Naples, Feb. 28.

**T**hree Gallies of the Duke of Tuffi's Squadron are arriv'd in this Port, and will part again in few days with the Troops designed for the reinforcement of the Spanish Garrisons on the Coast of Tuscany. A Vessel come from the Levant reports, That the Turks taking advantage of the ill weather, which had obliged the Venetian Ships that cruised before *Napoli di Malvasia* to stand off to Sea, had put some Success into that place; but this Advice needs a confirmation. On the 17th Instant arriv'd here Prince Philip of Neubourg: The Count de Saint Isevan, our Viceroy, went several miles out of Town to receive him, and to conduct him to an Apartment in the Palace; but the Prince declining a publick Reception, went directly to the House of the Elector Palatine his Father.

Rome, March 11. On Monday last the Pope, in a Conistory, communicated to the Cardinals the Letters he had received from the Emperor, acquainting him with the Coronation of the King of the Romans. Whereupon *Te Deum* was sung on Wednesday, at which the Pope assisted, with all the Cardinals that are in Town, except those of the French Faction; and at night there were Bonfires, and other publick Rejoycings. The Pope has confirmed the Brief granted by his Predecessor *Innocent XI.*, allowing the Emperor to raise the Tenths upon the Ecclesiasticks within his Dominions, for the War against the Turks. The French Ambassador continues his Negotiation for the composing the Differences between his Master and this Court, and has, as the Report goes, advanced so far therein, as to form with the Ministers of this Court the following Project. I. That the Franchises of the Quarters of Ambassadors shall be entirely abolished. II. That the Monastery of Vefons in Dauphine shall be restored to the same state it was in before these Differences arose between the two Courts. III. That the Great Vicar of Pamieres shall be likewise Re-established in all the Dignities and Privileges he formerly Enjoyed, and of which he was deprived for maintaining the Interests of the See of Rome. IV. That the King shall consent, that the Clergy of France write a very submissive Letter to the Pope, in which they shall own the Pope's Infallibility, and shall renounce the four Propositions of the Assembly in 1632. V. That the Marquis de Lavardin shall likewise write a Letter of Submission to the Pope, acknowledging, that the Excommunication pronounced against him was just. This being done, the Pope promises: I. To cause all the Bulls that shall be desired of him for the French Bishops to be dispatched. II. That the Excommunication against Monsieur Lavardin shall be taken off. III. That the French King shall assist for the future the Regale, as heretofore, with

respect to the Nomination of the vacant Benefices. These Articles have, it's said, been sent by an Express to France.

Milan, March 15. Our Governor-General is come back from *Gustalla*; the Fortifications of which place are now quite demolished, and the Troops that were posted there, to cover the Workmen, are sent to several Quarters. The Deputies from the Popish Cantons are still here, but will be now very suddenly dispatched. Divers Commissions have been lately given out for new Levies; and other preparations are making here for the next Campaigne.

Venice, March 17. The Troops of *Wolffemburg* and *Wuerttemberg*, consisting of 6 Regiments, are on their march towards *Germany*; but those of *Brandenburg Barye* continue at the *Lido*; From whence they will return with the first Convoy to the *Levant*: And the Gallies that brought hither the Doge *Morosini*, are to return with the same opportunity. By a Vessel come from *Dumazgo* we are informed, That the new Viceroy had sent for the Basha of *Acchana* to *Subianople*, in order to give him some considerable Employment, but that in his way thither the Country People had fallen upon him and his Attendants, and had cut them all in pieces except the Basha and one or two more, who escaped with great difficulty. The Senate has named the Chevalier *Foscarini* to receive the new Nuncio when he makes his publick Entry.

Vienna, March 19. The Letters from *Nissa* of the 6th Instant say, That the Imperial Forces, under the command of General *Veterani*, are in a very good posture, being above 10000 strong, and having received great supplies of Provisions and Ammunition from the Fort of *Jagodin* and *Belograd*. That the new Fortifications advance daily, although the Work is very much hindered by the Foundations of ancient Walls, and Ruines of Houses, which they discover in digging; that place having been formerly one of the most celebrated Cities in all those parts. That Count *Veterani* had given the Command of the Rascians, vacant by the death of Colonel *Deake*, to one Signior *Armanio*, a person in great Esteem in that Country; and that this new Commander had soon after had a Rencontre with 500 Turks commanded by the Basha of *Osirafub*, whom he routed, and recovered a great Booty. And that on the 4th of March Count *Guido* of *Staremburg* arriv'd at *Nissa*. They now talk very much here of the Marriage between the Prince of *Poland* and the Princess Palatine of *Neuburg*, which, it's said, will be celebrated after *Eyle* at *Neustadt*, within four Leagues of this place. There is a great discourse likewise of a Marriage between the Electoral Prince Palatine and the Infanta of *Portugal*. This morning arriv'd here an Express from the Blockade of *Camsa* with advice, That the Gallies of that place had begun
