The Troops of Wirtemberg and Wistenburzel, that returned lately from the Levant, are now Quartered about Verona, and will, so soon as the weather is a little more savourable, begin their march towards Germany; From whence we are expecting 2000 Men, which the Duke of Meiklenburg Gnstraw is, according to the Treaty made with him, to send to the Ashithance of this Republick.

Missian, Feb. 17. From thence our Horse marched to Cavan, and joyned our other Party. The Enemy had notice of their coming, and had posted them-selves behind the Walls of the Houses that were burnt the last time, but our Men advancing under their Shot, heat them from thence, killed between co and 80 of them, and burnt the remaining Honses, Colonel Wauchop, who Commands in the Fort, not daring to trir out.
