

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of All Saints, Curbar, in the county of Derby, and in the diocese of Southwell, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all and singular the yearly tithe commutation rent-charges, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rent-charges for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a certain house and premises, which have been permanently secured to the united benefice of Wharram Percy with Wharram-le-Street, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, as a parsonage house for such united benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said united benefice of Wharram Percy with Wharram-le-

Street, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of twenty-five pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend,
