Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 44.

The Minister of the Interior decrees :

The quarantine prescribed by Ordinance No. 28 of October 5, for arrivals from that part of the

French coast lying between the parts of Dieppe and Cherbourg, inclusive of both, is revoked for vessels leaving those places after to-day's date, directed to any point in Italy, except the Islands of Sicily, Sardinia, and the adjacent islets, which arrive with a healthy passage and clean bill of health. The said ships will be admitted to pratique after a rigorous medical inspection.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 45.

The Minister of the Interior decrees :—

ART. 1. The quarantines prescribed by Ordinances 9 and 31 of June 28 and October 29, are revoked for the ships starting after the 15th instant from the continental coast of France on the Mediterranean, from Corsica, and from the Regency of Tunis, which arrive directed to any point in Italy, except the Islands of Sicily, Sardinia, and the adjacent islets, if they have had a healthy passage and clean bill of health. The said ships will be admitted to pratique after a medical inspection.

ART. 2. No alteration has been made as regards the quarantine regulations for arrivals from Algeria.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at the Hague, reporting that the Netherlands Official Gazette of the 23rd instant contains the following notifications respecting quarantine, viz. :—

1. That, in consequence of the receipt of official intelligence of the cessation of Asiatic cholera at Yport and Nantes, the orders, dated the 24th of October and 1st of November last, by which the port of Cherbourg and all ports on the French coast between Cherbourg and Dieppe inclusive, as well as Nantes, were declared to be infected, will be cancelled and cease to take effect on and after the 27th instant.

2. That, considering that Asiatic cholera no longer prevails epidemically in France, and that no case of that disease has occurred during the months of November and December in Belgium, the order whereby the importation and transit

across the southern frontier of the Netherlands of rags, clothes that had been worn, and unwashed body and bed linen were prohibited, will be so far modified, on and after the 27th instant, as no longer to apply to passengers' luggage, but that the order, dated the 5th of September last, prohibiting the importation of rags from France, Italy, Spain, Algiers, and Tunis, remains in force.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Constantinople, viz.:— December 27, 1884.—Quarantine on arrivals from France, Italy, and Spain reduced to five days. Arrivals from Trieste and Egypt subject to twenty-four hours observation. Ten days maintained on those from Algeria. Vessels coming from France, Italy, Spain, Algeria, and Tunis bound for non-Turkish ports of Black Sea and vice versa to pass the Straits in quarantine. Quarantine on vessels for Constantinople from Varna, Kustendje, Danube, Odessa, and Sebastopol reduced to twenty-four hours observation.

POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

WHEREAS the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, provides that, subject to the Post Office Regulations the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, may for the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office, authorize his officers, or any of them, to issue Orders (hereinafter referred to as Postal Orders), in the form set forth in the schedule to that Act, subject, nevertheless, to the provisos contained in the said Act.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorized with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to make Post Office Regulations relating to Money Orders, and to the persons by or to whom Money Orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1883, certain alterations in the form of Postal Orders, as set forth in the schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, are sanctioned, and the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to prescribe by Post Office Regulations, further modifications of the form of Postal Orders, and the several amounts (not exceeding 20s.) of such Orders and the sums of poundage (not exceeding 2d.) to be taken in respect of such Orders, and it was, amongst other things, provided that where an arrangement is made with the Government of any British Possession for the transmission of small sums through the post offices of the United Kingdom and such British Possession by means of Money Orders of a like character to those issued under the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, as amended by that Act, the said Act, as amended by that Act should, so far as is consistent with

the tenor thereof, and subject to the prescribed modifications, apply in like manner as if an Order issued in pursuance of such arrangement, whether by an officer of the Post Office or of such British Possession, was an Order under the said Act, as amended by that Act, and that such portions of the said Act as enact punishment should apply accordingly.

And whereas it is intended that, on and after the 1st day of January, 1885, the Postal Service of Malta shall cease to be conducted by Officers of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General.

And whereas an arrangement has been made with the Government of Malta for the issue and payment in Malta and in the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, and Constantinople, respectively, on and after the said 1st day of January, 1885, of Postal Orders in the form and subject to the Regulations hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable George John Shaw Lefevre, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance of the said Acts and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1885, on and from which date the Regulations made by the Right Honourable Henry Fawcett, Her Majesty's late Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 13th day of May, 1884, are hereby repealed, without prejudice, nevertheless, to anything already done in pursuance thereof.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations Postal Orders issued at any post office in Malta may be paid in the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, and Constantinople, by any officer or person for the time being there authorized to pay Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom, and Postal Orders may be issued by any such last-mentioned officer or person for payment in Malta.

3. Every Postal Order issued in Malta, the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, or Constantinople shall be in the form and of one of the amounts specified in the Regulations made under the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 to 1883, and dated the 28th day of January, 1884, or any other Regulations for the time being in force with reference to Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom; and all the provisions of the said Regulations shall apply to Orders issued in Malta, the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, and Constantinople under these Regulations so far as the nature of the case admits.

In witness whereof, I, the said George John Shaw-Lefevre, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, have hereunto set my hand this 12th day of December, 1884.
