Naples, Feb. 28.

Hree Galleys of the Duke of Tursi's Squadron are arrived in this Port, and will part again in few days with the Troops defigned for the reinforcement of the Spanish Garifons on the Coast of Tuscam. A Vessel come from the Levant reports, That the Turks taking advantage of the ill weather, which had obliged the Venetian Ships that cruifed before Napoli di Malvafia to fland off to Sea, had put forme Succors into that plice; but this Advice needs a configuration. On the 17th Inflant arrived here Prince Philip of Neubourg: The Count de Saint Istevan, our Viceroy, went several miles out of Town to receive him, and to conduct him to an Apartment in the Palace; but the Prince declining a publick Reception, went directly to the House of the Elector Palatine his Father.

Rome, March 11. On Monday last the Pope, in a Confiftory, communicated to the Cardinals the Letters he had received from the Emperor, acquainting him with the Coronation of the King of the Whereupon To Deam was fung on Romans. Wednesday, at which the Pope affisted, with all the Cardinals that are in Town, except those or the French Faction; and at night there were Bonfires, and other publick Rejoycings. The Pope has confirmed the Brief granted by his Predecessor Innocent XI, allowing the Emperor to raise the Tenths upon the Eccletiasticks within his Dominions, for the War against the Tucks. The French Ambalfador continues his Negotiation for the composing the Differences between his-Master and this Court, and has, as the Report goes, advanced to far therein, as to form with the Ministers of this Court the following Project. I. That the Franchises of the Quaters of Ambissadors shall be entirely abolished. II. That the Monastery of Vesons in Dauphine shall be restored to the same state it was in before these Differences arose between the two Courts. III. That the Great Vieur of Pamieres shall be likewise Re-estabushed in all the Dignities and Privileges he formerly Enjoyed, and of which he was deprived for maintain-ing the Interests of the See of Rome. IV. That the King shall consent, that the Clergy of France write a very submissive Letter to the Pope, in which they shall own the Pope's Infalititier, and Spall renounce the four Propolitions of the Assembly in 1632. V. That the Marquis de Lavardin shall likewije write a Letter of Submillion to the Popracknowledge

respect to the Nomination of the vacant Benefices. These Articles have, it's faid, been fent by an Express to France,

Milan, March 15. Our Governor-General is come bick from Guiffalli; the Forifications of which place are now quite demolithed, and the Troops that were polted there, to cover the Workmen, are sent to several Quarters. The Deputies from the Popish Cantons are will here, but will be now very fuddenly dispatched. Venice, March 17. By a Velfel come from Dinazzo we are informed, That the new Viter Kurerii had fent for the Balla of Achara to Adrianopic, in order to give him tome confiderable Employment, but that in his way thither the Country People had fallen upon him and his Attendants, and had out them all in pieces except the Baffa and one or two more, who escaped with great difficulty. . The Senate has named the Chevalier Foscarini to receive the new Nuncio when he makes his publick Entry. ...

Vienna, March 19. The Letters from N. sa of the 6th Instant say, That the Imperial Forces, under the command of General Vecerani; are in a very good posture, being above 10000 strong, and having received great supplies of Provisions and Ammunition from the Bort of Jagrdin and Belgrad. That the new Fortifications advance daily, although the Work is very much hindered by the Foundations of ancient Walls, and Ruines of Houses, which they discover in digging; that place having been formerly one of the molt celebrated Gities in ali those parts.
