THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Notice from Her Majesty's Consul at Bilbao:—

“Notice to British Shipmasters trading to Bilbao with Cargoes.

“Vessels arriving from abroad after mooring can change their berth on obtaining permission from the port authorities, and also the authorization of the Customs, to which department due notice of the wish to change berth must be given. Foreign vessels complying with the above regulations are permitted at the port of Bilbao to discharge cargoes in two or more places.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of a Proclamation by the Governor of Gibraltar, giving effect to the following regulations in respect to quarantine at that place, viz. :—

“1. That the Proclamation of the 28th November, 1884, be rescinded.

“2. That arrivals from Italy and France be admitted to free pratique, provided clean bills of health are brought.

“3. That arrivals from Nantes be subjected to fourteen days quarantine from date of sailing until the 20th of this month.

“4. That arrivals from the French possessions in the Mediterranean be subjected to fourteen days quarantine, from date of sailing, provided clean bills of health are produced and good health is enjoyed on board.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, enclosing the following copy of a Notice respecting quarantine issued by the Russian Government, viz. :—

“Official Gazette, 1-18th December, 1884.

“In view of official information received concerning the cessation of the epidemic of cholera in France, Italy, and Spain, the Ministry of the Interior has now deemed it possible to repeal the extraordinary measures taken during the current year on our land and sea frontiers, concerning arrivals from the above-mentioned countries, leaving in force only the 2nd paragraph of the Regulations of August 15 of this year, forbidding the importation of all kinds of rags which have been in use as personal and bed linen or wearing apparel, unless they shall have been submitted at the frontier to a thorough precautionary disinfection.”
