In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.

Mr. Justice Chitty.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of the "Great Eastern" Steamship Company Limited.

BY an Order made in the above matters by Mr. Justice Chitty, dated the 7th day of March, 1885, on the petition of Henry Ward Woolcott, of No. 34, Woburn-square, in the county of Middlesex, Gentleman, it was ordered that the "Great Eastern" Steamship Company Limited be wound up by this Court under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867; and it was ordered that the costs of the petitioner, and of the said Company, and of the creditors and contributories appearing of the said application, be taxed by the Taxing Master and paid out of the assets of the said Company, and in such taxation only one set of costs was to be allowed to the said creditors supporting the petition, and one set of costs to the said contributories supporting the same.—Dated the 12th day of March, 1885.
