PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present

themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Lisbon, transmitting a copy and translation of a Portuguese law, which received the Royal Assent on the 16th ultimo, in virtue of which the coasting trade between Portugal and the Colonial possessions of that country east of the Cape of Good Hope, which was formerly only permitted to be carried in Portuguese vessels, is now thrown open to vessels of all nationalities. The regulations which are already in force, or which may hereafter come into force, with regard to vessels under the national flag engaged in such trade, will therefore be applicable to all foreign vessels. The coasting trade between the Portuguese continental ports and the ports of the adjacent islands, and also that with Portuguese ports on the West Coast of Africa are, however, still reserved for Portuguese vessels only.

Despatch from Brussels, enclosing a copy of a Decree of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, promulgating certain provisional modifications of the import duties on cocoa, candied sugar, syrups and molasses, and of the surtax levied on foreign sugars. The following is the substance of the Decree:

(1.) The import duties on cocoa, sugar candy, and syrups and molasses are modified as follows:—

(2.) The surtax of 10 per cent. upon foreign sugars, imposed by the law of September, 1884, is raised to 15 per cent.

(3.) The above-mentioned increases will be withdrawn not later than the 1st August, 1885, if the old duties have not before that date been definitely modified by a law.

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH, No. 3.

The Minister of the Interior being informed that cases of yellow fever are daily occurring at Rio de Janeiro: Decrees:

Vessels arriving from to-day from the port of Rio Janeiro and its neighbourhood shall be considered foul by reason of yellow fever, and subjected to the quarantine established by Ordinance No. 9 of May 29th, 1878, unless indeed they shall have already been subjected to an equal preventive treatment at some intermediate clean port or roadstead.

MORETON BAY.

(1) *Middle Channel Subject to Change.*

THE Government of Queensland has given notice, dated 7th February, 1885, that in consequence of recent changes in East and Venus Banks, approach to Moreton Bay from the northward, vessels should not use Middle Channel until further notice.

KEPPEL BAY.

(2) *Fitzroy River Entrance—Additional Leading Lights.*

Also, that on 17th February, 1885, the following additional leading lights would be exhibited at Fitzroy River Entrance, Keppel Bay:—

1. Two fixed white lights on Balaklava Island, placed 1763 yards apart, elevated 30 and 87 feet above the sea respectively, and which kept in line bearing S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. lead just westward of Timandra Bank Buoy.

Approximate position of northern light, latitude $23^{\circ} 33\frac{1}{4}'$ S., longitude $150^{\circ} 57'$ E.

2. Two fixed lights, the northern red, the southern white, on the western shore of Port Alma, southward of Eupatoria Point; these lights, elevated 25 and 54 feet above the sea respectively, and 860 yards apart, kept in line bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. lead through Sea Reach, in not less than 19 feet at low water; and to Port Alma, the line passing close to the position of Elbow Light-Vessel, and cutting the line of the leading lights on Balaklava Island in seven fathoms water.

3. Two fixed lights, the western red, the eastern white, on Cardigan Point, Balaklava Island. These lights, elevated 25 and 52 feet above the sea respectively, and 850 yards apart, lead on a west (southerly) course northward of Elbow Light-Vessel, and into Rocky Point Reach, abreast Flat Island.

The illuminating apparatus of these lights is catoptric, or by lenses.

Directions by Night. — After rounding Timandra Bank Buoy, open the upper light on Balaklava Island slightly westward of the lower light, and keep them so until the obscured sector of the light on Little Sea Hill is passed; then open the upper light slightly eastward of the lower light, and keep them in that position until

the lights on Eupatoria Point are nearly in line, then steer for them, and bring them in line, this course then leads to a position just below the new Government Wharf at Port Alma.

Proceeding up Fitzroy River.—After bringing Eupatoria Point Lights in line, keep them so until the red and white lights on Cardigan Point are coming in line, then alter course and proceed with them in that position until the steep bank of the channel in Rocky Point Reach is neared, when that shore is to be kept aboard, and the channel followed.

NOTE.—Elbow Light-Vessel will shortly be removed; the elbow of the bank will then be marked by a red buoy carrying a cage.

FIJI ISLANDS—VITI LEVU.

(3.) *Suva Harbour—Fixed Light on Queen's Wharf.*

The Government of the Fiji Islands has given notice, that on 7th January, 1885, a light would be exhibited from the inner angle of Queen's Wharf, Suva Harbour:—

The light is a fixed light, showing green over the harbour, and white in shore over the wharf.

DELAWARE BAY.

Five-Fathoms Bank—Temporary Alteration in N.E. Light-Vessel.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 20th May, 1885, Light-Vessel No. 44, moored off north-east end of Five-Fathoms Bank, Delaware Bay, will be withdrawn for repairs, and Relief Light-Vessel No. 24, will be placed at this station.

Light-vessel No. 24 is schooner-rigged, painted red, with the word Relief in large white letters on her sides, and No. 24 on the stern; a hoop cage is carried at each masthead.

(No. 80.)—CEYLON—WEST COAST.

Sunken Rocks between Pantura and Caltura.

THE following information of the existence of certain sunken rocks lying $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 miles off shore between Pantura and Caltura, west coast of Ceylon, has been received from the Naval Commander-in-Chief on the East India Station:—

A rock (Nilkete Rock), with a depth of 2 fathoms, and on which the wreck of the steam vessel "Justitia" was lying, is situated in latitude $6^{\circ} 41' 00''$ N., longitude $79^{\circ} 52' 50''$ E., about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the nearest shore.

A rock, with 4 fathoms over it, lies W.N.W. from Nilkete Rock, distant half a mile. Two small rocks with depths of 3 fathoms, lie S. by W. from Nilkete Rock, at the distance of about 3 cables.

A rock (Kaluwattegala Rock) with a depth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, lies about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles off shore, in latitude $6^{\circ} 38' 00''$ N., longitude $79^{\circ} 53' 15''$ E.

A rock (Veyangula Rock) with $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it, lies W.N.W. from Kaluwattegala Rock, distant about 6 cables.

NOTE.—Vessels navigating in this locality should use caution, and keep outside the 10-fathoms line.

The outer rock off Pantura, shown as one of the Pantura Rocks, is named Gonagala Rock; the rocks in shore of that, are the Pantura Rocks.

(1.) *Flashing Light on Cape Kerempeh.*

THE Turkish Government has given notice, that on 1st May 1885, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected about 100 yards within the extremity of Cape Kerempeh:—

The light is a flashing light, showing red and white flashes alternately every thirty seconds. It is elevated 262 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Dudley, in the county of Worcester, acting by the Council as the Local Authority under Section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870."

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "Car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "Driver" and "Conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all tramcars of any Company authorised by Provisional Order to work tramways in the borough of Dudley.

3. The driver of every car shall drive the

same at a rate of not more than three miles per hour whilst travelling from the corner of St. Edmund's Churchyard, at the junction of Castle-street with the Birmingham-road, to Union-street, and on fair days and Saturdays and during the prevalence of a fog at not more than two miles an hour; and at the rate of not more than four miles per hour along any other tramway constructed in any other part of the borough.

4. The driver of every car shall drive the same so that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards along any portion of the line of tramway.

5. Every driver or conductor shall stop the car when and where required so to do by any passenger desirous of leaving, or by any person desirous of entering the car for whom there is room, or by any police constable for the borough.

6. In bringing any of the cars to a standstill at any of the places being intersections of streets at which a standstill is ordered to be made by the Bye-laws of the Board of Trade, such cars shall not remain there except for taking up and putting down passengers for more than a period of three minutes, unless otherwise ordered by a police constable of the borough, and subject to the provisions of the Bye-laws of the Board of Trade and these Bye-laws, no car shall stop in any of the streets of the borough, except at any termini or turnout.

7. No smoke, steam, or sparks shall be emitted from or noise made by the engines travelling over any line of tramway in the borough so as to contribute danger or inconvenience to public vehicular or foot passenger traffic; so as to constitute any reasonable ground of complaint on the part of the public.

8. Whenever it is necessary to avoid impending danger the engine shall be brought to an immediate standstill; and it shall also be brought to a standstill when requested by any person in charge of a horse or in charge of or driving a vehicle, or who holds up his hand, which shall be deemed sufficient to indicate that such stoppage is required.

9. Every conductor of a tramway car, at any time when the street lamps are lighted, and in the daytime during the prevalence of a fog, shall cause the lamps of such car to be properly lighted

and to be kept lighted until such car shall cease to ply for hire.

10. The traffic upon the tramway shall not be wilfully or neglectfully impeded or obstructed by any person driving any carriage, omnibus, cart, dray or other vehicle of whatsoever description; nor shall any driver or conductor of any car needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

11. The promoters of the Dudley and Stourbridge Steam Tramway Company shall provide and maintain in good order sufficient break power at any time to stop the cars whilst travelling the line of tramway along Queen's Cross Hill."

Penalty.

12. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against or committing a breach of any the above Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. for each offence; and not exceeding, for every continuing offence, 10s. for every day during which the offence continues; but no penalty shall in any way affect the responsibility of any Tramway Company to compensate for injuries.
