It is also stated that but for the energetic, able, and cool way in which Dr. MACGREGOR led the relieving party, the loss of life, which was great, 59 in all, must have been appalling.

CIRCULAR of the Maritime Government to all Harbour and Sanitary Authorities.

According to a Despatch from the Ministry of Commerce of the 26th of August, 1884, No. 30,991, the Ministry of Finance, in concert with the other ministries interested, declared under date August 21, 1884, No. 26,603, that the prohibition issued in the ministerial order of the 1st of July, 1884, B. L. T., No. 107, against the importation or transit of rags, old ropes, torn clothes, worn-out linen, and old bedding, so far as these objects were intended as articles of commerce, and came from France, Algiers, and Tunis, is not applicable for artificial wool and waste of spinning (in particular of spun silk) coming from those countries.

This is published in connection with the Circular of the Government, dated July 4, 1884, No. 5,495.

CIRCULAR of the Imperial Royal Maritime Government to all Harbour and Sanitary Officials.

By an Order of the Ministry of Commerce of this day's date, No. 35,661, the Maritime Government decrees :—

In consequence of the approach of cholera, the facilities conceded in the Circular from the Government of the 20th of August, No. 7,784, to native Austro-Italian vessels keeping up local communication along the coast, and to fishing-smacks arriving from Italian ports, allowing them to introduce goods and to take on board provisions in doubtful districts, are hereby rescinded.
