GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Removing Suspension of Article 182 of General Order: Medical Officer's Salary.

Saint Asaph Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Saint Asaph Union, in the counties of Denbigh and Flint;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 3rd day of June, 1867, the Poor Law Board suspended, so far as regards the Saint Asaph Union, and until such time as that Board might by Order otherwise direct, the provisions contained in Articles 177, 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, and 183 of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 24th day of July, 1847, in which Articles provision is made for the payment in certain cases of special fees to Medical Officers appointed for a District or a Workhouse:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby remove the suspension, as regards the said Saint Asaph Union, of the operation of Article 182 of the above-mentioned General Order, so far as it relates to the Medical Officer of a Workhouse.
