troops for the repression of rioters in the settlements, city, and adjoining districts. During the month that has elapsed since then perfect tranquillity has prevailed. Now again, however, false reports have arisen of the probability of war-like operations at Woosung. In consequence there has been much anxiety, an exodus of many inhabitants, and a slackness of trade. These alarming reports are all the work of lawless ruffians, who hope thereby to terrify the public and find opportunities for the commission of robberies.

But Shanghai is the general emporium of foreign commerce in China, and the only approach to it is through Woosung. Should there be an actual conflict between China and France there will certainly be no fighting in such a place. The Senior Consul has now sent to me, for the information of the public, a letter from the Consul-General for France, who says that the inhabitants of Shanghai have no cause for alarm, as France will certainly commit no act of war at Shanghai, Woosung, or their neighbourhood, but will treat the same as neutral ground. At the present moment the Chinese Government has stationed troops at the most important points in the above-mentioned districts. The troops will patrol the country, and at once arrest any bad characters who disturb the public peace. The Taotai has also arranged with the Senior Consul and the other Consuls that Woosung and Shanghai, with the settlements, city, suburbs, and surrounding districts, shall all continue to be protected by a military force. The troops will at once arrest all rioters, and hand them over to the authorities, who will punish them with the utmost rigour. As a further measure for the preservation of tranquillity, all persons found spreading false reports will also be arrested and punished.

This Notification is therefore issued to inform the inhabitants of Shanghai that they have no cause for alarm, but may continue to live in peace and comfort.

WHEREAS Philip Chasemore Gates, Esquire, one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 and the York Extension and Improvement Act 1884 for the purpose of preparing a scheme for fixing and determining the boundaries of the Wards of the city of York as extended by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884 and for apportioning the Councillors thereto, transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his determination and apportionment in the following terms:—

“ WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the 30th section of ‘The Municipal Corporations Act 1882’ and the 19th section of ‘The York Extension and Improvement Act 1884’ duly appointed Philip Chasemore Gates Esquire one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the Law to be the Commissioner to prepare a scheme for fixing and determining the boundaries of the Wards of the

city of York as extended by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884 and for apportioning the Councillors among them, the number of such wards having been fixed by such last-mentioned Act.

"And whereas by the 20th section of the said last-mentioned Act it was enacted that the Commissioner should commence and proceed with the duties of his appointment with all practicable dispatch so as to complete his scheme before the first day of September 1884 or such later day as might on his application be fixed by the said Secretary of State.

"And whereas upon the application of the said Commissioner the said Secretary of State by writing under his hand dated the thirtieth day of August 1884 fixed the seventeenth day of September 1884 as the day for the completion of the scheme for dividing the extended city into Wards instead of the first day of September as provided by the said last-mentioned Act.

"And whereas it was provided by the said last-mentioned Act that the city of York as extended by that Act should continue to be divided into six Wards each of which Wards should return six Councillors.

"And whereas the Wards of the said city have heretofore been known and distinguished by the following names, that is to say:—Bootham Ward, Castlegate Ward, Guildhall Ward, Micklegate Ward, Monk Ward, and Walmgate Ward.

"Now I the said Philip Chasemore Gates having taken upon myself the burthen of preparing a scheme for fixing and determining the boundaries of the Wards of the said city as extended under the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884 and for apportioning the Councillors among such Wards and having after due notice held a public sitting at the Guildhall of and in the said city for the purpose of hearing and considering such representations as might be made to me by any person or persons interested in the matter of such scheme and having heard and considered the same accordingly do now make and propound the following scheme for fixing and determining the boundaries of the Wards of the said city and for apportioning the Councillors among such Wards as provided in and by the said last-mentioned Act that is to say:—

"1. That the six Wards of the said extended city shall continue to be known, and distinguished by the names by which they have heretofore been known and distinguished.

"2. That Bootham Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes townships and places that is to say:—

"The parish of St. Giles.

"The township of St. Olave, and so much of the township of Clifton as is added to the said city by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884.

"3. That Castlegate Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes, townships and places that is to say:—

"The Parish of All Saints North-street.

"The Parish of St. John Micklegate.

"The Parish of St. Mary, Castlegate.

"The Parish of St. Michael, Spurriergate.

"The Parish of St. Mary Bishophill, Senior and

"The Parish of St. Martin-cum-Gregory.

"4. That Guildhall Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes townships and places, that is to say:—

"The Parish of Holy Trinity, King's Court or Christ.

"The Parish of St. Helen Stonegate.

"The Parish of St. Martin, Concy-street.

"The Parish of St. Peter the Little.

"The Parish of St. Sampson.

"The Extra-parochial Place of Davy Hall.

"The Parish of All Saints Pavement.

"The Parish of Holy Trinity Goodramgate.

"The Parish of St. Michael-le-Belfrey

"The Township of Minster Yard with Bedern.

"The Liberty of Mint Yard.

"The Parish of St. Andrew.

"The Parish of St. Crux.

"The Parish of St. John-del-Pyke.

"The Parish of St. Saviour and

"The Parish of St. Wilfred.

"5. That Micklegate Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes, townships and places, that is to say:—

"The Parish of Holy Trinity Micklegate.

"The Parish of St. Mary Bishophill Junior.

"The township of Holgate and so much of the respective townships of Dringhouses and Middlethorpe as is added to the said city by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884.

"6. That Monk Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes, townships and places, that is to say:—

"The Parish of All Saints Peaseholme.

"The Parish of St. Cuthbert.

"The Parish of St. Helen-on-the-Walls.

"The Parish of St. Maurice, and so much of the township of Heworth as is added to the said city by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884.

"7. That Walmgate Ward shall consist of and comprise the following parishes, townships and places, that is to say:—

"The Parish of St. Dennis.

"The Parish of St. George.

"The Parish of St. Lawrence.

"The Parish of St. Margaret.

"The Parish of St. Nicholas.

"The Parish of St. Peter-le-Willows, and so much of the township of Fulford, or Gate Fulford, as is added to the said city by the said York Extension and Improvement Act 1884.

"8. And I do hereby apportion and declare that the existing Councillors for Bootham Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

"9. That the existing Councillors for Castlegate Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

"10. That the existing Councillors for Guildhall Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

"11. That the existing Councillors for Micklegate Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

"12. That the existing Councillors for Monk Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

"13. That the existing Councillors for Walmgate Ward shall continue to represent the same Ward as modified and amended by this scheme for

such period as each Councillor would have held his office if this scheme had not been made.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Henry Richard Howel Lloyd-Mostyn, Esquire, Captain Fourth Battalion Royal Welsh Fusiliers, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the title, rank, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as the younger son of a Baron, to which honour he would have been entitled had his father succeeded to the dignity of Baron Mostyn :

**H**ER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class on—

**WILLIAM MACGREGOR, Esq., M.D., C.M.G.,**  
Chief Medical Officer and Receiver-General,

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred :—

The " Syria " bound from Calcutta to the Fiji Islands, with 494 Coolie emigrants, stranded on the evening of Sunday, 11th May last, upon the Nasalai Reef, some 25 miles to the eastward of Suva, Fiji. This reef is exposed to the full force of the south-east trade winds, which, at the time of the wreck, were blowing with great force ; also to the long roll of the sea from the vast expanse of the South Pacific.

Owing to the peculiar set of the tides over the reef, the shipwrecked emigrants who committed themselves to the water in the hopes of swimming ashore were irresistibly carried in an opposite direction, and swept out into the surf, which was breaking 30 feet high over the edge of the reef.

The Captain did not leave the wreck until he believed that all the people were out of it, he then started from the after part of the ship, bringing an Indian woman, who was half drunk, along with him, and was conducting her across a piece of broken mast which lay at a slight incline across the gap that existed between the two portions of the hull, when both were knocked over and over towards the perpendicular edge of the reef, the woman grasping the Captain by the neck like a vice.

An official who was at hand, at the risk of his own life, dashed into the breakers to their rescue, but no sooner had he reached the drowning couple, than he too was thrown down, and all three were being rolled along to destruction, when Dr. MACGREGOR, who was at the time standing by the wreck of the fallen mainmast, leading and directing the removal of the struggling Indians, instantly seized a line forming part of the ship's running rigging, that was floating by, and taking two or three turns with it round his wrist plunged

into the surf at the imminent risk of his own life, grasped the struggling bodies of the drifting people, and by main strength dragged them back into shallow water from the destruction which appeared to be inevitable.

It is also stated that but for the energetic, able, and cool way in which Dr. MACGREGOR led the relieving party, the loss of life, which was great, 59 in all, must have been appalling.

CIRCULAR of the Maritime Government to all Harbour and Sanitary Authorities.

According to a Despatch from the Ministry of Commerce of the 26th of August, 1884, No. 30,991, the Ministry of Finance, in concert with the other ministries interested, declared under date August 21, 1884, No. 26,603, that the prohibition issued in the ministerial order of the 1st of July, 1884, B. L. T., No. 107, against the importation or transit of rags, old ropes, torn clothes, worn-out linen, and old bedding, so far as these objects were intended as articles of commerce, and came from France, Algiers, and Tunis, is not applicable for artificial wool and waste of spinning (in particular of spun silk) coming from those countries.

This is published in connection with the Circular of the Government, dated July 4, 1884, No. 5,495.

CIRCULAR of the Imperial Royal Maritime Government to all Harbour and Sanitary Officials.

By an Order of the Ministry of Commerce of this day's date, No. 35,661, the Maritime Government decrees :—

In consequence of the approach of cholera, the facilities conceded in the Circular from the Government of the 20th of August, No. 7,784, to native Austro-Italian vessels keeping up local communication along the coast, and to fishing-smacks arriving from Italian ports, allowing them to introduce goods and to take on board provisions in doubtful districts, are hereby rescinded.
