**T**HE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Corporation of Higham Ferrers, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized:

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Higham Ferrers have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation:

And whereas the said petition for a charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said district a municipal borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter:

And whereas Higham Ferrers is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter:

And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or Scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or Scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act:

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough and parish of Higham Ferrers are a Local Authority within the meaning

of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses are a body corporate under and by virtue of certain Royal or other Charters:

And whereas previous to the commencement of this Scheme the parish of Higham Ferrers formed part of the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Wellingborough Union, and the said Sanitary Authority is a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority should, so far as the same relate to the parish of Higham Ferrers, be transferred to the new Corporation in the manner hereinafter provided:

And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled, pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Higham Ferrers Scheme, 1885.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the "commencement of this scheme."

3. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough and parish of Higham Ferrers are herein referred to as the "Old Corporation." The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above-mentioned is herein referred to as the "New Corporation."

4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Wellingborough Union.

5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, juris-

diction, authority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

6. All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in the following persons (to be designated "The Trustees of Municipal Charities in the Borough of Higham Ferrers,") viz., John Crew, Surgeon, Edward Brown Randall, Farmer, John William Higgins, Draper, George Shelton, Shoe Manufacturer, and George Wyman, Farmer, all of Higham Ferrers, jointly to be by them applied in the manner in which and for the purposes for which such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

7. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attaching to the Old Corporation in respect of the same shall vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

8. The town well, situate on the east side of the highway known as the High-street, and immediately opposite to and on the north side of the Higham Ferrers Market-place and the town pump constructed by the Old Corporation, and situate on the west side of the said highway and opposite to the said well, which said well and pump were possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attaching to the Old Corporation in respect of the same shall vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

9. All property other than that in paragraphs 6, 7, and 8 hereof referred to, possessed by, or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, shall vest in the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

10. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 9 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

11. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any property, debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation, or against the New Corporation, so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 9 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

12. All sewers, drains, culverts, pipes, or other sanitary works situate within the parish of Higham Ferrers, being the property of the Rural Sanitary of the Wellingborough Union, and used by them

for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said parish, or the sanitary purposes of the said parish, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority in respect of the said parish shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

13. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

14. The term market property in this Scheme means and includes rights to market tolls and all franchises, liberties, privileges, and rights relating to markets and fairs, and all lands and premises used for the purpose of markets or fairs.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Corporation of Lostwithiel, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the town of Lostwithiel have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said town a municipal borough, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter:

"And whereas Lostwithiel is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporation Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorise the establishment or continuance of any Court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any pro-

perty was by law applicable at the passing of that Act:

"And whereas the Mayor and Burgesses of Lostwithiel are a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

"And whereas the said Mayor and Burgesses of Lostwithiel are a body corporate under and by virtue of certain Royal or other charters:

"And whereas previous to the commencement of this scheme the area of the proposed borough formed part of the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bodmin Union and part of the district of the Tywardreath Highway Board and the said Sanitary Authority and Highway Board are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI. of the Municipal Corporations, Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority and the said Highway Board should so far as the same relate to the area of the proposed borough be transferred to the New Corporation in manner hereinafter provided:

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled, pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained:

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:—

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Lostwithiel Scheme, 1885.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The Mayor and Burgesses of Lostwithiel are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.'

"4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid, within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bodmin Union or of the Tywardreath Highway Board.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, jurisdiction, authority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in the Mayor for

the time being of the borough of Lostwithiel, and the Vicar and Churchwardens for the time being of the Church of Saint Bartholomew, in the parish of Lostwithiel, to be by them applied in the manner in which and for the purposes for which such property or the income thereof was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

"7. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attaching to the Old Corporation in respect of the same, shall vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

"8. All property other than that in paragraphs 6 and 7 hereof referred to, possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, shall vest in the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"9. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"10. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation, or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"11. All sewers, drains, cesspools, culverts, wells, pumps, water mains, pipes, or other sanitary works (if any) situate within the area of the proposed borough, and being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bodmin Union, and used by them solely for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said area, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority solely in respect of the said area, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme, vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough, and such liabilities shall be a charge upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough.

"Any property or liabilities belonging or attaching to the said Rural Authority in respect of the said area and the part of the district of the said Rural Sanitary Authority not included in the said area shall be deemed to belong to attach to and be enforceable by or against the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting as aforesaid and the said Rural Sanitary Authority respectively in the proportion which the rateable value of the property of the said area for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, bears at the commencement of this Scheme to the rateable value of the property for the said purposes in the said district not included in the said area.

"12. All implements materials buildings sheds and other things (if any) situate within the area of the proposed borough and being the property of the Tywardreath Highway Board and used by

them solely for the purpose of the repair and maintenance of the highways situate within the said area, shall vest in and all liabilities attaching to the said Highway Board to the extent to which the same relate to the said area shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority and if they relate to the said area as well as to the rest of the said Highway District then they shall so attach and be enforceable in the proportion which the rateable value of the property in the said area for highway purposes bears at the commencement of this Scheme to the rateable value for such purposes of the property in the rest of the said Highway District and the said liabilities shall be a charge upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough.

"13. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"14. The term market property in this Scheme means and includes rights to market tolls and all franchises liberties privileges and rights relating to markets and all lands and premises used for the purposes of markets."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Decree of the King of Portugal, which was published in the Portuguese Official Gazette of the 18th ultimo, in relation to shipping dues in the adjacent islands. The expression "the adjacent islands" is understood to include Madeira and the Azores:—

Law of 2nd May, 1885.

DON LEWIS, by the Grace of God King of Portugal, and of the Algarves, &c.

ART. I. All steamers calling at the adjacent islands, and only taking in coal at any of the natural or artificial harbours therein in order to continue their voyages, as well as any vessels engaged in the whale fisheries and any others calling at the aforementioned ports for supplies or provisions, or else for repairs or for making good any damages, shall be exempted from the

payment of any tonnage, quarantine, or lazaretto dues, as well as from any harbour and dock dues or rates, which are already or may hereafter be imposed.

§ The duty referred to in the 2nd Article of the Law of the 23rd of April, 1880, on coal supplied to any national or foreign vessels calling at the Islands of Madeira and of the Azores shall be returned in full.

ART. 2. The supply of any articles known under the name of provisions for consumption on board, as well as the conveyance or the receiving on board of not more than twelve passengers who may wish to avail themselves of the steamers or of the other vessels mentioned in the foregoing Article, shall not be considered a commercial operation in the sense of entailing the payment of the port dues in force.

ART. 3. Any laws contrary thereto are revoked. We command, &c.

The Minister and Secretary of State for the Finance Department shall cause this Law to be printed, published, and put into circulation.
