(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of April, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Place (namely),—so much of the district of the city of New Sarum as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north and west by that portion of the Southampton-road commencing at the boundary of the city and extending thence in a westerly direction to the entrance to Saint Martin's Church-street, on the east by Saint Martin's Church, Saint Martin's Church-yard, and Fowler's Croft, and on or towards the south by the public street called Saint Martin's Church-street,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be a Place infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

**POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS,
1848 TO 1883.**

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE POST OFFICE
(MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

WHEREAS the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, provides that, subject to the Post Office Regulations the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, may for the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office, authorise his officers, or any of them, to issue Orders (hereinafter referred to as Postal Orders), in the form set forth in the schedule to that Act, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions contained in the said Act.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorised with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to make Post Office Regulations relating to Money Orders, and to the persons by or to whom Money Orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1883, certain alterations in the form of Postal Orders, as set forth in the schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, are sanctioned, and the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to prescribe by Post Office Regulations, further modifications of the form of Postal Orders, and the several amounts (not exceeding 20s.) of such Orders and the sums of poundage (not exceeding 2d.) to be taken in respect of such Orders, and it was, amongst other things, provided that where an arrangement is made with the Government of any British Possession for the transmission of small sums through the post offices of the United Kingdom and such British Possession by means of Money Orders of a like character to those issued under the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, as amended by that Act, the said Act, as amended by that Act should, so far as is consistent with the tenor thereof, and subject to the prescribed modifications, apply in like manner as if an Order issued in pursuance of such arrangement, whether by an officer of the Post Office or of such British Possession, was an Order under the said Act, as amended by that Act, and that such portions of the said Act as enact punishment should apply accordingly.

And whereas an arrangement has been made with the Government of the Straits Settlements for the issue in the Straits Settlements and for the payment in the United Kingdom, and in Gibraltar and Constantinople, of Postal Orders in the form and subject to the Regulations hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, I the Right Honourable George John Shaw Lefevre, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance of the said Acts and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1885.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations Postal Orders issued at any post office in the Straits Settlements, may be paid in the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, and Constantinople, by any officer or person for the time being there authorized to pay Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom.

3. Every Postal Order issued in the Straits Settlements shall be in the form and of one of the amounts specified in the Regulations made under the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848

to 1883, and dated the 28th day of January, 1884, or any other Regulations for the time being in force with reference to Postal Orders, issued in the United Kingdom, and all the provisions of the said Regulations shall apply to orders issued in the Straits Settlements, so far as the nature of the case admits.

In witness whereof, I, the said George John Shaw Lefevre, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, have hereunto set my hand this 1st day of April, 1885.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer.

Parish of Saint Mary, Islington.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the parish of Saint Mary, Islington, in the county of Middlesex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Boards of Guardians of certain Unions and Parishes; including the said parish of Saint Mary, Islington; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:—

“ The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such Salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve.”

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said parish of Saint Mary, Islington:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said parish of Saint Mary, Islington, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to the Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said parish.

SPAIN—SOUTH COAST.

(1.) *Port Malaga—Irregular Exhibition of Breakwater Light.*

THE Spanish Government has given notice, dated 22nd December, 1884, that the exhibition of the light, on the extremity of the eastern breakwater at Port Malaga, is liable to frequent interruptions.

SICILY—SOUTH COAST.

(2.) *Port Empedocle—Western Breakwater Light Altered in Position.*

The Italian Government has given notice, dated 15th January, 1885, that on account of the serious damage done by the sea to the Western Breakwater, in course of construction, at Port Empedocle, the light is temporarily shown from a position, about 130 yards within the extremity of that breakwater.

(3.) *Time Signals at Alexandria.*

Information has been received, that the following time signals are established at the Observatory, Fort Napoleon or Caffarelli, Alexandria :—

The signals are, a gun ; and a black ball elevated 115 feet above the sea, and 15 feet above the ground.

The signals are made once daily, as follows :—

1. The gun is fired at noon mean time at the Great Pyramid of Gizeh—equivalent to 2h. 55m. 28.4s. Greenwich mean time.

2. The ball is hoisted when the gun is fired, and dropped at noon Alexandria mean time—equivalent to 22h. 0m. 26.1s. Greenwich mean time.

Position of time signals, lat. 31° 11' 38" N., long. 29° 53' 13" E.

NOTE.—Mean time at the Great Pyramid of Gizeh is the official time kept throughout Egypt.

(4.) *Port Said—Light-Vessels Replaced by Light-Buoys.*

Also, that the light-vessels formerly marking the channel into Port Said, northern entrance to the Suez Canal, have been replaced by buoys of large size, lighted by stored gas (Pintsch system).

The three buoys on the starboard hand, entering the port from seaward, are coloured red ; those on the port hand are coloured green. The black buoys on the port hand, entering the canal

from the northward, have been tipped white, so as to be more easily distinguished at night.

(1.) *West Point Light—Temporary Alteration in Character.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that pending the completion of extensive repairs, it will be impossible to exhibit the revolving light on West Point, Prince Edward Island, Northumberland Strait ; and that in lieu thereof, for a short period at the opening of navigation, a fixed white light of small power will be shown.

The light is a fixed light, showing red between the bearings of W. ¼ S., through north, and E. by S. ½ S., and white through the remaining portion of arc ; it is elevated 46 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The structure is a pyramidal frame-work tower, surmounted by a lantern painted red.

NOTE.—To vessels approaching from the southward, this light shows red, clear of the sand hills to the northward of Cape Henlopen light ; the last-named light should not be approached too closely, in order to avoid Hen and Chickens shoal.

Delaware breakwater front light (fixed white, varied by white flashes) kept in line with this light (fixed red) leads clear of the northern end of Hen and Chickens shoal. When this light is in line with Delaware breakwater rear light, or when it changes from red to white, or bears W. ¼ S., it leads about three quarters of a cable clear of the extreme of Cape Henlopen, and vessels should not approach the Cape within that distance.

The new light in line with Cape Henlopen light marks the line of shoal ground extending southward from the Shears ; Delaware breakwater front light in line with Cape Henlopen light marks a line inside that shoal ground.

A change in the new light from white to red marks the inside limit of the outer harbour. The new light showing red and Cape Henlopen light showing white guide clear of the western end of the ice-breaker into the Breakwater harbour.

(Further Extension of City so as to include Rusholme; Provisions in regard to Victoria Park and Sewerage; Further Extension of District of City School Board; Amendment of Act).
