In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division
In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of the Imperial Continental Water Corporation Limited.

BY Mr. Justice Chitty, dated the 6th day of December, 1884, on the petition of Lucien Alexander Golla, of 40, Cambridge-gardens, Hastings, in the county of Sussex, it was ordered that the Imperial Continental Water Corporation Limited be wound up by this Court under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867. And it was ordered that the costs of the petitioner, and of the said Company, and of the Sovereign Life Assurance Company of the application, be taxed by the Taxing Master and paid out of the assets of the said Company.—Dated the 15th day of December, 1884.
