Trincomalie Harbour Entrance—Buoy Marking Submarine Mine Field.

THE Government of Ceylon has given notice, that from 1st December, 1884, to 28th February, 1885, a buoy will mark the boundary of the Submarine Mine Field between Ostenberg Point and Small Sober Island, Trincomalie Harbour Entrance:—

The buoy, coloured red, is moored at a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from Small Sober Island. The channel between the buoy and Ostenberg Point is obstructed by mines; vessels should pass between the buoy and Small Sober Island.
