WHEREAS by an Order dated the 3rd day of June, 1867, the Poor Law Board suspended, so far as regards the Saint Asaph Union, and until such time as that Board might by Order otherwise direct, the provisions contained in Articles 177, 178, 179, 18), 181, 182, and 183 of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 24th day of July, 1847, in which Articles provision is made for the payment in certain cases of special fees to Medical Officers appointed for a District or a Workhouse:
